"Whereas by an Order of His late Majesty King George the Fifth in Council dated the 3rd day of March, 1922, and published in the London Gazette on the 7th day of March, 1922, the benefice of Broadwoodwidger and the benefice of Germansweek were permanently united together to form one bene-fice with cure of souls under the style of the united benefice of Broadwoodwidger with Germansweek but the parishes of the said benefices continued distinct in all respects: "And whereas the Bishop of the crid "

in all respects: "And whereas the Bishop of the said diocese of Exeter has forwarded to us, the said Church Commissioners, provisional proposals pursuant to the said Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, re-commending that the union of the said benefices should be dissolved, that the said benefice of Bratton Clovelly, and that the said benefice of Broad-woodwidger should be held in plurality with the benefice of Stowford which benefice is also situate in the said diocese of Exeter: "And whereas effect can be given to the said proposals so far as they relate to the disunion of the united benefice of Broadwoodwidger with Germans-week and to the union of the benefices of Germans-week and Bratton Clovelly by Scheme prepared by

week and to the union of the benchees of Germans-week and Bratton Clovelly by Scheme prepared by us and confirmed by Order of Your Majesty in Council pursuant to the said Union of Benchees Measures and in so far as they relate to the said plurality by a subsequent Order made by the said Bishop pursuant to the said Pastoral Reorganisation Measure :

"Now, therefore, we, the said Church Commis-sioners, do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. Disunion of the united benefice of Broadwood-widger with Germansweek.
"(1) The union of the benefice of Broadwood-widger and the benefice of Germansweek in the said united benefice of Broadwoodwidger with Germansweek shall be dissolved and the said bene-fore of Broadwoodwidger with Germansweek shall be dissolved and the said benefice of Broadwoodwidger with fices of Broadwoodwidger and Germansweek shall thereupon each become a separate benefice with

(3) The endowments and property of the said united benefice shall be divided and distributed as follows, that is to say, a capital sum sufficient to produce £216 per annum upon the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme being part of a larger capital sum held by us, the said Church Commissioners, on behalf of the said united benefice shall be assigned and annexed to the benefice of Germansweek, and all other the endowments and property of the said united bene-fice shall be assigned and annexed to the benefice of Broadwoodwidger. of Broadwoodwidger.

"2. Union of the benefices of Germansweek and Bratton Clovelly. "(1) The benefice of Germansweek and the benefice of Bratton Clovelly shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Bratton Clovelly and Germansweek', which united benefice shall be in the Archdeaconry of Plymouth and the Rural Deanery of Tavistock but the parises of the said benefices shall continue in all respects distinct.

all respects distinct. (2) The union shall take effect upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette and the Reverend William Herbert Graves if he is then insumbant of the said benefice of if he is then incumbent of the said benefice of Bratton Clovelly shall with his consent (testified by his signature hereto), be the first incumbent of the

"(3) The parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Bratton Clovelly shall be the house of residence of the incumbent of the united benefice.

"(4) Upon the union taking effect or upon the cessation of an annual charge of £193 in favour of the Church of England Pensions Board in trust for the Reverend Robert Kinninmouth Bennett, to which the revenues of the benefice of Bratton Clovelly are at present subject, whichever of the said events shall last occur, a part of the endow-ments of the united benefice, namely, a capital sum

sufficient to produce £193 per annum being a part sufficient to produce £193 per annum being a part of a larger capital sum at present held by us, the said Church Commissioners, for the benefit of the benefice of Bratton Clovelly shall be severed and diverted from the benefice of Bratton Clovelly and form the united benefice of Bratton Clovelly and Germansweek and shall be transferred to and be held by us, the said Church Commissioners, as part of and for the benefit of our General Fund and in consideration of the said transfer we shall make out of the said General Fund such periodical payments to the diocesan stipends fund periodical payments to the diocesan stipends fund of the diocese of Exeter as we from time to time determine to be equitable having regard to the value of the said endowments."

And whereas the provisions of the Union of Bene-fices Measures, 1923 to 1936, the Union of Benefices Rules, 1926 and 1930, and the Pastoral Reorganisa-tion Measure, 1949, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that it shall be and become effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette.

WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 1st day of October, 1952, in the words and figures following, that is to

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pur-suance of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, have prepared and humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for constituting a new parish to be taken out of the parishes of Saint Nicholas, Radford, and Saint Luke, Holbrooks, in the diocese of Coventry.

" SCHEME.

"Whereas we, the Church Commissioners, are satis-fied that the spiritual interests of the area defined in the subjoined Schedule and delineated on the map hereto annexed would be best served by constituting it a new parish: "And whereas we are satisfied that a suitable

"And whereas we are satisfied that a suitable endowment therefor will be provided: "And whereas we have not approved any con-secrated church within the area as suitable to be the parish church of the new parish: "Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Neville, Bishop of Coventry, (in testimony whereof he has set his hand and affixed his episcopal seal to this Scheme) we, the said Church Commis-sioners, do humbly recommend and propose as follows, that is to say:—

1. Constitution :

"(a) As from the day of the date of the licence thereto of a minister, the area defined in the sub-joined Schedule and delineated on the map hereto annexed shall be a separate district for spiritual

annexed shall be a separate district for spiritual purposes. "(b) As from the date of the consecration of a church within the area approved by us, the said Church Commissioners, as suitable to be a parish church, or if the church is consecrated before such approval, the date of such approval, the said area shall become a new parish. "(c) The name of the district (or parish as the case may be) shall be 'The District (or Parish) of Saint Francis of Assisi, North Radford, Coventry'.

2. Archdeaconry and Rural Deanery: "The parish shall be in the Archdeaconry of Coventry and in the rural deanery of Coventry.

" THE SCHEDULE.

"The area comprising:-"All those contiguous portions of the parishes of Saint Nicholas Radford and Saint Luke Hol-brooks (together coloured pink on the map) which taken together are bounded upon the west by the
