

*Plimouth, November 14.* The *Smirna* Galley of *Amsterdam*, *Jacob Anthony* Master, sailed from hence the 10th Instant, being bound home from *Faro*. The next day came in here the *Concession* of *Genova*, bound home from *Amsterdam*, and the *Noah's-Ark* of *Amsterdam*, bound to the *Sreights*. Her Majesty's Ship the *B-dford* came in the 12th; as did also the *Young Jacob* of *Amsterdam*, bound home from *Surinam*. Two of Her Majesty's Ships and two *Dutch Men of War* sailed from hence yesterday to the Eastward, with about 20 homeward bound Merchant Ships under their Convoy, most of them for *London*; as also two Tin Ships from *Famouth*, and 3 Coasters, bound for *London*.

*Yarmouth, November 15.* About 200 Sail of laden Colliers came into our Roads this day being part of a Fleet from *Newcastle*; but the Wind being contrary, the rest have not yet been able to get in. Part of the *Hull* Fleet, bound for *London*, is also come in with them.

*Bristol, November 15.* The *Richard* and *John* arrived here the 13th Instant from *Virginia*, and the *Port-Royal* from *Jamaica*. The *George* came in yesterday from *Jamaica*, and the *Exchange* Galley this day from *Nevis*. They bring no manner of News, having been long in their Passage.

*Comet, November 15.* A *Dutch Caper*, called the *Three Sisters*, sent in here the 13th Instant a *French Prize* laden with *Brandy*, which he had taken out of 5 upon the Coast of *France*, near the Islands of *Jersey* and *Guernsey*. The *Upton* Galley of *Belfast*, *William Whiteside* Master, arrived here this day from *Virginia*, but left from *Plimouth*; as did also the *Swallow* of *London*, *Robert Sturdy* Master, bound home from *Lisbon*.

*Essex, November 16.* Her Majesty's Ship the *Pendennis* came into the *Downes* last night from *Plimouth*, and under her Convoy the *Harding*, *Johanna* and *Philadelphia*, from *Virginia*, the *Dover* from *Carolina*, the *Timewell* from *Oporto*, the *Adventure* from *New-York*, and several other homeward bound Merchant Ships and Coasters, making in all about 26 Sail, which sailed directly through for the River.
