**T**HE Swedish Forces have made themselves Masters of the Town of *Thorn*, which surrendered at Discretion the 14th Instant. What they will attempt further is not yet known. A Body of their Troops under the Command of General *Reinchild*, is advanced into the Archbishopsrick of *Gnesna*. The Army of the Crown of *Poland* lies in the *Greater Poland*, and the *Lithuanian* Forces are returned into that Dutchy, in order to secure it against the Incurfions of the *Swedes*. The King of *Poland's* *Saxon* Troops are posted about *Lowic*.

*Vienna*, Octob. 13. The Regiment of Dragoons of *Schlick*, and the Cuirassiers of *La Tour*, passed by this Place two days ago, in their way to *Hungary*, where they are to be joined by the Regiment of Foot of *Viscanti*, which is marching thither from the *Lower Austria*. We hear the *Ruscians* have lately defeated two Detachments of the Rebels, one near an Island of the *Danube*, called *St. Andrew*, and the other near *Keskemet*. A *Turkish* Chiaus is arrived at *Belgrade*, where he waits for a Pass to come hither, being sent (as is supposed) to notify to the Emperor the Accession of the new Grand Signor *Achmet* to that Dignity.

*Heilbronn*, October 20. Prince *Lewis* of *Baden*, having left a Garison of 4000 Foot and 2000 Horse in the Town of *Augsbourg*, decamped from thence the 18th Instant, and marched towards the *Danube*; and we hear he is advanced to *Norniof*. The Count de *Seitrum* decamped the same day with the Imperial Forces under his Command from *Kirckheim*, and marched by the way of *Rollen* towards *Heydenheim*, intending (as is said) to continue his March to the *Danube*, and to pass that River, and rejoin Prince *Lewis*. The *Marshall de Villars*, with the *French* Forces under his Command, is come into the Neighbourhood of *Ulm*, and the Elector of *Bavaria* with his Troops marched towards *Ingolstadt*, with intent, as is supposed, to endeavour to make an Irruption into *Francia*. We hear the *Saxon* Forces commanded by General *Schuylenberg*, which are marching to join Prince *Lewis*, have intercepted a *French* Convoy of a considerable Sum of Money, and Clothes for 15000 Men, which came by the way of *Schaffhausen*, and was designed for their Army.

*Hamburg*, October 23. Letters from *Graudenz* and *Dantzick*, as well as from the King of *Sweden's* Camp before *Thorn*, say, that Place was surrendered on the 14th Instant, and the Garison remained Prisoners of War, which, from 5000 Men, whereof it consisted at the beginning of the Siege, is reduced to 1500 Men able to bear Arms, though at present unfit for Service; Many of the Inhabitants have also perished during the Siege. Some Advices add, that by Agreement, as is supposed, between the Kings of *Sweden* and *Prussia*, this Town and *Elbing* are to be delivered up to the King of *Prussia*. His *Prussian* Majesty's Journey into that Country is (according to the Advices from *Berlin*) fully resolved, and the time of his departure will be shortly fixed.

*Liege*, October 23. On the 17th Instant there was a second Exchange of Prisoners at *Boisblain* between the Confederates and the *French*. The Forces of the Allies under the Command of the Prince of *Hesse* are encamped at *Veroyers*, whither 4 Regiments of Foot are marching from *Mastricht*, and one from *Pises*: His Highness expects also a Reinforcement from the Camp at *Aldebeesten*; and it is said, that when he has been joined by all these Troops, he is to march towards the *Moselle*, and endeavour to retake *Trerbach*. The Garison of *Huy* has been reinforced, and consists at present of 4 Regiments of Foot.

*Hague*, October 26. N. S. The King of *Spain* is expected here in a day or two: His Majesty intends to come in the night, for the better avoiding of all Ceremony, and will go directly to the Old Court, the Palace fitted up for his Reception. The Land Forces which are to attend his Catholic Majesty in his Expedition have Orders to march towards the Places where they are to embark. The States General, for their Encouragement, have ordered that there be given by way of a Gratuity 150 Guilders to every Captain, and proportionable to other Officers, and 10 Guilders to every Soldier. The Duke of *Marlborough's* Bagage arrived in this Town this evening. His Grace having given the necessary Directions for the Army's being separated on the 31st Instant, in order to march into Winter Quarters, intended to leave the Command of the *English* Troops to Lieutenant General *Churchill*, and to be here by to-morrow night or the next morning. The *French* (according to our last Accounts from the *Upper Rhine*) do still seem equally to threaten *Landau* or *Philipsbourg* with a Siege, but what is their true Design is hitherto very uncertain. The Advices from the North, which came in last night, say, the Town of *Thorn* surrendered to the *Swedes* at Discretion the 14th of the last Month. We have not yet any thing further from *Savoy*; only some Letters say, that Duke had caused the Prince of *Vaudemont*, Governor of *Milan*, and the Prince's Wife, to be seized at the Baths of *St. Maurice*, within his Royal Highness's Dominions.

*Falmouth*, October 14. Yesterday two Dutch Privateers brought in here as Prize, the *St. Joseph* of *Marseilles*. She had 22 Guns mounted, and was laden with Bale Goods from *Roche*. At the same time was sent in here by the *St. Vincent* Privateer, another Dutch Privateer, the *St. Luke*, Brigantine of *St. Malo*, bound from thence with Bale Goods to *St. Domingo*: Both these Prizes were *English* Ships taken from us during the last War. This day came in the *London*, of *London*, *Thomas Smith* Master, bound home from *Monserrat*; the *America* of *Plimouth*; *Thomas Jostling* Master, from *Virginia*, and the *Four Sisters* of *Flushing*, to lade Fish for the *Sveights*: They came from *Sally* under Convoy of the *Sidney* Frigate.

*Plimouth*, October 17. Her Majesty's Ship the *Chichester*, Captain *Hartnoll* Commander, arrived here yesterday from *Jamaica* but left from *Newfoundland*: She came out in Company of 40 Sail of Men of War, Transport Ships &c. under the Command of Vice-Admiral *Gaydon*, and parted from
