DISCONTINUANCE.

THE BURIAL GROUNDS (LITTLE WALDINGFIELD) ORDER, 1952.

Made 23rd May, 1952.

At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 23rd day of May, 1952.

PRESENT.

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Minister of Housing and Local Government, after giving 10 days' previous notice of his intention in that behalf, did, under the provisions of the Burial Act, 1853 (16 & 17 Vict. c. 134), as amended by subsequent enactments, make a Representation to Her Majesty in Council that for the protection of the Public Health, the opening of any new burial ground in the Civil Parish of Little Waldingfield, in the County of West Suffolk, save with the previous approval of the Minister of Housing and Local Government, should be prohibited, and that burials should be discontinued therein as hereinafter directed: after directed:

And whereas by an Order in Council of the 10th March, 1952, Notice of such Representation was given, and it was ordered that the same should be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council on the 21st day of April, next, and such Order has been published in the London Gazette, and copies thereof have been affixed, as required by the said Act. said Act.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. No new burial ground shall be opened in the said Civil Parish of Little Waldingfield save with the previous approval of the Minister of Housing and Local Government, and burials shall be discontinued therein as follows, viz: therein as follows, viz.:

Little Waldingfield.—Forthwith and entirely in the Churchyard of the Church of St. Lawrence in the said Parish.

This Order may be cited as the Burial Grounds (Little Waldingfield) Order, 1952.

TRIAL OF THE PYX OF THE LONDON MINT. VERDICT.

We, whose names are hereunder written, having been sworn on the 4th day of March 1952 before the Queen's Remembrancer at Goldsmiths' Hall in the City of London, made the following assays and trials of Her Majesty's coins in the pyx of the Royal Mint in London, which according to accounts produced by the officers of the Mint, were coined in the duced by the officers of the Mint, were coined in the said Mint from the 1st day of January 1951 to the 31st day of December 1951, both dates inclusive, in accordance with the Coinage Acts 1870 to 1946 (hereinafter called "the Acts") and were set aside and placed in the pyx of the said Mint as prescribed by regulations made under the Acts.

1. We ascertained the number of coins in each packet produced to us and that such number corresponded with the number which the officers of the Mint represented the packet to contain.

2.—(a) From one packet of gold coins we took

2.—(a) From one packet of gold coins we took four sovereigns, from another eight sovereigns and from the other two packets, ten sovereigns each, amounting altogether to thirty-two sovereigns.

(b) We weighed separately each of the said sovereigns so taken and we ascertained that it was within the remedy as to weight prescribed by the Acts and we found that such sovereigns were on the whole within the variation from standard weight so whole within the variation from standard weight so prescribed (hereinafter called "standard weight") being one thousandth part of an ounce (+0.001)

above standard weight.

(c) We then melted such sovereigns into an ingot (c) We then melted such sovereigns into an ingot and assayed such ingot comparing it with the standard trial plate of gold produced by the Board of Trade, and we found that such ingot (having a millesimal fineness of 916.57) was within the variation allowed under the Acts, the amount of variation from standard fineness being minus nine hundred thousandth parts (-0.00009).

(d) We weighed in bulk the residue of the coins remaining in the packets of gold coins and we ascertained that they were on the whole within the variation from standard weight allowed under the Acts, being nine thousandth parts of an ounce (+0.009) above standard weight.

(e) We then took from such residue four sovereigns and weighed and assayed them separately and we found that such sovereigns weighed respectively the first 123.360 grains, the second 123.382 grains, the

third 123.394 grains and the fourth 123.232 grains, and that therefore the said sovereigns were respecand that therefore the said sovereigns were respectively, the first eighty six thousandth parts of a grain (+0.086), the second one hundred and eight thousandth parts of a grain (+0.108), the third one hundred and twenty thousandth parts of a grain (+0.120) above standard weight and the fourth forty two thousandth parts of a grain (-0.042) below standard weight

weight.

(f) We then assayed separately the last mentioned sovereigns and we found the millesimal fineness of such sovereigns to be, the first 916.53, the second 916.46, the third 916.66 and the fourth 916.63, and that therefore the first of such sovereigns was thirteen hundred-thousandth parts (-0.00013) below standard fineness the second was twenty hundred-thousandth parts (-0.00020) below standard fineness, the third did not vary from standard fineness and the fourth was three hundred-thousandth parts (-0.00003) below standard fineness.

3.—(a) We found that the Silver coins in the said pyx weighed in all not more than twelve ounces troy.

(b) We weighed in bulk such silver coins and we ascertained that they were on the whole within the variation from standard weight, there being no variation from standard weight.

variation from standard weight.

(c) We then assayed such silver coins comparing them with the silver trial plate produced by the Board of Trade, and we found that they were on the whole within the variation allowed under the Acts, the amount of variation from standard fineness being plus two ten-thousandth parts (+0.0002).

4.—(a) We found that the cupro-nickel coins in the said pyx weighed in all more than twelve ounces troy and we took one or more coins from each packet of cupro-nickel coins.

(b) We weighed each twelve ounces troy (at stan-(b) We weighed each twelve ounces troy (at standard weight) of cupro-nickel coins so taken out and ascertained that the amount of its variation from standard weight was the amount recorded in respect thereof in the schedule hereto, and that each twelve ounces troy was therefore within the variation from standard weight allowed under the Acts.

(c) We then assayed separately cupro-nickel coins weighing in all twelve ounces troy (at standard weight) comparing them with the copper trial plate and the nickel trial plate produced by the Board of Trade, and we found that the coins assayed were on the whole within the variation from composition

on the whole within the variation from composition allowed under the Acts, the amounts of variation being minus one fifth of one per centum (-0.2%) of copper and minus one fifth of one per centum (-0.2%) of nickel.

(d) We weighed in bulk the residue of the coins remaining in the packets of cupro-nickel coins and we ascertained that they were on the whole within the variation from standard weight being six hun-

the variation from standard weight, being six hundred and seventy three thousandth parts of an ounce (+0.673) above standard weight.

SCHEDULE.

An Area of approximately 136 square miles in the County of Lancaster.

Northern Boundary.

Northern Boundary.

From the coast about a mile north of Great Crosby past Hall Road Station at Little Crosby, the boundary follows the south side of B.5194 through Netherton, Aintree and Knowsley to the junction of A.580 and thence to the Royal Oak Inn. Turning right it follows the western edge of B.5203 and thence along the southern side of Chapel Lane, Eccleston and Hard Lane across A.580, following the main road through Billinge and Windy Arbour to the cross roads north of the railway in Far Moor. Thence following the main road through Orrell Post to the railway bridge over the road at Gathurst, the boundary runs along the railway in an easterly direction through Wigan to the junction of the Bolton Warrington line at a point north northwest of Atherton.

Eastern Boundary.

From the above junction the boundary runs along the west side of the Bolton Warrington Railway, past Kenyon Junction sidings and across the Liverpool-Manchester line at Dolly's Bridge. Thence it follows the western side of the road through Winwick to the bridge under the former Cheshire Lines Railway on the northern outskirts of Warrington.

Southern Boundary.

Continuing along the northern side of the Cheshire Lines Railway, the boundary passes Great Sankey, Widnes and Hough Green at Halewood Station, and the bridge over the road at a point east of Halewood East Junction.

Western Boundary.

The western boundary follows the eastern side of the former Cheshire Lines Railway to the junction of the Liverpool-Manchester Lines east of Broad Green Station and thence to the Queen Street Bridge Green Station and thence to the Queen Street Bridge over the railway. It continues along the eastern side of the Prescot Road to the bridge over the Edgehill and Bootle Branch Railway, and thence along the railway to the tunnel under County Road, Walton, and by way of Stuart Road, Breeze Hill and Merton Road to the junction of the Liverpool, Crosby and Southport Railway. Thence the boundary follows the eastern edge of the railway as far as the junction with the Fazakerley and North Mersey branch line and along this line through Seaforth Sands Station and the overhead railway to a foot-path, and thence along the northern side of Gladstone Dock. Here it meets the high water mark of ordinary tides and meets the high water mark of ordinary tides and

follows this past Waterloo and Brighton-le-Sands to the beginning of the northern line.

An Area of approximately 173 square miles in the County of Lancaster.

Northern Boundary.

From the Post Office in Longton the boundary follows the southern side of the road through Hutton, Penwortham, Preston, Ribbleton and Grimsargh to the point where the road crosses the railway on the outskirts of Longridge. It continues northward along the road via New Lane, Old Clay Lane and Elm Brow to Arbour Lane End, thence eastward through Walkerfold to the Higher Hodder Bridge.

Eastern Boundary.

Following the west bank of the Hodder to Lower Hodder Bridge, the boundary goes west and south-west along the road to Hurst Green as far as the brook near Dilworth House, thence southward along the brook to the north bank of the river Ribble at the corner of Raid Deep Wood. It continues westthe corner of Raid Deep Wood. It continues westward along the north bank of the Ribble to Ribchester Bridge and crosses the river following the road to the junction of the Ribchester Road in Clayton-le-Dale, thence via Shavely Lane to the junction of the lane immediately south of Saccary and south-westward past Primrose Hill, crossing Mellor Lane and following Whinney Lane to the junction of Yew Tree Drive, Blackburn. Thence south-east via the Preston Road to Billinge End. It continues via Buncer Lane and Preston Old Road to the Fielden Arms. Pleasington and southwards through Buncer Lane and Preston Old Road to the Fielden Arms, Pleasington and southwards through Feniscowles to the railway at Feniscowles Station, thence southward along the railway to Withnell Station and south-east along the Bolton Road it passes through Belmont to Horrocks Scout, and along the road to Horwich Station. Thence along the railway through Hilton House Station to Dobb Brow junction and continuing in a westerly direction via Crow Nest Junction, Hindley Junction, Ince and Wigan to the railway bridge over the road at Gathurst. Gathurst.

Western Boundary.

From Gathurst the boundary goes northward along the road through Shevington, Shevington Vale, Heskin Green, Eccleston, Newtown and Bratherton to Carr-House Bridge. Thence via the old main road to the Rose & Crown and the new road, to the junction of Brook Lane, Marsh House Lane and the Liverpool Road to the Post Office at Longton.

An Area of approximately 116 square miles in the County of Lancaster.

Northern Boundary.

From Feniscowles Station the boundary follows the road in an easterly direction past Horden Rake, the Black Bull Inn and on through Earcroft, Lower Darwen to the junction of Blackamoor Road and Haslingden Road at the King Edward VII Public House, thence it runs south-eastward through Rann and Belthorn and eastward to Daisy Green. Turning due north the boundary follows the eastern edge of Red Shell Lane to the cross roads north-east of Moss Hall, and thence south and east by Cocker Brook and Height Plantation to the cross roads south of Sandybeds. Following a north-westerly course the boundary continues along the road to Cross Edge and thence via Rothwell Heights, round the eastern outskirts of Accrington through Lane Ends and Bentley Wood Green to the junction of Rose Grove Lane, Burnley.

Eastern Boundary.

The boundary runs along the western edge of Rossendale Road and Rossendale Avenue, Burnley on to Deerplay Old Toll Bar. Thence it follows the Bacup Road through Broad Clough and Bacup and thence along the western side of A.671 to the point where the road meets the Facit branch railway, point where the road meets the Facit branch railway, thence southward along the railway to the foot-path leading to Broadley Station. Continuing eastward along the foot-path and lane through Knacks Lane to the junction of Rooley Moor Road at Cattley Lane End, it runs southward along the road through Stone Hill Lane and Shawfield Lane to the junction of A.627 at the War Memorial, Norden.

Southern Boundary.

From the War Memorial, Norden, the boundary skirts the south-east fringe of Norden and continues along the foot-path leading to Coal Bank, Lower

Bridge and thence follows the western bank of the Naden Brook to Simpson Clough Bridge on the Bury old road. Continuing westward the boundary passes through Jericho, Fern Grove and on through Bury via Bell Lane and Walmsley Road to the junction of Rowlands Road at the Bury and District Water Board Pumping Station. Thence it runs along Rowlands Road over the railway to Sumerseat Station and on via Railway Street, Holcombe Brook Road and Sumerseat Lane to the junction of Park Road

and the Bolton Road. It continues westward along the Bolton Road through Bradshaw and Toppings to the junction of Belmont Road at Moor Edge.

Western Boundary.

From Moor Edge the boundary passes Horrocks Scout and along the eastern edge of the Bolton Road through Belmont and Abbey Village to Withnell Station. Thence it runs northward along the railway to Feniscowles Station.

EXPLANATORY NOTE.

These regulations will amend the National Insurance (Seasonal Workers) Regulations, 1950, so as to give effect to the recommendations of the National Insurance Advisory Committee on their Review of the Seasonal Workers Regulations 1950 (published today).

The existing regulations impose additional conditions for the receipt of unemployment benefit by a seasonal worker in his off-season. The draft regulations modify the definitions of "seasonal worker" and "off-season" in the existing regulations so that they should apply not only to periods comparable to one of the annual seasons (spring, summer, and winter) but to shorter periods when the autumn and winter), but to shorter periods when the seasonal worker is normally not employed. The special conditions do not, however, have to be satisfied—

(i) by any person if the period or periods when he is normally not employed amount to not more than seven weeks in the year; (ii) during any individual period of less than

seven days.

The draft regulations also provide that a person shall not be treated as a seasonal worker because he snail not be treated as a seasonal worker because he is normally employed in an occupation in which the availability and extent of employment varies in the year, unless that variation results from factors inherent in the industry. Abnormal variations, such as those resulting from a recession of trade, are to be disregarded even if prolonged.
