#### Civil Service Commission, 14th October, 1952.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of H.M. Treasury, viz.:—

RECRUITMENT OF (A) H.M. INSPECTORS OF TAXES IN THE INLAND REVENUE DEPARTMENT, (B) THE CADET GRADE IN THE MINISTRY OF LABOUR AND NATIONAL SERVICE, (C) PROBATIONARY ASSISTANT POSTAL CONTROLLERS IN THE POST OFFICE, AND (D) JOINT INTELLIGENCE BUREAU OFFICERS, GRADE III, MINISTRY OF DEFENCE.

1. There will be two methods of entry; Method I and Method II. Regulation 2 relates to Method I, and Regulations 3 and 4 to Method II; the remaining Regulations relate to both methods. No candidate may compete more than twice, but if he competes under both Method I and Method II in the same year this will be treated as a single attempt.

#### METHOD I.

#### 2. Examination.

(i) The examination consists of the following:—

(A) A written examination in

(a) three compulsory subjects, namely Essay, English, and Present Day, to each of which a maximum of 100 marks is allotted;

(b) a selection from the optional subjects set out in the Appendix. Subject to the provisions in the Appendix, candidates may take optional subjects up to a total of 500 marks (the marks awarded on these optional subjects will be adjusted to a maximum of 700 marks, making 1,000 marks in all for the written examination).

(B) An interview before the Final Interview Board, which will award a mark out of a maximum of 300 for the candidate's record, intelligence, and personal qualities.

(ii) The final order of merit will be determined by the total marks gained in the whole examination. In the event of a tie between two or more candidates the Commissioners will decide which to declare successful.

#### METHOD II.

#### 3. Examination.

(i) The examination consists of the following:—

(A) A written examination comprising two papers in English, two General Papers, and a

test of General Intelligence, for each of which a maximum of 100 marks is allotted (making 500 marks in all).

(B) A series of tests of personal qualities.

(C) An interview before the Final Selection Board.

(ii) The Commissioners will select in the light of the results of the written examination under (i) (A) and of the candidates' records those who will be admitted to the tests of personal qualities under (i) (B).

(iii) The Commissioners will subsequently select in the light of the candidates' performances in the personal tests and of their records those who will be admitted to interview by the Final Selection Board.

(iv) The final order of merit will be determined by the mark awarded by the Final Selection Board out of a maximum of 300. This will take into account the candidate's record, intelligence, and personal qualities. In the event of a tie between two or more candidates the Commissioners will decide which to declare successful. The Commissioners may at their discretion require a candidate to attend a second time before the Final Selection Board if they consider it necessary to enable them to reach a decision.

(v) The Commissioners may, at their discretion, exempt from the written examination under (i) (A) anyone who has previously been a candidate either for the Administrative Class of the Home Civil Service or for the Special Departmental Classes and has been awarded a mark of more than 200 by the Final Selection or Interview Board, provided he applies for such exemption on his Application Form.

(vi) The Commissioners may, at their discretion, exempt from the tests of personal qualities under (i) (B) anyone who has taken them before, provided he applies for such exemption on his Application Form.

#### 4. Education.

(i) Candidates must either (a) have obtained a degree at a recognised university, or (b) be in the last year of a course for a degree at a recognised university. In the latter case, they will not be appointed (if declared successful) unless they produce evidence, not later than 1st September of the year in which they compete, that they have obtained the degree.

(ii) A candidate who has served or is serving on a regular (including a regular short-service) engagement in H.M. Forces may be admitted to compete, notwithstanding that he fails to satisfy the requirements of sub-para. (i), if (a) he is in other respects eligible under these Regulations to compete; and (b) he is recommended to the Civil Service Commissioners by the appropriate Service Authority, as warranting consideration for appointment to the Special Departmental Classes by reason of his record, education, intelligence, and personal qualities.

#### METHODS I AND II.

#### 5. Age.

Candidates must be at least 20½ years and under 24 years of age on the 1st August of the year in which the examination is held. But

(a) a candidate who has served or is serving in H.M. Forces may deduct the period of such service from his actual age.

(b) For Method II only, candidates who are 24 years and over but under 30 years of age on 1st August of the year in which the examination is held may at the Commissioners' discretion be admitted to the competition for posts in the Ministry of Labour and National Service, provided that they are in all other respects eligible under these Regulations, and that they have had experience in employment in industry or social work which particularly fits them for consideration for appointment to posts in the Ministry of Labour and National Service.

#### 6. Sex.

Both men and women are eligible, except that posts of Probationary Assistant Postal Controller are open to men only.

#### 7. Nationality.

Candidates must be British subjects. They must also satisfy one of the following conditions:—

(a) If natural-born British subjects, they must either

(i) have at least one parent who is or was at death a British subject, or



(ii) have resided in Her Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

(b) If naturalised British subjects, they must have resided in Her Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

(c) If not qualified under (a) or (b) of this paragraph they must satisfy the Commissioners that they are so closely connected with Her Majesty's dominions either by ancestry, upbringing, or residence, or by reason of national service, that an exception may properly be made in their favour.

8. *Health and Character.*

Successful candidates must satisfy the Commissioners as to their health and character.

9. *Vacancies.*

The number of vacancies to be filled from the competition as a whole, and the number to be filled by Method I and Method II respectively, will be determined by the Commissioners.

10. *Candidates Trained as Teachers.*

Candidates who have been trained as teachers and upon whose training public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate central education authority (e.g., the Ministry of Education, the Scottish Education Department, the Ministry of Education for Northern Ireland) has been notified to the Commissioners.

11. *Assignment.*

Candidates will be considered for all the posts for which they are eligible under these Regulations; they will, however, be asked to state on their Application Forms their preferences among the four Departments. The Commissioners will decide to which Department each successful candidate is to be assigned. Assignments will be made in accordance with the needs of the public service and the candidates' suitability for particular Departments, but the wishes of candidates will, where possible, be taken into account. Candidates' suitability for Departments will be assessed by the Interview Board.

The names of the successful candidates will be issued in four lists according to the Departments to which they are assigned; a candidate who declines to accept the post for which he is declared successful will have no claim to be assigned to another.

A candidate cannot be considered for appointment as J.I.B. Officer, Grade III, in the Ministry of Defence, unless (a) as a Method I candidate he includes in his optional subjects one or more of the following:—(29) General Economics, (30) Industry and Trade, (33) Social Economics, (34, 35) Economic History, (36) Economic Statistics, (47, 48) Geology, (54) Geography, or (b) as a Method II candidate his degree is in economic subjects, geology, or geography.

12. *Canvassing.*

Any attempt on the part of candidates to enlist support for their applications through Members of Parliament or other influential persons, except as referees to be named by them in their application forms, will disqualify them for appointment.

13. *Fees.*

The total fee payable by all candidates is £2 for either Method separately, and £3 for both Methods. Of this £1 must be paid on application.

#### RECRUITMENT TO THE SENIOR BRANCH OF THE FOREIGN SERVICE.

1. No candidate may compete more than twice.

#### 2. Age.

Candidates must be at least 20½ years and under 24 years of age on the 1st August of the year in which the examination is held. But a candidate who has served or is serving in H.M. Forces may deduct the period of such service from his actual age.

#### 3. Marriage.

Both men and women may compete under these Regulations; but

(a) every woman candidate must be unmarried or a widow;

(b) women will normally be required to resign their appointments on marriage, but in exceptional cases they may be retained with the permission of the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs.

The approval of the Secretary of State is required before a successful male candidate who is married takes up appointment.

#### 4. Nationality.

(1) Every candidate must

(a) be a natural-born British subject; and

(b) have been born within the United Kingdom or within one of the self-governing Dominions of parents both of whom were also born within the United Kingdom or within one of the self-governing Dominions.

(2) No departure from this rule will be made without the special permission of the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, and then only in exceptional cases and in favour of candidates who are British subjects and who also satisfy one of the following conditions:—

(a) If natural-born British subjects, they must either

(i) have at least one parent who is, or was at death, a British subject; or

(ii) have resided in Her Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service

of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

(b) If naturalised British subjects, they must have resided in Her Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

(c) If not qualified under (a) or (b) of this sub-paragraph they must satisfy the Commissioners that they are so closely connected with Her Majesty's dominions, either by ancestry, upbringing, or residence, or by reason of national service, that an exception may properly be made in their favour.

#### 5. Health and Character.

Successful candidates must satisfy the Commissioners as to their health and character.

#### 6. Education.

(i) Candidates must either (a) have obtained at least second class honours in a full honours degree examination at a recognised university, or (b) be in the last year of a full course for an honours degree at a recognised university. In the latter case, they will not be appointed (if declared successful) unless they produce evidence, not later than 1st September of the year in which they compete, that they have obtained at least second class honours in their degree examination.

(ii) Candidates who are unable to satisfy the provisions of sub-paragraph (i) may qualify if they take the written examination under Method I for the Administrative Class of the Home Civil Service and reach in it a standard satisfactory to the Commissioners (see Appendix).

(iii) A candidate who has served, or is serving, on a regular (including a regular short-service) engagement in Her Majesty's Forces may be admitted to compete, notwithstanding that he fails to satisfy either sub-paragraph (i) or sub-paragraph (ii) if (a) he is in other respects eligible under these Regulations to compete and (b) he is recommended to the Civil Service Commissioners by the appropriate Service Authority as warranting consideration for appointment to the Senior Branch of the Foreign Service by reason of his record, education, intelligence, and personal qualities.

#### 7. Examination.

(i) The examination consists of the following:—

(A) A written examination comprising two papers in English, two General Papers, and a test of General Intelligence, for each of which a maximum of 100 marks is allotted (making 500 marks in all).

(B) A series of tests of personal qualities.

(C) An oral test in a foreign language approved by the Commissioners; but the Commissioners may dispense with this in the case of a candidate who satisfies them that he possesses adequate ability to speak a modern foreign language.

(D) An interview before the Final Selection Board.

(ii) The Commissioners will select in the light of the results of the written examination under (i) (A) and of the candidates' records those who will be admitted to the tests of personal qualities under (i) (B).

(iii) The Commissioners will subsequently select in the light of the candidates' performances in the personal tests and of their records those who will be admitted to interview by the Final Selection Board.

(iv) The final order of merit will be determined by the mark awarded by the Final Selection Board out of a maximum of 300. This will take into account the candidate's record, intelligence, personal qualities, and language ability. In the event of a tie between two or more candidates the Commissioners will decide which to declare successful. The Commissioners may at their discretion require a candidate to attend a second time before the Final Selection Board if they consider it necessary to enable them to reach a decision.

(v) The Commissioners may, at their discretion, exempt from the written examination under (i) (A) anyone who has previously been a candidate for the Senior Branch of the Foreign Service and has been awarded a mark of more than 200 by the Final Selection Board, provided he applies for such exemption on his Application Form.

(vi) The Commissioners may, at their discretion, exempt from the tests of personal qualities under (i) (B) anyone who has taken them before, provided

he applies for such exemption on his Application Form.

**8. Candidates trained as Teachers.**

Candidates who have been trained as teachers and upon whose training public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate central education authority (e.g., the Ministry of Education, the Scottish Education Department, the Ministry of Education for Northern Ireland) has been notified to the Commissioners.

**9. Canvassing.**

Any attempt on the part of candidates to enlist support for their applications through Members of Parliament or other influential persons, except as referees to be named by them in their Application Forms, will disqualify them for appointment.

**10. Fee.**

The total fee payable by all candidates is £4. Of this £2 must be paid on application.
