The Old Metal Dealers Order, 1953.

Made - - - 12th January, 1953.

1. In pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by section three of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1907, I do by this Order on an application made to me by each of the councils of the boroughs, urban districts and rural districts named in the Schedule to this Order declare section eighty-six of the said Act (which relates to dealers in old metal and marine stores) to be in force in each of those boroughs, urban districts and rural districts.

2. In pursuance of the said powers, I direct that each of the said councils shall within three weeks from the date of this Order cause a copy thereof and of so much of the Schedule thereto as relates to their borough or district to be published in two or more local newspapers circulating in the borough or district.

3. This Order may be cited as the Old Metal Dealers Order, 1953.

BASILDON DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION.

Site for Fryerns Secondary Technical School
Compulsory Purchase Order, 1953.

NOTICE is hereby given that the Basildon Development Corporation in pursuance of their powers under section 4 of the New Towns Act, 1946, on the 16th day of January, 1953, made an Order which has been submitted for confirmation by the Minister of Housing and Local Government authorising them to purchase compulsorily for the purposes of the New Town of Basildon (or incidental thereto) the lands and properties described in the Schedule hereto, being lands and properties within the area designated by the Basildon New Town (Designation) Order, 1949.

A copy of the Order, and of the map referred to therein, have been deposited at the offices of the Corporation at Gifford House, London Road, Bowers Gifford, Basildon, Essex, and will be open for inspection without payment of fee between the hours of 9.30 a.m. and 5 p.m. on Monday to Friday.

Any objection to the Order must be made in writing, stating the grounds of the objection, and addressed to the Minister of Housing and Local Government, Whitehall, London, S.W.1, before the 23rd day of February, 1953.

The Minister is not, in all cases, required to arrange for objections to be heard by a person appointed by him for that purpose. It is important therefore, that an objection should include a full statement in writing of the grounds on which the objection is made as the objector may have no further opportunity to make such a statement.

Any owner or occupier of any land or property to which the Order relates may send to the Basildon Development Corporation at the address below, a request in writing to serve him with a notice that the Order has been confirmed, and naming the place where a copy of the Order and of the map and of any descriptive matter annexed thereto, may be seen. Such request should contain a statement of the name, postal address and the interest in the land or property of the owner or occupier, and particulars sufficient to enable the extent and boundaries of the land to be identified.
