RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL OF CHANCTONBURY.

Chanctonbury (Storrington—Hormare Farm) Diversion Order, 1953.

NOTICE is hereby given that the above Order was made on the 3rd day of February, 1953, and is about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation.

The Order relates to land to the north of the Storrington—Pulborough Road (A.283) situate at Hormare Farm in the Parish of Storrington in the Administrative County of West Sussex.

The effect of the Order will be to divert the existing public right of way as described in "A" below to the line and route described in "B" below.

A.

The existing public right of way as shown and delineated coloured brown commencing from the south eastern boundary of Ordnance Parcel numbered 134, by the footbridge leading from the Spierbridge Council Housing Estate at a point marked A and proceeding north west for a distance of approximately 660 yards diagonally across Ordnance Parcels numbered 134, 154a, 154 and 131 (Ordnance Survey Sheet Sussex (West) XXXVI/16 (Edition of 1937)) to a point marked B on the western boundary of the above-mentioned Ordnance Parcel numbered 131 where the said public right of way joins Hurston Lane which said point B is approximately 673 yards north of the junction of Hurston Lane with the Storrington—Pulborough Road (A.283).

B.

Commencing at point marked C (which is identical to point marked A referred to above on the existing public right of way) and proceeding north-north-west along an existing public right of way for a distance of approximately 160 yards to

a point marked D thence in a westerly direction across Ordnance Parcels numbered 134, 154a, 154 and 155 (Ordnance Survey Sheet Sussex (West) XXXVI/16 (Edition of 1937)) along a new public right of way for a distance of approximately 496 yards direct to Hurston Lane to a point marked E thence north along Hurston Lane for a distance of approximately 288 yards to a point marked F (which is identical to point marked B referred to above on the existing public right of way) such length of footpath as between points D to E to have a width of 8 feet and the whole route as between points marked C to F inclusive shown and delineated coloured purple.

A certified copy of the Order and of the map contained in the Order has been deposited at the offices of the Rural District Council of Chanctonbury, Church Street, Storrington, Pulborough, and will be open for inspection free of charge, between the hours of 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. and 2 p.m. to 5 p.m. Mondays to Fridays inclusive and 9 a.m. to 12.30 p.m. on Saturdays.

Any objection or representation with reference to this Order may be sent in writing to the Secretary, Ministry of Housing and Local Government, Whitehall, London, S.W.1, before the 11th day of March, 1953, and any such objection or representation should state the grounds on which it is made.

RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL OF CHANCTONBURY.

Chanctonbury (West Chiltington—New House Farm) Diversion Order, 1953.

NOTICE is hereby given that the above Order was made on the 3rd day of February, 1953, and is about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation.

The Order relates to land situate at New House Farm in the parish of West Chiltington in the Administrative County of West Sussex.

The effect of the Order will be to divert the existing public right of way as described in "A" below to the line and route described in "B" below.

A.

The existing public right of way as shown and delineated coloured brown commencing at a point marked A at the north-east corner of Ordnance Parcel Number 654 and to the east of New House Farm (Ordnance Survey Sheet Sussex (West) XXXVI/8 Edition of 1911) and proceeding in a south-westerly and westerly direction and south of New House Farm for a distance of approximately 500 feet to its junction with a public right of way running north to south immediately to the west of New House Farm at a point marked B.

B.

Commencing on the eastern side of New House Farm at point marked C (which is identical to point marked A referred to above on the existing public right of way) and proceeding in a westerly direction over Ordnance Parcel 630 for a distance of approximately 260 feet and thence on the southern side of Ordnance Parcel 618 for a distance of 200 feet to its junction with the public right of way running from north to south (referred to in A above), on the eastern side of Ordnance Parcel Number 616 (Ordnance Survey Sheet Sussex (West) XXXVI/8 Edition of 1911) at a point marked D thence south for a distance of approximately 100 feet to a point marked E (which is identical to point marked B referred to above on the existing public right of way) such public right of way as between points marked C to D to have a width of six feet, and the whole route as between points marked C to E inclusive shown and delineated coloured purple.
