WHEREAS by the Eritrea and Somalia (Administration) Order in Council, 1949 (hereinafter referred to as "the Order"), provision was made for the exercise, as from such date as should be proclaimed in the territory of Eritrea, of the authority of His late Majesty, King George VI, in Eritrea by a Chief Administrator appointed for that purpose by, and responsible to, His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs:

And Whereas such date was duly proclaimed in, and a Chief Administrator appointed for, Eritrea in accordance with the Order:

And Whereas by a resolution adopted by the General Assembly of the United Nations on the second day of December, 1950, in exercise of the power recited in the Order to recommend the final disposal of Italian possessions in Africa, it was recommended (inter alia):

(a) that Eritrea should constitute an autonomous unit federated with Ethiopia under the Ethiopian Crown;

(b) that there should be a transition period which should not extend beyond the fifteenth day of September, 1952, during which the Eritrean Government would be organised and the Eritrean Constitution prepared and put into effect;

(c) that the Federal Act and the Constitution of Eritrea should enter into effect upon the happening of certain events specified in the resolution;

(d) that during the transition period the then administering Power, that is to say the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, should continue to conduct the affairs of Eritrea;

(e) that arrangements should be made by the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland for the transfer of power to the appropriate authorities and that the transfer of such power should take place as soon as the Eritrean Constitution and the Federal Act should enter into effect:

And whereas the Federal Act has to be ratified by the Emperor of Ethiopia and the Constitution of Eritrea has to be approved by the United Nations Commissioner, adopted by the Eritrean Assembly and ratified by the Emperor of Ethiopia and such action will shortly be taken and it is expedient to make provision that the said Act and Constitution may enter into effect:

And whereas by the Order His Late Majesty reserved to Himself, His Heirs and Successors, power with the advice of His and Their Privy Council, to revoke, alter or amend the Order as to Him or Them should seem fit:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in exercise of all powers enabling Her in that behalf, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order and it is hereby ordered as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Eritrean (Termination of Administration) Order, 1952.

2. The authority of Her Majesty in Eritrea shall determine as from such date as shall be proclaimed therein by the Chief Administrator.

And the Right Honourable Anthony Eden, Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, is to give the necessary directions herein.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 25th day of August, 1952 (P.M.5129/52), in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, or to the widow or relative of a deceased Officer, Seaman or Marine, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions, as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas by the Pensions (Increase) Acts, 1920, 1924, 1944 and 1947, provision is made subject to certain conditions and restrictions, for the increase of certain civil pensions payable in respect of public service:

"And whereas by Orders in Council dated the 13th August, 1920, 8th December, 1924, 28th September, 1944, 24th January, 1945, 20th March, 1946, and 2nd April, 1947, provision is made for the increase of certain Naval pensions and other awards, including awards administered by the Ministry of Pensions, to correspond as nearly as may be, with the benefits provided by the aforementioned Pensions (Increase) Acts:

"And whereas we now deem it expedient to make further provision for the increase of such awards to correspond, as nearly as may be, with the benefits provided, in the case of certain civil pensions, by the Pensions (Increase) Act, 1952:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction the provision set out in the

Schedules annexed hereto with effect from the 1st October, 1952.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals.

" SCHEDULE I

"This Schedule relates to:—

- "(a) Officers' service retired pay or the service portion of disability retired pay if assessed under regulations in force before 1st September, 1950.
- "(b) the service retired pay or the service portion of disability retired pay of members of Queen Alexandra's Royal Naval Nursing Service and Nursing Service Reserve if assessed under regulations in force before 1st September, 1950.
- "(c) men's Service pensions including elements for rank and age if assessed under regulations in force before 1st September, 1950.
- "(d) the Service pensions of Teachers in the Girls' and Infants' Schools of the Royal Marine Forces who are pensionable under Order in Council of the 10th February, 1905 and previous Orders.
- "(e) pensions payable under Order in Council of the 23rd May, 1952, and previous Orders relating to Riggers and Yardcraft personnel if beginning before the 1st April, 1952.
- "(f) pensions payable under Order in Council of the 3rd July, 1939 and previous Orders relating to European and Indian members of the Hong Kong Dockyard Police if beginning before the 1st April, 1952.
- "(g) pensions payable under Order in Council of the 3rd July, 1939, relating to European and Indian (or otherwise Asiatic) members of the Singapore Dockyard Police if beginning before the 1st April, 1952.
- "(h) pensions payable under Order in Council of the 23rd May, 1952, and previous Orders relating to certain Shipwrights if beginning before the 1st April, 1952.
- "(i) officers' widows' 'ordinary' pensions and children's 'ordinary' compassionate allowances.
- "(j) Victoria Cross annuities of £10 (with £5 for each bar) and Conspicuous Gallantry Medal annuities awarded in respect of service before 1st April, 1947.
- "(k) Meritorious Service Annuities payable to Royal Marines, where the recipient is also in receipt of another pension increasable under this Schedule.
- "(l) Retired Officers' Naval Pensions and Good Service Pensions.
- "(m) any award increased under Orders in Council of the 13th August, 1920, or the 8th December, 1924, or which would have been increasable under those Orders but for the income limits imposed thereby.
- "(n) Pensions payable under Order in Council of 11th July, 1951, and previous Orders relating to Officers of the Royal Fleet Auxiliary Service if beginning before the 1st April, 1952.
- "(o) the Service retired pay of Officers of the former Royal Indian Navy.

"Note: Additions to pension in respect of gallantry awards shall, for the purposes of this Schedule, be regarded as service elements of pension forming a part of the pensions to which they are attached.

"2. An award to which this Schedule relates may be increased provided the following conditions are fulfilled:—

- "(a) The income of the pensioner does not exceed, in the case of a pensioner who is married or has at least one dependant, £550 a year, or in any other case, £425 a year, including any pension in either case, but disregarding, in assessing income for this purpose, the first £104 a year of income other than the increasable pension or pensions, and
- "(b) either:—
 - "(i) the pensioner has attained the age of 60 years (or, where the pension is a widow's pension, 40 years) or has not attained the age of 16 years, or
 - "(ii) the pensioner was invalided from the Naval Service, or
 - "(iii) the pensioner is a woman who has at least one dependant, or
 - "(iv) the pensioner is permanently incapacitated by physical or mental infirmity from engaging in any regular full-time employment.

"3. The increase admissible shall be as follows:—

- "(a) If the pensioner is married, or has at least one dependant, £26 a year, or in the case of pensions assessed at weekly or daily rates, 10s. a week.
- "(b) In other cases, £20 a year, or in the case of pensions assessed at weekly or daily rates, 7s. 8d. a week,

but shall in no case exceed either one third of the rate of pension, including any increase granted under former Pensions Increase Orders in Council, or the amount required to bring the income of the pensioner up to the appropriate income limit in paragraph 2 (a) above, whichever is less.

"4. Any portion of a pension which has been commuted shall not be regarded as part of the pension for the purposes of this Schedule.

"5. The grant of an increase of pension under this Schedule shall not affect entitlement to increase of pension under former Pensions Increase Orders in Council, and any increase granted under this Schedule shall be disregarded in determining entitlement under those Orders.

"6. The income of a married pensioner shall be deemed to include the income of the husband or wife of that pensioner, but the income of a pensioner shall not be otherwise deemed to include the income of any other person.

"7. A pensioner shall be regarded as unmarried unless the husband or wife of the pensioner is alive, and where a husband and wife are living apart, they may be treated as unmarried persons at the discretion of the Admiralty.

"8. To be regarded as dependent on the pensioner for the purposes of this Schedule a person must be in fact wholly or mainly supported by the pensioner, must not have an income from other sources (apart from income from any scholarship or educational endowment) in excess of £104 a year, and must be either

- "(i) The parent, brother, sister, child, uncle or aunt of the pensioner, or of the pensioner's husband or wife, or deceased husband or wife, or the child of such a relative ('child' including legitimate and illegitimate children, step-children, and statutorily adopted children) or the pensioner's step-father or step-mother, or
- "(ii) under 16 years of age, or receiving full-time instruction at an educational establishment, or undergoing full-time training for a trade, profession or vocation.

"9. Where a pensioner is in receipt of more than one pension to which this Schedule applies, the aggregate increase on all such pensions shall be restricted to the increase which would have been given on a single pension equal to their total. The increase on each individual pension shall be calculated by dividing the aggregate increase between the pensions in proportion to the increases which would have been given apart from this restriction.

"10. Where a husband and wife are both in receipt of pensions to which this Schedule applies, the pensions of husband and wife may be increased separately. Where in such a case it is necessary to restrict the aggregate increase in order that the appropriate income limit may not be exceeded, the increase on each individual pension shall be calculated by dividing the aggregate increase between the pensions in proportion to the increases which would have been given apart from that restriction.

"11. Where a widow in receipt of a widow's pension has dependent on her a child or children under 16 years of age receiving pension or compassionate allowance in respect of her husband's service, the widow's pension and children's awards shall be aggregated for the purpose of determining the amount of the admissible increase, and the amount so determined shall be distributed proportionately between the awards.

" SCHEDULE II

"In the case of the pensions specified at (e), (f), (g), (h), and (n) in paragraph 1 of Schedule I of this Order, the award may be increased to the extent to which a corresponding award under the Superannuation Acts would have been increasable under the provisions of the Pensions (Increase) Act, 1952.

"2. The income limits imposed by paragraph 3 of the Special Provisions in Schedule III of Order in

Council of the 28th September, 1944, in connection with the re-assessment of certain awards under Orders in Council of the 27th March, 1923, and the 1st February, 1926, shall be withdrawn as far as they relate to any such re-assessed award, or any portion thereof, which is calculated with reference to the degree of disablement of the pensioner.

" SCHEDULE III

" Any general conditions attaching to the grant or continuance of a pension shall also apply to the grant or continuance of any increase to that pension awarded under Schedules I or II hereof."

" We beg leave humbly that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to authorise the establishment of the rank of Commander (L) (Branch List) in Your Majesty's Navy, to which selected Lieutenant-Commanders (L) (Branch List) may be promoted, provided they have served in the latter rank for a period corresponding to that which would have qualified them for similar promotion on the General List of the Electrical Branch. Their conditions remaining in all other respects those of Branch Officers.

new parish to be taken out of the parishes of Stockingford and Saint Mary the Virgin, Nuneaton, in the diocese of Coventry.

" SCHEME

" Whereas, we, the Church Commissioners are satisfied that the spiritual interests of the area defined in the sub-joined Schedule and delineated on the map hereto annexed would be best served by constituting it a new parish:

" And whereas we are satisfied that a suitable endowment therefor will be provided:

" And whereas we have not approved any consecrated church within the area as suitable to be the parish church of the new parish:

" Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Neville, Bishop of Coventry (in testimony whereof he has set his hand and affixed his episcopal seal to this Scheme), we, the said Church Commissioners do humbly recommend and propose as follows, that is to say:—

" 1. Constitution:

" (a) As from the date of the licence thereto of a minister the area defined in the sub-joined Schedule and delineated on the map hereto annexed shall be a separate district for spiritual purposes.

" (b) As from the date of the consecration of a church within the area approved by us, the said Church Commissioners, as suitable to be a parish church or if the church is consecrated before such approval, the date of the approval, the said area shall become a new parish.

" (c) The name of the district (or parish as the case may be) shall be 'The District (or Parish) of Saint Peter, Galley Common'.

" 2. Archdeaconry and Rural Deanery:

" The Parish shall be in the archdeaconry of Coventry and in the rural deanery of Atherstone.

" THE SCHEDULE

" The area comprising:—

" All those contiguous parts (together coloured pink on the map annexed hereto) of the parishes of Stockingford and Saint Mary the Virgin, Nuneaton, which are bounded on the north in part by the parish of Hartshill, and in part by the parish of Ansley, on the west also by the parish of Ansley, on the south in part by the parish of Astley and on the remaining sides by an imaginary line commencing at a point on the boundary which divides the parish of Astley from parish of Stockingford at the southern end of the wall or fence which divides close numbered 1052 on the map annexed hereto from close numbered 1053 and continuing thence northwards along the walls or fences which divide closes numbered 1052 and 1002 from closes numbered 1053 and 1001 to their end and continuing thence first eastwards and then northwards along the walls or fences which divide close numbered 987 from close numbered 1001 and in the same straight line to a point in the middle of Ansley Road and continuing thence eastwards along the middle of Ansley Road to a point opposite the middle of the southern end of the lane known locally as Ash Lane and continuing thence to and along the middle of Ash Lane first north-westwards and then northwards to a point in the middle of the bridge which carries Ash Lane over Whittleford Brook and continuing thence first eastwards and then north-eastwards along the middle of Whittleford Brook to the boundary which divides the parish of Stockingford from the parish of Saint Mary the Virgin, Nuneaton, and continuing thence generally north-westwards along the last-mentioned boundary to a point 200 feet to the south of the middle of Green Lane and continuing thence north-eastwards along an imaginary line parallel to, and at a distance of 200 feet from, the middle of Green Lane to the southwestern end of the walls or fences at the rear of the houses and premises on the southeastern side of Greere Lane and continuing thence along the walls or fences at the rear of the houses and premises known as numbers 115 to 11, Green Lane (thereby crossing Ramsden Avenue) and in the same straight line to a point on the wall or fence which divides close numbered 122 from close numbered 123 (thereby crossing close numbered 122) and continuing thence north-westwards along the last-mentioned wall or fence to a point opposite its northwestern end on the boundary which divides the parish of Stockingford from the parish of Saint

Mary the Virgin, Nuneaton, and continuing thence first north-eastwards and then north-westwards along the last-mentioned boundary to the wall or fence which divides the houses and premises known as numbers 232 and 234, Camp Hill Road and continuing thence northwards along the last-mentioned wall or fence and in the same straight line to the boundary which divides the parish of Saint Mary the Virgin, Nuneaton, from the parish of Hartshill (thereby crossing Cleveleys Drive and Berrington Road)."

And whereas the provisions of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme, have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Coventry.

"And whereas the Right Reverend *William*, Bishop of *Bath and Wells*, consents to the proposed arrangements (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme):

"Now, therefore, we, the said Church Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme the boundaries of the said parishes of *Lucombe*, *Porlock* and *Stoke Pero* shall be altered in the manner described in the Schedule and delineated on the map annexed to this Scheme.

"THE SCHEDULE

"(a) The territory to be annexed to the parish of *Porlock*:—

"All that part (coloured pink on the map annexed hereto) of the parish of *Lucombe* which is bounded upon the north east by a detached part of the parish of *Porlock*, upon the north by the *Bristol Channel*, upon the north west by the parish of *Porlock*, upon the south west by the parish of *Stoke Pero* and upon the remaining side by an imaginary line commencing on the boundary which divides the parish of *Stoke Pero* from the parish of *Lucombe* in the middle of *Horner Water* and continuing thence first eastwards and then northwards along the middle of *Horner Water* to a point opposite the eastern end of the wall or fence forming the southern boundary of close numbered 220 on the map annexed hereto and continuing thence westwards to and along the last mentioned wall or fence and in the same straight line to a point opposite its western end in the middle of the track or footpath which runs north westwards along the southwestern sides of closes numbered 220, 222 and 197 to the road leading from *Porlock* to *West Lucombe* and continuing thence north westwards along the middle of the last mentioned track or footpath to a point opposite its north western end in the middle of the last mentioned road and continuing thence westwards along the middle of the last mentioned road to a point opposite the

southern end of the wall or fence forming the western boundary of the grounds attached to the house and premises known as *Luckbarrow* and continuing thence northwards to and along the last mentioned wall or fence to its end and continuing thence north eastwards in a straight line for a distance of 23½ chains or thereabouts to a point opposite the middle of the southern end of *Orchard Lane* on the boundary which divides the parish of *Lucombe* from the aforementioned detached part of the parish of *Porlock*.

"(b) The territory to be annexed to the parish of *Stoke Pero*:—

"All that further part (coloured green on the map annexed hereto) of the parish of *Lucombe* which is bounded upon the west by the parish of *Stoke Pero* and upon the remaining sides by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the parish of *Lucombe* from the parish of *Stoke Pero* in the middle of *East Water* and continuing thence first eastwards, then northwards and then westwards along the middle of *East Water* to its junction with *Horner Water* and continuing thence first southwards and then westwards along the middle of *Horner Water* to the boundary which divides the parish of *Lucombe* from the parish of *Stoke Pero*."

And whereas the provisions of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme, have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for altering the boundaries of the parishes of *Kidlington*, *Begbroke* and *Shipton-upon-Cherwell*, all in the diocese of *Oxford*.

"Whereas we are satisfied that it is desirable that the boundaries of the said parishes should be altered in the manner hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the Right Reverend *Kenneth*, Bishop of *Oxford*, consents to the proposed arrangements (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme):

"Now, therefore, we, the said Church Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme the boundaries of the said parishes of *Kidlington*, *Begbroke* and *Shipton-upon-Cherwell* shall be altered in the manner described in the Schedule and delineated on the map annexed to this Scheme.

"THE SCHEDULE.

"1. The territory to be annexed to the parish of *Begbroke*:—

"All that portion of the parish of *Kidlington*, coloured pink on the map annexed hereto, which lies to the west and south of an imaginary line commencing at the point on the boundary which divides the parish of *Yarnton* from the parish of *Kidlington* on the western side of the *Oxford Canal* where it is joined by *Rowel Brook* and extending thence first northeastwards to then north-westwards along the middle of the said *Canal* to a point opposite to the southeastern end of the

wall or fence which divides close numbered 81 from close numbered 110 and continuing thence northwestwards to and along the last-mentioned wall or fence to its end and continuing thence first northwestwards to and then westwards along the middle of Langford Lane to a point opposite to the southeastern end of the wall or fence which divides closes numbered 82 and 12 from close numbered 11 and continuing thence northwestwards to and along the last-mentioned wall or fence to a point in the middle of the footpath which leads from Thrup to Upper Campsfield Road and continuing thence southwestwards along the last-mentioned footpath for a distance of 63 chains (or thereabouts) and continuing thence southwestwards in a straight line for a distance of 15 chains (or thereabouts) thereby crossing the Woodstock-Oxford Road to the northeastern end of the eastern wall or fence of close numbered 35 and continuing thence southwestwards along the last-mentioned wall or fence and along the wall or fence which divides close numbered 1 from close numbered 36 and then southeastwards along the wall or fence which divides close numbered 36 from close numbered 37 for a distance of 18 feet (or thereabouts) and then in a straight line in a southwesterly direction for a distance of 60 feet (or thereabouts) to the boundary which divides the parish of Kidlington from the parish of Bladon with Woodstock.

"2. The territory to be annexed to the parish of Shipton-on-Cherwell:—
