Fifty-six Minute Guns were fired while the Procession moved from Westminster Hall to Paddington Station.

On arrival at Paddington Station the Coffin was taken from the Gun Carriage by the Bearer Party of the King's Company of the Grenadier Guards and placed in the Royal Train, which conveyed The Queen and the other Royal Personages to Windsor.

On arrival at Windsor the Royal Coffin, covered by the Royal Standard, and with the Crown, Sceptre and Orb laid thereon, and preceded by the Earl Marshal, was removed from the train by the Bearer Party of the King's Company, Grenadier Guards, and placed upon a Gun Carriage drawn by Naval Ratings.

Guards of Honour from the Royal Navy, Brigade of Guards and Royal Air Force were mounted at the Railway Station and at St. George's Chapel.
