HE Provisions which had been got together at Fiume, and other Ports in the Adriatick Sea, for the Service of the Emperor's Forces, are brought fafe to the Imperial Magazine at Mezzola, although the French had a Ship of Sixty Guns, and some other Frigats of less Force, cruizing before the Mouth of the Po to prevent it. The Marquis Davia, who was with Major-General Fiscont in the Action at Scravalla, is returned to the Imperial Camp by the way of Florence; and by the Account he gives of it, the Loss which the Germans sustained was inconsiderable. The French and Spanish Forces are preparing to go into Winter Quarters: It is said they have cut the Banks of the River Suchia, and overflowed the neighbouring Country, in order to incommode the German Army, which is in motion, with intent to advance towards the Parmefan, or, as some believe, to enter into the Countries of Ferrere and Bologna.

The Count de Reising went from Vienna, Dec. 5. hence the 21st past for Italy with a considerable Sum, part in ready Money, and the rest in Bills of Exchange, for the Service of the Imperial Army in that Country; and it is hoped they will either fend more Reinforcements to the Duke of Savoy, or make a powerful Diversion to the Enemy's Troops in his favour. Our Letters from thence give an Account of Major-General Visconti's having joined 5000 of the Duke of Sa-voy's Forces. commanded by the Marquis de Parella, at Caio, a little beyond Savona. He took his way along the Sea Coast, being the only Passage which the French had not secured, and marched 70 Italian Miles in 3 days time, so that he arrived at Cairo the 20th. The Enemy had sent a Body of 3500 Men to intercept him, but his great Diligence prevented them, and they came three hours too late. The Count de Tarini, Envoy Extraordinary of Savoy, is returned home, with Affurances from the Emperor to the Duke his Master of all the Encouragement and Assistance that can be afforded him from hence. Letters from Hungary fay, That on the 6th past the Count de Schlick marched from Leventz, with his own Regiment of Dragoons, the Regiment of Cuirassiers of La Tour, 500 Imperial Foot, and 600 Hussass, towards Alrzell, one of the 4 Towns in those Mountains called the Bergliaede, where the Emperor's Mines are. The Rebels, upon his Approach, abandoned Alrzell, the Chief of those Towns, and which serves to seture the rest, and he took Possession of it rhe 10th. The 13th, hearing some of the Rebels were not together near theirs, he marched this Rebels were got together near Jetims, he marched thi-ther to attack them; but as foon as he came in fight, they fied in great Confusion. The 15th, he went with a Guard of 300 Horse to receive the Homage of the Inhabitants of North to the Wild he was absent Inhabitants of Newfoll; but whilft he was absent, Brizeni, with 18 or 20000 Rebels, surrounded the German in Alizad, who fought their way through with great Resolution, and killed 1200 of the Rebels on the place; However the Count de Schlick, finding his Troops too few 10 oppose them in the open Field, has posted himself at Ziret, bekind the Wang, to secure that River, till such time as he shall be joined by Colonel firmat, who is marching with 1800 Men to his Af-filtance, and will shortly be followed by the Danish Forces in the Emperor's Service, whereof part are in Tirol, and the reft at Paffan. Our Advices from Tirol fay, That General Heifter being informed that the Court d'arco was muching with a considerable Body

of Bavarian Forces to the Relief of the Fortress of Kaffireyn, thought fit to raise the Siege of that Place; fince which the Baron of Seafelds, Governor thereof, being marched out with 700 Men, and two Field pieces; to drive the Imperialists from some Posts which they had fortified near Kutzbutiel, he was surprised in a narrow Pass by 150 Imperial Dragoons, who killed 200 of his Men on the spor, and rook as many Prifoners, with his two Pieces of Cannon; The Baron de Scafeidt himself was wounded and taken, and sent with the rest of the Prisoners to Rothimberg. The Garison of Amberg, in the Upper Palatinate consisting of 2500 Men, has surrendred to General Horbeville, and was allowed to march out of the Place, the Officers having given their Parole that the Elector their Master will let at

Liberty, by way of Exchange, as many of the Imperialists that are Prisoners in his Camp.

Bern, Dec. 6. There is Advice from Piedmont, That the Marquis de Parella, who was advanced with a Body of the Duke of Savoy's Forces towards the Frontiers of the State of Genoua, to join with the Detachment of Imperial Forces commanded by Major-General Visconti, met with a French Body of 1000 Foot, and as many Horse, that had been sent out by the Duke of Vendosme to intercept the Germans, and entirely defeated the Enemy, many of whom were killed on the spor. The Forces under Major-General Visconti are gone into Quarters of Refreshment at Pignerol. The Marshal de Tesse continues at Chamberry with the French Forces under his Command, confisting of 3000 Men; and the Marshall School of Section 18 Command of Section 18 Com the Marquis de Saler, who commands the Duke of Sa-wy's Forces on that fide, is at Ayguibelle, and has so well secured the Passes into the Countries of Taxinia and Morienne, that the French will hardly be able to make any further Impression on that side.
