WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 26th day of August, 1952, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty

in Council the following Scheme for altering the boundaries of the parishes of Christ Church, Cobridge, and Northwood both in the diocese of Lichfield and for constituting a new parish to be taken out of the parish of Christ Church, Cobridge.

“SCHEME.

“Whereas we, the Church Commissioners, are satisfied (1) that it is desirable that the boundaries of the parish of Christ Church, Cobridge, and of the parish of Northwood should be altered in the manner described in Part I of the subjoined Schedule and as delineated on the map hereto annexed and (2) that the spiritual interests of the area defined in Part II of the said Schedule and delineated on the said map would be best served by constituting it a new parish and that a suitable endowment therefor will be provided:

“And whereas we have not approved any consecrated church within the area described in Part II of the said Schedule as suitable to be the parish church of the new parish.

“Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Edward, Bishop of Lichfield (in testimony whereof he has set his hand and affixed his episcopal seal to this Scheme), we, the said Church Commissioners, do humbly recommend and propose as follows, that is to say:—

“1. As from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council confirming this Scheme, the boundaries of the said parish of Christ Church, Cobridge, and of the said parish of Northwood shall be altered in the manner described in Part I of the said Schedule and delineated on the said map.

“2.—(a) As from the date of the licence thereto of a minister the area defined in Part II of the said Schedule and delineated on the said map shall be a separate district for spiritual purposes.

“(b) As from the date of the consecration of a church within the said area approved by us, the said Church Commissioners, as suitable to be a parish church, or if the church is consecrated before such approval, the date of the approval, the said area shall become a new parish.

“(c) The name of the district (or parish as the case may be) shall be ‘the District (or Parish) of Saint Andrew, Sneyd Green’.

“(d) The district (or parish) shall be in the arch-deaconry of Stoke on Trent and in the rural deanery of Stoke on Trent.

“THE SCHEDULE.

*Part I.*

“The territory (shown by the blue colour on the map) to be annexed to the parish of Northwood:—

“All that part of the parish of Christ Church, Cobridge, which is bounded on the east by the parishes of Saint Philip and Saint James, Milton, and Bucknall cum Bagnall, on the southwest by the said parish of Northwood and upon the remaining side by an imaginary line commencing at a point on the boundary which divides the said

parish of Northwood from the said parish of Christ Church, Cobridge, in the middle of the road or lane at the rear of the houses and premises known as numbers 1 to 41 Birches Head Road and extending thence northeastwards along the middle of the said road or lane to its northeastern end and continuing thence northeastwards in a straight line to the southwestern end, of the walls or fences at the rear of the houses and premises known as numbers 55 to 129 Birches Head Road and continuing thence eastwards along the said walls or fences to their eastern end and continuing thence generally eastwards and northeastwards at a distance of 120 feet north of the middle of Birches Head Road parallel to the middle of Birches Head Road to the boundary which divides the parish of Christ Church, Cobridge, from the parish of Saint Philip and Saint James, Milton.

*"Part II.*

"The area comprising:—

"All that part of the parish of Christ Church, Cobridge (shown by the pink colour on the map), which lies generally to the northwest of the territory described in Part I of this Schedule and proposed to be annexed to the parish of Northwood and to the northeast of an imaginary line commencing at a point on the boundary which divides the parish of Holy Trinity, Sneyd, from the parish of Christ Church, Cobridge, in the middle of an unnamed road leading to Abbey Street and extending thence southeastwards along the middle of the said unnamed road and Abbey Street (thereby crossing Leek New Road) to the southeastern end of Abbey Street and continuing thence first north-eastwards and then southeastwards along the track or footpath leading from Abbey Street to Sneyd Street to a point in the middle of Sneyd Street and continuing thence eastwards along the middle of Sneyd Street for a distance of 100 feet or thereabouts to a point opposite to the middle of the track or footpath leading from Sneyd Street to 'the Hollows' and continuing thence first south-eastwards and then eastwards along the said track or footpath to the boundary which divides the parish of Christ Church, Cobridge, from the parish of Northwood."

And whereas the provisions of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme, have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Lichfield.

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for altering the boundaries of the parishes of Saint Gabriel, Heaton, Newcastle-upon-Tyne; Long Benton; Walker; and Saint Mark, Byker, all in the diocese of Newcastle.

"Whereas we are satisfied that it is desirable that the boundaries of the said parishes should be altered in the manner hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the Right Reverend Noel, Bishop of Newcastle, consents to the proposed arrangements (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme).

"Now, therefore, we, the said Church Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme the boundaries of the

said parishes of Saint Gabriel, Heaton, Newcastle-upon-Tyne; Long Benton; Walker; and Saint Mark, Byker, shall be altered in the manner described in the Schedule and delineated on the map annexed to this Scheme.

"THE SCHEDULE.

"PART I.

"The territory to be annexed to the parish of Saint Gabriel, Heaton, Newcastle-upon-Tyne:—

"1. All that part (coloured pink on the map) of the parish of Long Benton which is bounded upon the south partly by the parish of Walker and partly by the parish of Saint Gabriel, Heaton, Newcastle-upon-Tyne, upon the south west by the last mentioned parish and upon the remaining sides by an imaginary line commencing at a point in the middle of Etherstone Avenue on the boundary which divides the parish of Saint Gabriel, Heaton, Newcastle-upon-Tyne, from the parish of Long Benton and extending thence northeastwards along the middle of Etherstone Avenue to its junction with Coach Lane and continuing thence first south and then north east along the middle of an unnamed road to the old tramway track (or waggon way) and thence southeastwards along the middle of the said tramway track to the middle of the main London to Edinburgh line of British Railways (North Eastern Region) and continuing thence southwestwards along the middle of the said railway to the boundary which divides the parish of Long Benton from the parish of Walker.

"2. All that part (coloured green on the map) of the parish of Walker which lies to the northwest of the main London to Edinburgh line of British Railways (North Eastern Region).

"3. All that part (coloured brown on the map) of the parish of Saint Mark, Byker, which lies to the northwest of the main London to Edinburgh line of British Railways (North Eastern Region).

"PART II.

"The territory to be annexed to the parish of Walker:—

"All that part (coloured purple on the map) of the parish of Saint Gabriel, Heaton, Newcastle-upon-Tyne, which lies to the southeast of the main London to Edinburgh line of British Railways (North Eastern Region)."

And whereas the provisions of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme, have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Newcastle.

WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 20th day of June, 1952, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, and of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners (Powers) Measure, 1938, and with the consent of the Right Reverend Arthur, Bishop of Bristol (in witness whereof he has signed this Scheme), have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for effecting the union of the benefice of Cricklade, Saint Sampson, the benefice of Cricklade, Saint Mary, and the benefice of Latton with Eisey, all situate in the diocese of Bristol.

"SCHEME

"1. *Union of Benefices and Parishes.* The said benefice of Cricklade, Saint Sampson, the said benefice of Cricklade, Saint Mary, and the said benefice

of Latton with Eisey, shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Cricklade with Latton' and, subject as hereinafter provided, the parishes of the said benefices of Cricklade, Saint Sampson, and Cricklade, Saint Mary, shall also be united into one parish for ecclesiastical purposes under the style of 'The United Parish of Cricklade,' and the parishes of the said benefice of Latton with Eisey, if not already united, shall also be united into one parish for ecclesiastical purposes under the style of 'The United Parish of Latton with Eisey'.

"2. *Taking effect of union.* Upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the Reverend Frederick Arthur Lovell, if he is then incumbent of the said benefice of Cricklade, Saint Mary, shall, with his consent (testified by his signature hereto) be the first incumbent of the united benefice.

"3. *Parish Churches.* The parish church of the parish of Saint Sampson, Cricklade, shall be the parish church of the united parish of Cricklade, and the parish church of the parish of Latton shall be the parish church of the united parish of Latton with Eisey.

"4. *Registers.* The marriage registers current at the Church of Saint Mary, Cricklade, shall be dealt with in accordance with Section 62 of the Marriage Act, 1949, and the register books (if any) of baptisms and burials and other the records and muniments deposited in the said church shall be transferred to the parish church of Saint Sampson, Cricklade.

"5. *Parsonage Houses.* The parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Cricklade, Saint Mary, shall be the house of residence of the incumbent of the united benefice, and the parsonage house belonging to the benefice of Cricklade, Saint Sampson, and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall, as soon as conveniently may be, be sold and disposed of by us, the said Church Commissioners, at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient, and the net proceeds of such sale shall constitute and form part of the Expenses Fund of the diocese of Bristol established pursuant to the said Measures.

"6. *Church of Saint Mary the Virgin, Eisey.* So soon as conveniently may be after the union has taken effect the church of Saint Mary the Virgin, Eisey, shall be taken down and the materials and site thereof, together with any ground annexed thereto and necessary for the use and enjoyment thereof shall be sold and disposed of by us, the said Church Commissioners, at such time or times, and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient subject to the conditions and restrictions imposed by the said Union of Benefices Measures and the net proceeds of such sale shall be appropriated to the said Expenses Fund.

"7. *Provision for a curate or clerical or lay assistance.*

"(a) Upon the union taking effect the incumbent shall employ a curate or such other clerical or lay assistance to assist him in performing the duties of the united benefice, as the Bishop of Bristol may from time to time direct.

"(b) A part of the endowments of the united benefice, namely an annual sum of £350, being part of a larger annual sum at present payable by us to the incumbent for the time being of the benefice of Cricklade, Saint Sampson, shall upon the union taking effect be appropriated by us as a fund towards the cost of providing such assistance as aforesaid, and the said fund shall be paid by us to the diocesan board of finance of the diocese as trustees to apply the same accordingly.

"8. *Patronage.* In every series of three successive turns of presentation to the united benefice after the union has taken effect the patron of the benefice of Cricklade, Saint Sampson, shall have the first turn, the patron of the benefice of Cricklade, Saint Mary, shall have the second turn, and the patron of the benefice of Latton with Eisey shall have the third turn.

"9. *Alteration of boundaries.* Upon the union taking effect and with the consents (testified by their signatures hereto) of the Reverend John Allen Harrison, being the incumbent of the benefice of Castle Eaton, and of the Reverend Canon Norman

Steward Willis, being the incumbent of the benefice of Purton, all that part of the parish of Eisey which is described in Part One of the schedule hereto shall be severed from that parish and from the united parish of Latton with Eisey and be annexed to the parish of Castle Eaton, and all that part of the parish of Saint Sampson, Cricklade, which is described in Part Two of the said schedule shall be severed from that parish and from the united parish of Cricklade and be annexed to the parish of Purton, in the said diocese of Bristol, and all those contiguous parts of the said parishes of Latton and Eisey which are described in Part Three of the schedule hereto shall be severed from those parishes and from the united parish of Latton with Eisey and be annexed to the said united parish of Cricklade.

"10. *Diversion of endowments.*

"(a) Upon the union taking effect:—

"(i) a part of the endowments of the united benefice, namely, such part of the money appropriated to the benefice of Cricklade, Saint Sampson, pursuant to the Tithe Act, 1936, and now held by us, the said Church Commissioners, as will produce an annual sum of £75, shall be severed or diverted from the said benefice and from the united benefice and shall be appropriated for the augmentation of the benefice of Castle Eaton, and

"(ii) a further part of the endowments of the united benefice, namely, such part of the money appropriated to the said benefice of Cricklade, Saint Sampson, pursuant to the Tithe Act, 1936, and now held by us, as will produce an annual sum of £20, shall be severed or diverted from the said benefice and from the united benefice and shall be transferred to and held by us, the said Church Commissioners, as part of and for the benefit of our General Fund and in consideration of the said transfer we shall make out of the said General Fund such periodical payments to the diocesan stipends fund of the diocese of Bristol as we from time to time determine to be equitable having regard to the value of the said endowments.

"(b) Upon the union taking effect or upon the cessation of an annual charge of £30 in favour of the Church of England Pensions Board in trust for the Reverend Owen Francis Bell, to which the revenues of the benefice of Cricklade, Saint Mary, are at present subject, whichever of the said events shall last occur, a further part of the endowments of the united benefice, namely, such part of the money appropriated to the said benefice of Cricklade, Saint Sampson, pursuant to the Tithe Act, 1936, as will produce an annual sum of £30 shall be severed or diverted from the said benefice and from the united benefice and shall be transferred to and held by us, the said Church Commissioners, as part of and for the benefit of our General Fund and in consideration of the said transfer we shall make out of the said General Fund such periodical payments to the said diocesan stipends fund of the diocese of Bristol as we from time to time determine to be equitable having regard to the value of the said endowments.

## " THE SCHEDULE

### " PART ONE

"The territory to be annexed to the parish of Castle Eaton:—

"All that part (coloured pink on the map annexed hereto) of the parish of Eisey which is bounded upon the southwest by the parish of Saint Sampson, Cricklade, upon the south by the parish of Broad Blunsdon, upon the east by the parish of Castle Eaton, upon the north by the parish of Marston Meysey and upon the remaining sides by an imaginary line commencing on the boundary which divides the parish of Eisey from the parish of Marston Meysey in the middle of the River Thames where the River Thames is joined by an unnamed stream and continuing thence first southwards and then westwards along the middle of the River Thames to the boundary which divides the parish of Eisey from the parish of Saint Sampson, Cricklade.

### " PART TWO

"The territory to be annexed to the parish of Purton:—

"All that part (coloured green on the map annexed hereto) of the parish of Saint Sampson,

Cricklade, which is bounded upon the west by the parish of Minety, upon the southwest by the parish of Charlton with Brokenborough, upon the south, east and the north in part by the parish of Purton, and upon the remaining side by an imaginary line commencing on the boundary which divides the parish of Saint Sampson, Cricklade, from the parish of Purton, in the middle of the main line of the British Railways (Western Region) at a distance of approximately 28 chains west of Black Dog Bridge, and continuing thence westwards along the middle of the said railway line to the boundary which divides the parish of Saint Sampson, Cricklade, from the parish of Minety.

"PART THREE

"The territory to be annexed to the united parish of Cricklade:—

"All those contiguous parts (together coloured brown on the map annexed hereto) of the parishes of Latton and Eisey which lie to the east of the middle of the road leading from Cricklade to Marston Meysey, but not including the area annexed to the parish of Castle Eaton under Part One of this Schedule."

And whereas the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, the Union of Benefices Rules, 1926 and 1930, and the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that it shall be and become effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette.

WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 18th day of September, 1952, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, and the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme which we have prepared with the consent of the Right Reverend Thomas, Bishop of Carlisle (in witness whereof he has signed the Scheme), for effecting the union of the benefice of Brough under Stainmore and the benefice of Stainmore, both situate in the diocese of Carlisle.

"SCHEME

"1. *Union of Benefices.* The Benefice of Brough under Stainmore and the benefice of Stainmore shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Brough with Stainmore' but the parishes of the said benefices shall continue in all respects distinct.

"2. *Taking effect of union.*

"(a) If upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the *London Gazette* the benefice of Stainmore shall be vacant the union shall forthwith take effect.

"(b) If upon that day the said benefice of Stainmore shall be full the union shall take effect immediately upon the next vacation thereof and the incumbent (if any) at the relevant date of the benefice of Brough under Stainmore shall be the first incumbent of the united benefice.

"3. *Parsonage House.* Upon the union taking effect the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Brough under Stainmore shall be the house of residence of the incumbent of the united benefice, and the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Stainmore and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith if it shall not have been sold or disposed of under the Parsonages Measure, 1938, before the taking effect of this union

or shall not at that time be in process of being disposed of under that Measure shall, as soon as conveniently may be, be sold and disposed of by us, the said Church Commissioners, at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient, and the net proceeds of such sale or sales shall be appropriated and held by us for the augmentation of the endowment of the united benefice.

"4. *Patronage.* After the union has taken effect in every series of three successive turns of presentation or nomination to be made to the united benefice the patron of the benefice of Brough under Stainmore shall have the first and second turns and the patron of the benefice of Stainmore shall have the third turn."

And whereas the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, the Union of Benefices Rules, 1926 and 1930, and the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that it shall be and become effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette.

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, and the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme which we have prepared with the consent of the Right Reverend Spencer, Bishop of Peterborough (in witness whereof he has signed the Scheme), for effecting the union of the benefice of Grendon and the benefice of Castle Ashby both situate in the diocese of Peterborough.

"SCHEME

"1. *Union of Benefices.* The benefice of Grendon and the benefice of Castle Ashby shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Grendon with Castle Ashby' but the parishes of the said benefices shall continue in all respects distinct.

"2. *Taking effect of union.* Upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the *London Gazette* the union shall forthwith take effect and the Reverend Wallace Harrison Cauldwell if he is then incumbent of the said benefice of Grendon shall with his consent (testified by his signature hereto) be the first incumbent of the united benefice.

"3. *Parsonage house.* (a) Upon the union taking effect and pending the provision at Grendon of a house approved by us as suitable to be the house of residence for the incumbent of the united benefice, the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Grendon shall be the house of residence for the incumbent of the united benefice.

"(b) Upon the union taking effect the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Castle Ashby, and, upon the provision at Grendon of a house as aforesaid, the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Grendon, and the sites and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us, the said Church Commissioners, at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient.

"(c) So much of the net proceeds of such sales as we after consulting with the Bishop for the time being of the diocese shall deem necessary shall be applied by us towards the cost of providing or acquiring at Grendon a house as aforesaid and any balance of the said net proceeds shall constitute and

form part of the Expenses Fund of the Diocese of Peterborough.

"All that small part of the parish of Whiston which is bounded on the northwest by the parish of Saint James, Clifton, on the southeast by the district of Saint Cuthbert, Herringthorpe, and on the southwest by the middle of Broom Road."

## "SCHEME.

"Whereas by an Order of His late Majesty King George the Fifth in Council dated the 3rd day of March, 1922, and published in the London Gazette on the 7th day of March, 1922, the benefice of Broadwoodwidger and the benefice of Germansweek were permanently united together to form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of the united benefice of Broadwoodwidger with Germansweek but the parishes of the said benefices continued distinct in all respects:

"And whereas the Bishop of the said diocese of Exeter has forwarded to us, the said Church Commissioners, provisional proposals pursuant to the said Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, recommending that the union of the said benefices should be dissolved, that the said benefice of Germansweek should be united to the benefice of Bratton Clovelly, and that the said benefice of Broadwoodwidger should be held in plurality with the benefice of Stowford which benefice is also situate in the said diocese of Exeter:

"And whereas effect can be given to the said proposals so far as they relate to the disunion of the united benefice of Broadwoodwidger with Germansweek and to the union of the benefices of Germansweek and Bratton Clovelly by Scheme prepared by us and confirmed by Order of Your Majesty in Council pursuant to the said Union of Benefices Measures and in so far as they relate to the said plurality by a subsequent Order made by the said Bishop pursuant to the said Pastoral Reorganisation Measure:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Church Commissioners, do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. *Disunion of the united benefice of Broadwoodwidger with Germansweek.*

"(1) The union of the benefice of Broadwoodwidger and the benefice of Germansweek in the said united benefice of Broadwoodwidger with Germansweek shall be dissolved and the said benefices of Broadwoodwidger and Germansweek shall thereupon each become a separate benefice with cure of souls within the limits of its separate parish.

"(2) The disunion of the said united benefice shall take effect upon the date when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette.

"(3) The endowments and property of the said united benefice shall be divided and distributed as follows, that is to say, a capital sum sufficient to produce £216 per annum upon the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme being part of a larger capital sum held by us, the said Church Commissioners, on behalf of the said united benefice shall be assigned and annexed to the benefice of Germansweek, and all other the endowments and property of the said united benefice shall be assigned and annexed to the benefice of Broadwoodwidger.

"2. *Union of the benefices of Germansweek and Bratton Clovelly.*

"(1) The benefice of Germansweek and the benefice of Bratton Clovelly shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Bratton Clovelly and Germansweek', which united benefice shall be in the Archdeaconry of Plymouth and the Rural Deanery of Tavistock but the parishes of the said benefices shall continue in all respects distinct.

"(2) The union shall take effect upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette and the Reverend William Herbert Graves if he is then incumbent of the said benefice of Bratton Clovelly shall with his consent (testified by his signature hereto), be the first incumbent of the united benefice.

"(3) The parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Bratton Clovelly shall be the house of residence of the incumbent of the united benefice.

"(4) Upon the union taking effect or upon the cessation of an annual charge of £193 in favour of the Church of England Pensions Board in trust for the Reverend Robert Kinninmouth Bennett, to which the revenues of the benefice of Bratton Clovelly are at present subject, whichever of the said events shall last occur, a part of the endowments of the united benefice, namely, a capital sum

sufficient to produce £193 per annum being a part of a larger capital sum at present held by us, the said Church Commissioners, for the benefit of the benefice of Bratton Clovelly shall be severed and diverted from the benefice of Bratton Clovelly and from the united benefice of Bratton Clovelly and Germansweek and shall be transferred to and be held by us, the said Church Commissioners, as part of and for the benefit of our General Fund and in consideration of the said transfer we shall make out of the said General Fund such periodical payments to the diocesan stipends fund of the diocese of Exeter as we from time to time determine to be equitable having regard to the value of the said endowments."

And whereas the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, the Union of Benefices Rules, 1926 and 1930, and the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that it shall be and become effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Neville, Bishop of Coventry, (in testimony whereof he has set his hand and affixed his episcopal seal to this Scheme) we, the said Church Commissioners, do humbly recommend and propose as follows, that is to say:—

1. *Constitution:*

"(a) As from the day of the date of the licence thereto of a minister, the area defined in the subjoined Schedule and delineated on the map hereto annexed shall be a separate district for spiritual purposes.

"(b) As from the date of the consecration of a church within the area approved by us, the said Church Commissioners, as suitable to be a parish church, or if the church is consecrated before such approval, the date of such approval, the said area shall become a new parish.

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the *Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936*, and the *Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949*, now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme which we have prepared with the consent of the Right Reverend *Thomas, Bishop of Carlisle* (in witness whereof he has signed the Scheme), for effecting the union of the benefice of *Staveley* and the benefice of *Kentmere* both situate in the diocese of *Carlisle*.

"SCHEME.

"1. *Union of Benefices.* The benefice of *Staveley* and the benefice of *Kentmere* shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of *Staveley with Kentmere*', but the parishes of the said benefices shall continue in all respects distinct.

"3. *Parsonage house.* Upon the union taking effect the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of *Staveley* shall be the house of residence of the incumbent of the united benefice, and the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of *Kentmere* and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith, if at the date when the union takes effect they have not already been sold under the provisions of the *Parsonages Measures, 1938 and 1947*, shall, as soon as conveniently may be, be sold and disposed of by the said Church Commissioners, at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient, and in either case the net proceeds of such sale or sales shall be applied by us as follows, that is to say:—

(a) so much of the net proceeds as after consultation with the bishop of the diocese we shall deem sufficient shall be applied towards the cost of the modernisation and improvement of the parsonage house of the united benefice in accordance with plans to be approved by us, and

(b) the balance (if any) shall be appropriated and held by us for the augmentation of the united benefice of *Staveley with Kentmere*."

The following Address was presented to The Queen on the occasion of the inauguration of the Claerwen Reservoir on Thursday, *October* 23rd, 1952:—

May it please Your Majesty:

To me as Lord Mayor of Birmingham falls the notable privilege and the great honour of offering to Your Majesty the glad and loyal welcome of this assembly and of the citizens of Birmingham.

We are all delighted that Your Majesty, accompanied by His Royal Highness the Duke of Edinburgh, has been able to journey to this Lakeland of Wales and to mark with your gracious presence the completion of this immense engineering work on the River Claerwen.

His late Majesty King Edward VII visited the Elan Valley in 1904 to inaugurate the original reservoirs of Birmingham's Welsh water undertaking. That scheme, approved by Parliament in 1892, involved the immediate formation of a chain of reservoirs in the Elan Valley and, looking then far into the future, contemplated the later erection of three more dams on the River Claerwen.

The steady growth of Birmingham and the ever-increasing water consumption have made it necessary for the City to provide the increased storage capacity so envisaged by the designers of the original scheme: but recent advances in engineering science have made possible the substitution of one large dam for the three smaller ones originally proposed.

The newly-formed reservoir has a capacity of over ten thousand million gallons—almost as much as the combined capacity of all the previously existing reservoirs. The dam contains 700,000 tons of material; and it will be no surprise to you, Ma'am, having just descended so many steps, to know that the height of the structure is 182 feet!

But no mere statistics could suffice to express our feelings on this great occasion; this enterprise, although physically remote from our City, is very near to our hearts, and our natural pride in its completion is immensely heightened by the supreme compliment of this visit by Your Majesty.

It is fitting, Ma'am, that on this occasion I should record with pleasure the happy collaboration which has existed between the Welsh authorities concerned and the Municipality of Birmingham, both in the construction of the works and in the preparations for the welcome of Your Majesty to-day.

The original Birmingham Welsh water scheme has, during two generations, earned nothing but praise for the vision and the technical skill of those responsible for its conception and execution. We of this day will trust that the Claerwen scheme may earn as kind a judgment from future generations.

Your Majesty, may I now, in the name of the City, invite you to perform the inauguration ceremony for the Claerwen Dam.

*To which Address Her Majesty was pleased to return the following gracious Reply:*

I am very glad, my Lord Mayor, to be here today with my husband to open this new reservoir, which marks the completion of the Waterworks inaugurated fifty years ago by my great grandfather.

I warmly congratulate all who have been concerned with the planning and execution of it. The formidable difficulties which confronted them have been surmounted by their ingenuity, technical skill and powers of organisation.

It is a real pleasure to have an opportunity—so early in my reign—of visiting such a beautiful part of the Principality, and to see that the natural beauty of these Welsh hills has not been impaired by this vast work of modern engineering. I am pleased to note that the facing of the dam has been built in South Wales granite, the stone of the district, which blends and harmonises with the surrounding country. I look forward to seeing the other lakes which form part of this enterprise, after the glimpse which I had of them as I drove here this morning.

These waterworks are a fine work of conservancy. In this age of engineering and science, a large part of the world's resources are used for transient ends or devoted to purposes of destruction. But here in the Elan Valley we see the reverse. A great volume of water, which otherwise would largely run to waste, has been harnessed to serve the everyday needs of men and women in their homes. Nothing could give me and my husband greater pleasure than the knowledge that people are able to live in good houses with an adequate supply of water. I welcome, therefore, this immense addition to the water storage of the City of Birmingham, the benefits of which, I understand, my Lord Mayor, you are ready to share with your neighbours in the Midlands. This scheme will not only enhance the health and well-being of the citizens of Birmingham, but also assist its diverse industries, so important both to our present defence programme and to our export trade.

I am glad to know of the close and cordial relations which exist between Birmingham and the Welsh authorities concerned and to think that this dam will form another link between the neighbouring counties of Brecon and Radnor. It is fitting that, in such a setting, I should be greeted by a choir of Welsh people and I greatly appreciate their singing.

I feel that it is also a happy coincidence that the City of Birmingham should be represented here in the person of its first citizen by a Welsh-speaking Welshman.

I thank you, my Lord Mayor, for the kind terms of your loyal welcome to myself and my husband. In declaring open the Claerwen Reservoir, I congratulate you and all concerned with it on the completion of this great undertaking and express my hearty good wishes for its successful operation.
