WELLINGTON (SALOP) RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL.

The Wellington (Salop) Rural District Council (Ketley Dingle) Diversion Order, 1952.

NOTICE is hereby given that the above Order was made on the 26th day of June 1952 and is about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation.

The Order relates to land situate at Ketley in the Parish of Wellington Rural in the Rural District of Wellington in the County of Salop.

(1) The effect of the Order will be to extinguish an existing public right of way south of the bridge under the railway on the east side of the Sinclair Iron Company's Works at Ketley for a distance of approximately 420 feet and continuing along the public footpath on the south side of the said Works to the junction of an existing path from Ketley Brook to Ketley Dingle and

(2) To create a new public right of way constructed to the satisfaction of the Highway Authority on foot and on horseback over the land immediately south of the said bridge under the railway on the east side of the said works running parallel with the existing road for a distance of approximately 420 feet with a minimum width of four feet and continuing in a southerly direction along an existing cart road footpath in a westerly direction across a footbridge to be constructed with handrails over the existing ditch and to connect with the Ketley Dingle footpath.
