REGULATIONS FOR RECRUITMENT TO THE CLERICAL ASSISTANT, MACHINE OPERATOR, AND DUPLICATOR OPERATOR CLASSES IN THE HOME CIVIL SERVICE IN LONDON AND THE GREATER LONDON AREA.

Recruitment under these Regulations restricted to women and girls.

2. Age

Candidates must be at least 15 years of age on the date of application and under 20 years of age on 1st March, 1953.

3. Nationality

Candidates must be British subjects. They must also satisfy one of the following conditions:—

(a) If natural-born British subjects, they must

either

(i) have at least one parent who is or was at

death a British subject; or

(ii) have resided in Her Majesty's dominions
and/or been employed elsewhere in the service
of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

appointment.

(b) If naturalised British subjects, they must have resided in Her Majesty's dominions, and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

(c) If not qualified under (a) or (b) of this paragraph they must satisfy the Commissioners that they are so closely connected with Her Majesty's dominions either by ancestry, upbringing or residence, or by reason of national service, that an exception may properly be made in their favour. favour.

4. Health and Character
Successful candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners as to their health and character.

5. Examination

The examination will consist of tests in common

sense, accuracy, and simple arithmetic.

Candidates will be required to reach such a standard in these tests as to satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners.

6. Candidates upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate central education authority (e.g., the Ministry of Education, the Scottish Education Department, the Ministry of Education for Northern Ireland) has been notified to the Commissioners.

7. A candidate may apply to be considered under these regulations for more than one grade at the same examination. Every candidate must state on her Application Form for which grade or grades she wants to be considered.

8. Assignment Assignments will be made by the Civil Service Commissioners in accordance with the needs of the public service. Successful candidates who are unable to take up the appointment offered to them cannot be maintained on the waiting list or offered an alternative post unless in exceptional circum-stances and at the discretion of the Commissioners.

No fee is payable until the candidate is successful, but a successful candidate will pay a fee of 10s, before the issue of a certificate of qualification for appointment.

The Civil Service Commissioners further give notice that examinations will be held at intervals in

1953 under the above Regulations.

Applications on the prescribed form, which may be obtained from the Secretary of the Civil Service Commission, can be accepted from 1st January, 1953, until further notice.
