"2. Taking effect of union. Upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the Reverend Frederick Arthur Lovell, if he is then incumbent of the said benefice of Cricklade, Saint Mary, shall, with his con-sent (testified by his signature hereto) be the first incumbent of the united benefice.

"3. Parish Churches. The parish church of the parish of Saint Sampson, Cricklade, shall be the parish church of the united parish of Cricklade, and the parish church of the parish of Latton shall be the parish church of the united parish of Latton with Eisey.

"4. Registers. The marriage registers current at the Church of Saint Mary, Cricklade, shall be dealt with in accordance with Section 62 of the Marriage Act, 1949, and the register books (if any) of baptisms and burials and other the records and muniments deposited in the said church shall be transferred to the parish church of Saint Sampson, Cricklade.

"5. Parsonage Houses. The parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Cricklade, Saint Mary, shall be the house of residence of the in-cumbent of the united benefice, and the parsonage house belonging to the benefice of Cricklade, Saint Sampson, and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall as soon as conveniently may be be therewith shall, as soon as conveniently may be, be sold and disposed of by us, the said Church Com-missioners, at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient, and the net proceeds of such sale shall constitute and form part of the Expenses Fund of the diocese of Bristol established pursuant to the said Measures.

established pursuant to the said Measures. "6. Church of Saint Mary the Virgin, Eisey. So soon as conveniently may be after the union has taken effect the church of Saint Mary the Virgin, Eisey, shall be taken down and the materials and site thereof, together with any ground annexed there-to and necessary for the use and enjoyment thereof shall be sold and disposed of by us, the said Church Commissioners, at such time or times, and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient subject to the conditions and restrictions imposed by the said Union of Benefices Measures and the net proceeds of such sale shall be appropriated to the said Expenses Fund. said Expenses Fund.

"7. Provision for a curate or clerical or lay assistance.

- "(a) Upon the union taking effect the incumbent shall employ a curate or such other clerical or lay assistance to assist him in performing the duties of the united benefice, as the Bishop of Bristol may from time to time direct.
- "(b) A part of the endowments of the united benefice, namely an annual sum of £350, being part nce, namely an annual sum of £350, being part of a larger annual sum at present payable by us to the incumbent for the time being of the benefice of Cricklade, Saint Sampson, shall upon the union taking effect be appropriated by us as a fund towards the cost of providing such assist-ance as aforesaid, and the said fund shall be paid by us to the diocesan board of finance of the diocese as trustees to apply the same accordingly.

"8. Patronage. In every series of three successive turns of presentation to the united benefice after the union has taken effect the patron of the benefice of Cricklade, Saint Sampson, shall have the first turn, the patron of the benefice of Cricklade, Saint Mary, shall have the second turn, and the patron of the benefice of Latton with Eisey shall have the third turn turn

"9. Alteration of boundaries. Upon the union taking effect and with the consents (testified by their signatures hereto) of the Reverend John Allen Harrison, being the incumbent of the benefice of Castle Eaton, and of the Reverend Canon Norman

Steward Willis, being the incumbent of the benefice of Purton, all that part of the parish of Eisey which ot Purton, all that part of the parish of Eisey which is described in Part One of the schedule hereto shall be severed from that parish and from the united parish of Latton with Eisey and be annexed to the parish of Castle Eaton, and all that part of the parish of Saint Sampson, Cricklade, which is des-cribed in Part Two of the said schedule shall be severed from that parish and from the united parish of Cricklade and be annexed to the parish of Purton of Cricklade and be annexed to the parish of Purton, in the said diocese of Bristol, and all those contigu-ous parts of the said parishes of Latton and Eisey which are described in Part Three of the schedule hereito shall be severed from those parishes and from the united parish of Latton with Eisey and be annexed to the said united parish of Cricklade.
