

Dunkirk, whom she took on the French Coast, and forced on Shore 4 other French Merchant Ships that were in her Company; and the *Industry*, a Privateer of London, Captain Dennis Rowe Commander, from the French Coast.

Comes, November 1. Several Dutch Merchant Ships, bound to Portugal, failed from hence the 29th past, under Convoy of 3 or 4 Letter of Marc Ships, of between 20 and 40 Guns each; but two of them, viz. the *Bona Ventura* and the *Catharine*, both of Amsterdam, and laden with Corn, having touched upon a Rock called the *Skingles*, were forced to return hither the next day to repair the Damage they had suffered. The New-York Merchant, *Nicholas Garret* Master, is arrived here from Rotterdam; as is also the *James and Elizabeth*, *James Robinson* Master, from *Hamburgh*: This last Ship was taken off of *Bonny-head* by a French Capet, 4 other of their Capets being in sight; but one of Her Majesty's Ships coming up, and pursuing the Enemy, they were forced to quit her.

The Dutch Mail of Friday last is not yet come in.
