ELIZABETH THE SECOND by the Grace of God of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas Queen, Defender of the Faith, to Our Trusty and Well-beloved Sir Thomas Innes of Learney, Knight Commander of Our Royal Victorian Order, Advocate, Our Lyon King of Arms,

GREETING!

Our Will and Pleasure is and We do hereby declare and ordain that Our Most Dearly Beloved Husband His Royal Highness Philip, Duke of Edinburgh, Knight of Our Most Noble Order of the Garter, Knight of Our Most Ancient and Most Noble Order of the Thistle, Commander in Our Royal Navy, shall henceforth upon all occasions and in all Meetings except where otherwise provided by Act of Parliament have hold and enjoy Place, Pre-eminence and Precedence next to Our Royal Person: And Our further Will and Pleasure is that you Our Lyon King of Arms to whom the cognizance of matters of this nature in Scotland doth properly belong do see this Order observed and kept and do cause the same to be recorded in the Lyon Office in Edinburgh and to the end that Our Officers of Arms there and all others upon occasion may take due notice and have knowledge thereof; And for so doing this shall be your Warrant.

Given at Our Court at St. James's the twenty-second day of December, 1952, in the first year of Our Reign.
