THE POULTON-LE-FYLDE URBAN DISTRICT (FOOD) ORDER, 1953.

- 4. The council of the urban district shall forthwith cause a statement of the effect of this Order and of the place where a copy may be inspected to be published in the London Gazette and in some newspaper circulating within the urban district.

COAST PROTECTION ACT, 1949.
