1. Contracts, as from 18th July, 1952, the Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area around Wybunbury, Nantwich, Cheshire, declared by Special Order No. 114, 1952, to an area comprising the districts situate within approximately 5 miles of Wybunbury.
2. Releases such contracted Infected Area from restrictions on 25th July, 1952.

Statutory Instruments 1952 No. 1333.

*The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Controlled Area)
Special Order No. 17, 1952.
(Made 15th July, 1952.)*

1. Declares, as from 18th July, 1952, an area comprising the counties of Bedford, Berks, Buckingham, Dorset, Gloucester, Hampshire, Hertford, Kent, London, Middlesex, Isle of Wight, Oxford, Somerset, Surrey, East and West Sussex and Wilts to be a Controlled Area for the purpose of preventing the spreading of foot-and-mouth disease, to which Area the provisions of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Controlled Areas Restrictions) General Order of 1938 are applied.

2. Provides that licences authorising the movement of pigs from any premises (other than premises situate within a Foot-and-Mouth Disease Controlled or Infected Area) direct to a slaughterhouse or bacon factory situate within this Controlled Area may be granted by an Inspector for the Local Authority of the district in which the movement commences, and shall not require counter-signature by any other Inspector. The form of licence is set forth in the Second Schedule to this Order.
