Leghorne, October 1. N. S.

Moreau, the King of Folina's Envoy at this Court, died suddenly of an Apoplexy, which scized him as he was writing his Letters. Monsieur Schiae, the Polish Relident here, upon notice thereof, went to the said Envoy's House to secure the publick Papers, but found he had been prevented by Monsieur Riesen's Secretary, and Monsieur Summs, one of the Councellors of the Chamber; wherenpon he fell into Expositulations with them, and a Quarrel ensuing, he received a mertal Wound in his Belly, (from whom, is not yet known) of which he died the 11th. Two such sudden Accidents gave occasion to the calling of an extraordinary Council that atternoon, and the King has appointed Commissioners to enquire into the Circumstances of Monsieur Schade's Death. A Proclamation was published here the 6th Instant by sound of Trumpet, whereby all Housekeepers in this City, and the Suburbs adjoining, are required to furnish themselves with Provisions for a year and a day, to give an Account of all Strangers, particularly those of the French Nation, who are lodged and entertained in their Houses, and not to harbour any Vagabonds or idle Perfors. known. Their Horses were distributed among the French Cavalry. On the 30th the Count de Solary arrived in the Imperial Camp with 5 Battalions from the Trentine, which were posted at Suist lo, on the River Secchia. The Marquis de Barbestures, a Lieutenant-General in the French Service, who was taken some time ago as he was endeavouring to pass in Disguise by the way of Switzerland into Bavaria, and has ever fince remained Prisoner at Gratz in Styria, is removed nearer to the Imperial Army in Italy, where he is to be exchanged, as is supposed, for the Count de Wallenstein, late Amballador from the Emperor at the Court of Portugal, who was raken this Summer on board a Dutch Man of War, as he was paiding from thence to Holland, in order to his return home. Herbeville made himself Master on the 3d Instant of the Town of Cham, the Garison whereof, which consisted of 500 Men, was obliged to give themselves up as Prisoners of War, and the Inhabitants compounded with him for 18000 Florins, to fave themselves from being plundered; so that Amberg is now the only Place possessed by the Bavarians in the Upper Palatinate. The Regiment of Dragoons of Schlick, and a Regiment of Cuiraffiers, which were at Passau, were to be put into several Boats at Lintz on the 7th, and are expected here to morrow, in their way to Hungary, where the Disturbances do still continue. The Town of Seben, in the County of Cepusia, towards the Confines of Poland, has submirred to the Rebels; But a Parry of them that was come into the Neighbourhood of Esperies, with a Design to for Fire to the Suburbs, was surprised by Colonel Wilfon, Governor of that Place, who killed 100 of them on the spot. Francfort, October 18. The French Army continues near Landau, ravaging the neighbouring Country in a most barbarous manner, and give Saseguards only against Fire and Murther. It is not believed at present that they will endeavour to send a Detachment to join the Marshal de Villars, who designs to Winter in Smahia and Wirtemberg. The Elector of Menta has sent Ammunition and other Warlike Stores to Laminu, and the Grede of Smahia to Philipsburg. The Enemy has forced the Lines of Neustat near Landau, and has routed the Palatine Regiment of Vensen which was posted there. Prince Lewis continues in his Camp near Augsburg. The French Army commanded by the Marshal as Villars was encamped the 14th Instant at Rissifen, a Convent on this side the Eler, and ituate on a little River called the Ris: They have left but a small Garison in Ulm, the greatest part of the Forces there having rejoined their Army, and they are ruining the Country about that City, as those under the Marshal de Tallard do the Palatinate.
