Rome, OSub. 13. N.S.

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HE Pope does frequently hold Congregations of State and War, to confult upon the Measures he is to take in the present Juncture, to provide for the Security of his Frontiers, and of his Seaport Towns. The Differences between the Emperor and this Court were debated in one of these Meetings, and it was proposed to recall Signior Davia, the Pope's Nuncio at Vienna, who has been forbid that Court, for not being present at declaring the Archdelke Charles of Austria King of Spain; but the majority was against it. The Pope has appointed the Count de Pauluzzi to have the chief Command of his Forces in the Ferrareze, and the Marquis of Bonaventura to be Governor of forms, who are accordingly gone to their re-spective Commands, with very express Orders to he that the Magazines be well provided, and the Fortifications kept in good Repair, in all Piaces under their Care; and like Directions are fent to the Governors along the Sea Coasts. Since the seizing of the Count the Garendini, the Marquis de Buffalini, and several other Persons, have been put into the Inquisition, being accused of entermining certain Opinions, different from the Dothines which are raught by the Church of Rome, Letters from Naples say, the Viceroy there had or-dered the Militia of that Kingdom to take Arms, who, as well as the regular Troops, were distri-buted into such Posts as are most convenient, as well for fecuring their Coasts, as for preventing any Insurrection in Favour of King Charles the Third, to which the People are very much en-

Venice, Offeber 20. The Ormand Galley, and the Tyger, two Merchant Ships which came from England, under Convoy of the Confederate Fleet commanded by Sir Cloudefly Shovell, arrived here the last week. One of our Merchant Ships came in this week from Constantinople, from whence she sailed the 6th of the last Month, and reports, that the new Grand Signior and his Court were daily expected there from Adriansple; and Signior Soranzo, Ambillador Extraordinary from this Republick to the Porce, waited for their Arrival, intending, as soon as he had paid the usual Compliments to the new Grand Visier, to return home on board the Man of War which carried thirher Signior Justimiani, who is fent to supply his place, with the Character of Bayle, or Ambassador in Ordinary. The rainy Weather, and the Overflowing of the Suchia, detain the Imperial Forces under General Staremberg in their Camp, who are in a readiness tomarch, in order to make a Diversion in favour of the Duke of Savoy, who on his fide is raifing all the Forces he is able, and has (as is faid) altered to the forces he is able. teady got together a confiderable Body of Troops near Vereel, to oppose the Duke of Vendosme. The French have a good Body of Troops between Monzambane and Castiglione delle Stivere, in which all Place they have made a great Magazine of Provisions for their Subsistance. Letters from Rome fay, that the Imperial Ambassador had

caused the King of Spain's Picture to be set up in the Church deil inima, which belongs more particularly to those of the German Nation; but the Pope disapproving of it, the Ambassador had it brought back to his own House, where great Crowds of People, and particularly of Spaniards and Neapolitans, slock daily to see it. His Excellency, upon Advice of the Consederate Fleet's being arrived at Leghorn, went Post thither the 4th Instant, in order to conser with Sir Cloudesty Shovest.

Warsaw, Ostob. 21. The King of Peland has appointed the Senate to meet at Zamosk on the 16th of the next Month, and has lest this Place in order to repair this her. His Majesty intends to take his way, by Uiadzow, and to continue there a few days. It is said he has resolved to fend Ambissadors to the Kings of Denmark and Prussia, and the Czar of Muscow, to desire their Assistance against the Swed s. The Cardinal Primate is gone to his Country House at Lowitz.

Cologne, Newemb. 2. Two Regiments of Horse

Cologue, Neveral 2. Two Regiments of Horse and 3 Battalions of Foor, of the King of Pruffic's Forces, have Winter Quarters alligned them within this Archbishoprick, and their head Quarter is to be at Nuis. The Elector Palatine has undertaken to provide the Towns of Munsterey fields and Eukirchen with sofficient Garison. Letters from the Upper Rhine lay, the Garison of Landau makes so resource Defence, that the Franch have already soft more. Men before that Place than they did in the whole Siege of Brisac; and that the Waters of the River Lairch are overflowed in such manner, that in some of their Trenches they are up to the Knees in Water.

Filmouth, Octob. 30. The Gilden Lyon, the Salamander, and the Land of Promise, three Privateers of Flushing, brought in here on the 28th Instant the Happy, a Privateer belonging to St. Malo, of 12: Guns and 80 Men, whom they took the 26th off Ushant. They had fome days before retaken from the French the Primrose of Bristol, bound to Carolina. This day sailed from hence the Expedition Pacquet-Boat, with one Mail for Lubon; the Betty Galley and the Severn Galley, laden with Fish for Leghorn, and the Maria Theresa of Flushing, bound to the Maderas.

Plimouth, Ottaber 31. Her Majesty's Ship the Staney failed from hence the 28th Instant, and under her Convoy 3 Vessels bound to Falmouth; the Cleverskirk of Flysbing, Jacob Fres Master, and the Venice Galley of Rosterdam, both bound home from Pharo, came inhere the same day. The 29th sailed the North Star, the Lisbon, and the Levant Gallies, the Vieger, and another Merchant Ship belonging to Amsterdam, and bound to Lisbon and the Streights; the Broughton Galley of London, Daniel Thomas Master, bound to Guinea, the Sarab Galley of Plimouth, Nathaniel Hutchins Master, bound for Lisbon, and the Flower of Toopham for Falmouth. This day came in the Rose-Tree Privateer of Flushing, Peter Garree Commander, from cruizing, the Severn Galley of Bristal, Captain Thompson Commander, with the Toung Tohias of Touthirs.
