Dantzick, Offober 16. N.S.

HE Swedish Forces have made themfelves Masters of the Town of Theorn, which furrendred at Discretion the 14th Instant. What they will attempt further is not yet known. A Body of their Troops under the Command of General Reinchild, is advanced into the Atchbilhoprick of Gnefna. The Army of the Crown of Pland, lies in the Greater Poland, and the Lichuanian Forces are returned into that Dutchy, in order to fecure it against the Incursions of the Sweder. The King of Pothe Incursions of the Swedes. land's Saxon Troops are posted about Lowic.

Vienna, Ottob. 13. The Regiment of Dragoons of Schlick, and the Cuiraffiers of La Tour, passed by this Place two days ago, in their way to Hungary, where they are to be joined by the Regiment of Foot of Viscouti, which is marching thither from the Lower Austria. We hear the Rescious have lately defeated two Detachments of the Rebels, one near an Island of the Danube, called St. Andrew, and the other near Keskemet. kijh Chiaus is arrived at Belgrade, where he waits for a Pass to come hither, being fent (as is sup-

posed) to notify to the Emperor the Accession of the new Grand Signor Actionet to that Dignity.

Heilbron, October 20. Prince Lewis of Baden, having left a Garison of 4000 Foot and 2000 Horse in the Town of Aug: bourg, decamped from thence the 18th Inflant and marched towards the Day. the 18th Instant, and marched towards the Danube; and we hear he is advanced to Norndorf. The Count de Szirum decamped the fame day with the Imperial Forces under his Command from Kirckheym, and marched by the way of Relen towards Heydenbeim, intending (as is faid) to continue his March to the Danube, and to pass that River, and rejoin Prince Limis. The Marthat de Villari, with the French Forces under his Command, is come into the Neighbourhood of Uim, and the Elector of Bavaria with his Troops marched towards Ingoistad, with intent, as is supposed, to endeavour to make an Irruption into We hear the Saxin Forces commanded by General Schuylemberg, which are marching to join Prince Lewis, have intercepted a French Convoy of a confiderable Sum of Money, and Clothes for 15000 Men, which came by the way of Schaffousen, and was deligned for their Army

Hamburgh, Offober 23. Letters from Graudentz and Danizick, as well as from the King of Sweden's Camp before Thorn, fay, that Place was furrendred on the 14th Instant, and the Garison remained Prisoners of War, which, from 5000 Men, whereof it consisted at the begining of the Siege, is reduced to 1500 Men able to bear Arms, though at present unfit for Service; Many of the Inhabi-tants have also perished during the Siege. Some Advices add, that by Agrement, as is supposed, beween the Kings of sweden and Prussian, this Town and Elbing are to be delivered up to the King of Prussa. His Prussav Majesty's Journey into that Country is (according to the Advices from Berlin) fully resolved, and the time of his departure

will be shortly fixed.

Liege, Officer 23. On the 17th Instant there was a second Exchange of Prisoners at Borelslaves between the Contederates and the French. The Forces of the Allies under the Command of the Prince of Hesse are encamped at Verviers, whither 4 Regiments of Foor are marching from Mastricht, and one from Vise: His Highness expects also a Reinsurcement from the Camp at Alderbeesters; and it is stid, that when he has been joined by all these Proops, he is to march towards the Moselle, and endeavour to retake Trierbach. The Garison of Huy has been reinforced, and consists at present of 4 Regiments of Foor. of Foot.

Hague, Officher 26. N. S. The King of Spain is expected here in a day or two: His Majelty intends to come in the night, for the better avoiding of all Ceremony, and will go directly to the Old Court, the Palace fixted up for his Reception. The Land Forces which are to attend his Catholick Majesty in his Expedition have Orders to march towards the Places where they are to embark. The States General, for their Encouragement, have ordered that there be given by way of a Gratuity 150 Guelders to every Captain, and proportionable to other Officers, and 10 Guilders to every Soldler. The Duke of Marlborough's Bagage arrived in this Town this evening. His Grace having given the necessary Directions for the Army's being separated on the 31st Instant, in order to grarch into Winter Quarters, intended to leave the Command of the English Troops to Lieurenant General Charekill, and to be here by to morrow night or the next morning. The French (according to our laft Accounts from the Upper Rhine) do fill feem equally to threaren Landau or Philipsboorg with a Siege, but what is their time Delign is hitherto very uncertain. The Advices from the North, which came in last night, say, the Town of Theorn sur-rendred to the Swides at Discretion the 14th of the last Month. We have not yet any thing further from savoy; only some Letters say, that Duke had caused the Prince of Vandimont, Governor of Milan, and the Princes his Wife, to be seized at the Baths of St. Maurice, within his Royal Highness's Dominions.

Falmouth, October 14. Yesterday two Dutch Privateers brought in here as Prize, the Sr. Joseph of Marfeilles: She had 22 Guns mounted and was laden with Bale Goods from Roobel. At the fame time was fent in here by the Seven Provinces, another Duck Privarees, the St. Luke Brigantine of St. Malo, bound from to need with Bale Goods to St. Osemingo: Both these Prizes were English Ships tax ken from us during the last War.
