Rome, Octob. 13. N. S.

**T**HE Pope does frequently hold Congregations of State and War, to consult upon the Measures he is to take in the present Juncture, to provide for the Security of his Frontiers, and of his Seaport-Towns. The Differences between the Emperor and this Court were debated in one of these Meetings, and it was proposed to recall Signior *Davia*, the Pope's Nuncio at Vienna, who has been forbid that Court, for not being present at declaring the Archduke *Charles of Austria* King of Spain; but the majority was against it. The Pope has appointed the Count *de Pauluzzi* to have the chief Command of his Forces in the *Ferrareze*, and the Marquis of *Bonaventura* to be Governor of *Ferrara*, who are accordingly gone to their respective Commands, with very express Orders to see that the Magazines be well provided, and the Fortifications kept in good Repair, in all Places under their Care; and like Directions are sent to the Governors along the Sea Coasts. Since the seizing of the Count *de Carandini*, the Marquis *de Buffalini*, and several other Persons, have been put into the Inquisition, being accused of entertaining certain Opinions, different from the Doctrines which are taught by the Church of Rome, Letters from *Naples* say, the Viceroy there had ordered the Militia of that Kingdom to take Arms, who, as well as the regular Troops, were distributed into such Posts as are most convenient, as well for securing their Coasts, as for preventing any Insurrection in Favour of King *Charles* the Third, to which the People are very much inclined.

*Venice*, October 20. The *Ormond* Galley, and the *Tiger*, two Merchant Ships which came from England, under Convoy of the Confederate Fleet commanded by Sir *Claudestry Shovel*, arrived here the last week. One of our Merchant Ships came in this week from *Constantinople*, from whence she sailed the 6th of the last Month, and reports, that the new Grand Signior and his Court were daily expected there from *Adriampole*; and Signior *Soranzo*, Ambassador Extraordinary from this Republick to the Porte, waited for their Arrival, intending, as soon as he had paid the usual Compliments to the new Grand Visier, to return home on board the *Man of War* which carried thither Signior *Justiniani*, who is sent to supply his place, with the Character of *Bayle*, or Ambassador in Ordinary. The rainy Weather, and the Overflowing of the *Stechia*, detain the Imperial Forces under General *Staremberg* in their Camp, who are in a readiness to march, in order to make a Diversion in favour of the Duke of *Savoy*, who on his side is raising all the Forces he is able, and has (as is said) already got together a considerable Body of Troops near *Verceil*, to oppose the Duke of *Vendosme*. The French have a good Body of Troops between *Montambano* and *Cassiglione delle Stivere*, in which last Place they have made a great Magazine of Provisions for their Subsistence. Letters from *Rome* say, that the Imperial Ambassador had

caused the King of Spain's Picture to be set up in the Church *dell' Anima*, which belongs more particularly to those of the German Nation; but the Pope disapproving of it, the Ambassador had it brought back to his own House, where great Crowds of People, and particularly of Spaniards and Neapolitans, flock daily to see it. His Excellency, upon Advice of the Confederate Fleet's being arrived at *Leghorn*, went Post thither the 4th Instant, in order to confer with Sir *Claudestry Shovel*.

*Warsaw*, Octob. 21. The King of Poland has appointed the Senate to meet at *Zamosk* on the 16th of the next Month, and has left this Place in order to repair thither. His Majesty intends to take his way by *Uadrow*, and to continue there a few days. It is said he has resolved to send Ambassadors to the King of Denmark and Prussia, and the Czar of Muscovy, to desire their Assistance against the Swedes. The Cardinal Primate is gone to his Country House at *Lowitz*.

*Cologne*, November 2. Two Regiments of Horse and 3 Battalions of Foot, of the King of Prussia's Forces, have Winter Quarters assigned them within this Archbishopsrick, and their head Quarter is to be at *Nuis*. The Elector Palatine has undertaken to provide the Towns of *Münsterfeldt* and *Enkirchen* with sufficient Garrison. Letters from the Upper Rhine say, the Garrison of *Laudau* makes to resolve a Defence, that the French have already lost more Men before that Place than they did in the whole Siege of *Brisac*; and that the Waters of the River *Quirch* are overflowed in such manner, that in some of their Trenches they are up to the Knees in Water.

*Falmouth*, Octob. 30. The *Golden Lyon*, the *Salamander*, and the *Land of Promise*, three Privateers of *Flushing*, brought in here on the 28th Instant the *Happy*, a Privateer belonging to *St. Malo*, of 12 Guns and 80 Men, whom they took the 26th off *Ushant*. They had some days before retaken from the French the *Prinsepe* of *Bristol*, bound to *Carolina*. This day sailed from hence the Expedition *Pacquet-Boat*, with one Mail for *Lisbon*; the *Setty* Galley and the *Severn* Galley, laden with *Fish* for *Leghorn*, and the *Maria Theresa* of *Flushing*, bound to the *Maderas*.

*Plimouth*, October 31. Her Majesty's Ship the *Staney* sailed from hence the 28th Instant, and under her Convoy 3 Vessels bound to *Falmouth*; the *Cleverskirck* of *Flushing*, *Jacob Fret* Master, and the *Venice* Galley of *Rotterdam*, both bound home from *Pharo*, came in here the same day. The 29th sailed the *North Star*, the *Lisbon*, and the *Levant* Gallies, the *Vieger*, and another Merchant Ship belonging to *Amsterdam*, and bound to *Lisbon* and the *Streights*; the *Broughton* Galley of *London*, *Daniel Thomas* Master, bound to *Guinca*, the *Sarah* Galley of *Plimouth*, *Nathaniel Hutchins* Master, bound for *Lisbon*, and the *Flowr* of *Topsham* for *Falmouth*. This day came in the *Rose-Tree* Privateer of *Flushing*, *Peter Garret* Commander, from cruising, the *Severn* Galley of *Bristol*, Captain *Thompson* Commander, with the *Young Tobias* of *Enkirck*;
