THE EARL MARSHAL'S REGULATIONS CON-CERNING THE ALTERNATIVE DRESS TO BE WORN BY VISCOUNTESSES AND BARONESSES AT THE CORONATION OF HER MAJESTY, QUEEN ELIZABETH II.

Viscountesses and Baronesses who are not in possession of Robes of State and coronets together with kirtles and Coronation dress may wear the following:—

A Robe of Crimson velvet, trimmed with miniver pure, two inches in width, similar in style to a Kirtle, but without sleeves and with the addition of a cape also of miniver pure and shaped like a cape collar, finishing in two points in front at the waist. The Cape is to have rows or bars of ermine tails (or the like) as follows:—

A Baroness-two rows of ermine tails.

A Viscountess-two rows and a half of ermine tails.

The robe fits the waist and is open above and below the waist to show the dress which should be of white or cream coloured material with brocading or embroidery of gold or silver and have no colour. The hemline of the robe has two deep scallops which form a train eighteen inches in length on the ground.

Viscountesses and Baronesses who are not in possession of Coronets may wear as an alternative a crimson velvet cap enriched with narrow gold braid and bordered with a narrow strip of white fur. The cap should be made to fit the crown of the head and should have a gold or gold coloured tassel or other similar decoration which may consist of a knot of gold braid ending in drop pearls.

THE EARL MARSHAL'S REGULATIONS FOR THE HEAD COVERING TO BE WORN BY LADIES AT THE CORONATION OF HER MAJESTY QUEEN ELIZABETH II.

Ladies attending the coronation wearing afternoon dress must wear a head covering. This must not cover the face but should be in the form of a veil falling from the crown or the back of the head as far as the shoulders but not lower than the waistline. Any colour excepting black can be used and should be made in a suitably light material such as tulle, chiffon, organza or lace, and may be attached by a comb, jewelled pins, flowers or ribbon bows, but not with feathers.

Ladies attending in evening dress may wear a tiara or a similar head covering to that laid down for Ladies in afternoon dress.

The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that they have made an Order under section 9 (4) of the Finance Act, 1952, entitled the Purchase Tax (No. 8) Order, 1952. This Order brings furniture within the scope of the "D" scheme established by section nine of the Finance Act, 1952. It sets out in the Schedule the prescribed list of furniture eligible for "D relief". The figures appearing in the last column of the Schedule represent the amounts which are to be deducted from the Wholesale value for purchase tax purposes of the goods to which they apply. Tax is accordingly chargeable at the appropriate rate on the value (if any) remaining after the deduction. The Order automatically brings into operation that part of section eight of the Finance Act, 1952, which abolishes the exemption from purchase tax of utility furniture and component parts thereof. The Order which comes into operation on the
