"4. The name of the district (or parish as the case may be) shall be 'The District (or Parish) of Saint Michael, Lynworth.'

"5. The district (or parish) shall be in the arch-deaconry and rural deanery of Cheltenham.

"The territory to be annexed to the parish of

"All that part of the parish of All Saints, Pittville (coloured green on the map annexed hereto) which is bounded upon the north east by the parish of Prestbury and upon the remaining sides by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the parish of Prestbury from the parish of All Saints, Pittville, on the wall or fence between Numbers 13 Pennine Road and 190 Priors Road and continuing thence southwards along the walls or fences at the rear of the houses and premises known as Numbers 190-164 Priors Road to the point at which it poins the footpath leading from Dart Road to Priors Road and continuing thence eastwards along the middle of the said footpath and then in the rriors koad and continuing thence eastwards along the middle of the said footpath and then in the same direction to the middle of Priors Road and thence southwards along the middle of Priors Road to the point where it is joined by Bouncer's Lane and continuing thence northwards along the middle of Bouncer's Lane to the boundary which divides the parish of All Saints, Pittville, from the parish of Prestbury.

"The area comprising:

"All those contiguous parts of the parishes of All Saints, Pittville, and Prestbury (coloured pink on the map annexed hereto) which, taken together, are bounded upon the northwest by the Parish of Holy Trinity, Cheltenham, upon part of the northeast by the parish of Prestbury and generally upon the north by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the generally upon the north by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the parish of All Saints, Pittville, from the parish of Prestbury, in the middle of Wyman's Brook apposite the southwestern end of the wall or fence at the rear of the house and premises known as Number 123 Prestbury Road, and continuing thence northeastwards along the walls or fences at the rear of the houses and premises known as Numbers 123-139 Prestbury Road and thence in a straight line across Cromwell Road to the southstraight line across Cromwell Road to the south-western end of the wall or fence at the rear of the western end of the wall or fence at the rear of the house and premises known as Number 145 Prestbury Road and continuing thence generally north-eastwards along the walls or fences at the rear of the houses and premises known as Numbers 145 to 231 Prestbury Road and continuing thence southeastwards along the wall or fence on the western side of the field or paddock at the rear of the houses and premises known as Numbers 233 and 235 Prestbury Road and northeastwards along the walls or fences on the southern side along the walls or fences on the southern side of the last mentioned field or paddock and in the same straight line to a point on the wall or fence on the southwestern side of the field or paddock at the rear of the houses and premises known as Numbers 18-26 Coronation Road and continuing thence southeastwards along the last mentioned wall or fence and northeastwards along the wall or fence on the southeastern side of the last mentioned field or paddock to a point on the wall or fence at the rear of the house and premises known as Number 26 Coronation Road and continuing thence southeastwards along the last mentioned wall or fence and along the walls or fences at the rear of the houses and premises known as Numbers 28-34 Coronation Road and continuing thence northeastwards along the wall or fence on the southeastern side of the last mentioned house and premises and of the house and premises known and premises and of the house and premises known as Number 21 Coronation Road (thereby crossing the southern end of Coronation Road) to a point on the wall or fence at the rear of the house and premises known as Number 52 Pennine Road and continuing thence southwards along the last mentioned wall or fence and along the walls or fences at the rear of the houses and premises known as Numbers 50-32 Pennine Road and in the same straight line to the northern end of the walls or fences at the rear of the houses and premises known as Numbers 28 to 18 Pennine Road (thereby crossing Cotswold Road) and continuing

thence southwards along the last mentioned walls or fences and in the same straight line to a point opposite their southern end in the middle of Cromwell Road and continuing thence eastwards along the middle of Cromwell Road to a point where it crosses the middle of Pennine Road and continuing thence southwards along the middle of Pennine Road to a point opposite the wall or fence between the houses and premises known as Number 149 Cromwell Road and Number 19 Pennine Road and continuing thence eastwards along the said wall or fence to a point on the wall or fence at the rear of the house and premises known as Number 198 Priors Road and continuing thence southwards along the last mentioned wall or fence and along the walls or fences at the rear thence southwards along the last mentioned wall or fence and along the walls or fences at the rear of the houses and premises known as Numbers 198-164 Priors Road (thereby crossing the boundary which divides the parish of Prestbury from the parish of All Saints, Pittville) to a point opposite their southern end in the middle of the footpath leading from Dart Road to Priors Road and continuing thence along the middle of the said footpath and then in the same direction to a point in the middle of Priors Road and continuing thence southwards along the middle of Priors Road to the point where it is joined by Bouncer's Lane and continuing thence along the middle of Bouncer's Lane to the boundary which divides the parish of Prestbury from the parish of All Saints, Pittville, and continuing thence southeastwards along the last mentioned boundary to a point where it meets the boundary which divides the parish of All Saints, Pittville, from the parish of Charlton Kings and continuing thence generally westwards along the boundary which divides the parish of All Saints, Pittville, from the parishes of Charlton Kings; Holy Apostles, Charlton Kings; and Saint John, Cheltenham, to a point in the middle of Hewlett Road opposite to the middle of Cleeveview Road and Apostles, Charlton Kings; and Saint John, Cheltenham, to a point in the middle of Hewlett Road opposite to the middle of Cleeveview Road and continuing thence northwards along the middle of Cleeveview Road to a point opposite to the middle of Whaddon Road and continuing first to and then northwestwards along the middles first of Whaddon Road and then of Whaddon Lane and in the same straight line to the boundary which divides the parish of All Saints, Pittville, from the parish of Holy Trinity, Cheltenham."
