### EXPLANATORY NOTE.

These Regulations provide that the rates of em-ployers' contributions payable by employers in respect of mariners employed on foreign-going British ships who are not domiciled and have no place of residence in the United Kingdom shall be three-fifths of the rate of contribution payable in respect of other mariners. They also empower the Minister to refund

to the employer an amount not exceeding the amount of such contributions paid by him, in certain cases where the employer has been obliged to pay computsory contributions in respect of the same mariner for the same period under the legislation of a country other than Great Britain.
