

COIN OF MIXED METAL.

Three-pence—Every three-pence of mixed metal shall have for the obverse impression Our aforesaid effigy with the inscription "ELIZABETH II DEI GRA: BRITT: OMN: REGINA F: D:" and for the reverse a Portcullis with chains, ensigned with a royal coronet, being a Badge of Our Royal Predecessor King Henry VII, with the date of the year between the words "THREE" and "PENNY". The coin shall have a plain edge having twelve sides.

BRONZE COINS.

(1) Penny—Every bronze penny shall have for the obverse impression Our aforesaid effigy with the inscription "ELIZABETH II DEI GRA: BRITT: OMN: REGINA F: D:" and for the reverse the figure of Britannia seated on a rock surrounded by the sea, her right hand holding a shield which rests against the rock, while in her left hand she grasps a trident, with a Lighthouse in the distance; and the words "ONE PENNY", with the date of the year. The coin shall have a plain edge.

(2) Half-penny—Every half-penny shall have the same obverse impression and inscription as the penny, and for the reverse the representation of a sailing ship, and the words "HALF PENNY" with the date of the year. The coin shall have a plain edge.

(3) Farthing—Every farthing shall have the same obverse impression and inscription as the penny, and for the reverse the representation of a Wren, and the word "FARTHING" with the date of the year. The coin shall have a plain edge.

This Proclamation shall come into force on the first day of January One thousand nine hundred and fifty three.

Given at Our Court at Buckingham Palace, this Twenty-fifth day of November, in the year of Our Lord one thousand nine hundred and fifty two, and in the First year of Our Reign.

The QUEEN has been graciously pleased on the advice of Her Majesty's Canadian Ministers, to approve the undermentioned award of the George Medal.

Awarded the George Medal:—

William Ronald DEADMAN, Police Constable, Toronto City Police Department, Toronto, Ontario.

A series of armed robberies on drug stores in the City of Toronto caused the authorities to station Police Officers inside certain stores.

Constable Deadman was stationed behind a dispensary partition at the rear of a store, when two men, armed with guns, entered and menaced the proprietor. The Constable rushed from behind the partition and called on the men to surrender. One of the men ran into the street but the other fired a shot at the Police Constable which struck his

shoulder. The man tried to make for the door but Deadman, although wounded and unarmed, closed with him.

In the ensuing struggle, the gunman fired further shots which seriously wounded the officer, but Deadman eventually succeeded in wresting the gun away from the man. On the point of collapse the Constable fired the remaining shot at the gunman, wounding him fatally.

Police Constable Deadman acted courageously and promptly and took no account of the risk to himself.
