The laid Marquis Curetto has lately by his Letters en-Eleavoured to affure His Imperial Majesty, that he had no intentions to alienate his Bitate, or to quit his dependency on the Empire, but enely by putting himself under the French protection to fecure himself against any defignes

which his neighbours might have upon him.

Letters from Candia bearing date the 2d. of Aug. tell us,
That the French Fleet lying near the Town, the Therefs,
which was the Ship on which the Duke de Navailles Embank'd hidless for that Kingdom, by some unhappy Accident, or a Shot from the Town, took fire in the Powder-Room, which immediately blewup, with about 300 Men, and amongst them 37 Officers, and a great quantity of the

Dukes Place and Baggage to confiderable value: That 9 other Ships, and the Admiral Galley, were much endam-maged by this Accident; and the Count de Vivonne Capkain of the Galleys, and Monfieur Colbert somewhat hurt : they farther lay, That the Turks proceed vigorously in the fire approaches on the fide of the sabionera, endeavouring to gain upon the Arfenal, and if possible to shut up the Harbour. That the Venetians had some the ghts of a Treaty, but altered them upon the News that His Most Christian Majesty was lending a fresh Succor to their Assistance, under the Command of the Mareshal de Bellefonds.

Since this Dilaster of the Thereje, the Fleet is removed to Standia, where the Duke de Navailles continues much
