TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT, 1947.

DISEASES OF ANIMALS ACT, 1950.

Notice is hereby given in pursuance of Section 85 (3) of the Diseases of Animals Act, 1950, that the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries has made the following Orders:—

Statutory Instruments 1952 No. 1146.

The Foot-and-Mouth-Disease (Infected Areas) Special Order No. 100, 1952.

(Made 10th June, 1952.)

1. Contracts slightly, as from 12th June, 1952, the Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area around Harbridge, Ringwood, Hampshire, declared by Special Order No. 58, 1952, and amended by Special Orders Nos. 60, 76, 82 and 85, 1952.

2. Contains provisions relating to the confinement of animals in the New Forest.

3. Extends, as from 13th June, 1952, the Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area around Kingsnorth, Ashford, Kent, declared by Special Order No. 99, 1952, so as to include an area comprising the district situate within approximately 10 miles of Upper Ruckinge, Ashford, Kent.

Statutory Instruments 1952 No. 1149.

The Foot-and-Mouth-Disease (Infected Areas) Special Order No. 101, 1952.

(Made 11th June, 1952.)

1. Declares an area comprising the districts situate within approximately 15 miles of Taddington, Buxton, Derbyshire, to be an Infected Area for the purpose of preventing the spreading of foot-and-mouth disease, to which Area the provisions of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restrictions) Order of 1938 are applied. The area subject to restrictions lies in the counties of Chester, Derby and West Riding of Yorkshire.

2. Revokes Article 8 of Special Order No. 99, 1952.

Statutory Instruments 1952 No. 1158.

The Foot-and-Mouth-Disease (Infected Areas) Special Order No. 102, 1952.

(Made 12th June, 1952.)

Declares an area comprising the districts situate within approximately 15 miles of Slades Green, Erith, Kent, to be an Infected Area for the purpose of preventing the spreading of foot-and-mouth disease, to which area the provisions of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restrictions) Order of 1938 are applied. The area subject to restrictions lies in the counties of Essex, Kent, London, Middlesex and Surrey.

Statutory Instruments 1952 No. 1163.

The Foot-and-Mouth-Disease (Infected Areas) Special Order No. 103, 1952.

(Made 13th June, 1952.)

1. Declares an area comprising the districts situate within approximately 15 miles of Compton, Newbury, Berkshire, to be an Infected Area for the purpose of preventing the spreading of foot-and-mouth disease, to which Area the provisions of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restrictions) Order of 1938 are applied. The area subject to restrictions lies in the counties of Berkshire, Buckingham, Hampshire and Oxford.

2. Extends the Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area around Holywood, Dumfriesshire, declared by Special Order No. 95, 1952, and extended by Special Order No. 96, 1952, so as to include an area comprising the districts situate within approximately 10 miles of Ecclefechan.

Statutory Instruments 1952 No. 1164.

The Foot-and-Mouth-Disease (Infected Areas) Special Order No. 104, 1952.

(Made 14th June, 1952.)

Extends the Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area around Hellingly, Hailsham, Sussex, declared by Special Order No. 86, 1952, so as to include an area comprising the districts situate within approximately 5 miles of Brighton.
