

**NATIONAL PARKS AND ACCESS TO THE

MALVERN URBAN DISTRICT COUNCIL.

*Malvern Urban District Council (Malvern Link
No. 1) Diversion Order, 1951.*

NOTICE is hereby given that on the 19th day of January, 1953, the Minister of Housing and Local Government confirmed, with modifications, the above Order.

The Order relates to land situate in the Parish of Malvern Link. The effect of the Order is—

(1) To divert part of the public right of way running from Lower Howsell Road (near to its junction with Church Road) to Worcester Road (near to Newland Corner) from the point at which the footpath crosses the stream north of "The School" Playing Field (O.S. No. 82), in a north-easterly direction for a distance of approximately 670 yards to the point at which a further footpath from Worcester Road (at a point south of the premises of the Alexandra Stone Company) joins the main footpath referred to, so that the line of the footpath shall follow the northern bank of the stream in an easterly direction for a distance of approximately 90 yards, at which point it will give access to a new housing estate being developed by the Malvern Urban District Council and will continue in a south-easterly direction for approximately 70 yards and in a northerly direction for approximately 570 yards; joining an existing field footpath, it will proceed in an easterly direction for approximately 90 yards over this existing footpath to the junction of the two footpaths from Worcester Road, previously referred to.

(2) To divert a short length of footpath leading from Lower Howsell Road (north of the property known as Summerfield) from a point approximately 250 yards west of the point at which it joins the public right of way previously referred to, to a line following an existing footpath in a southerly direction for approximately 120 yards to the point of commencement of the main diversion previously referred to, whence it will follow the line of the main diversion.

A certified copy of the Order and of the Map contained in the Order, as confirmed by the Minister, has been deposited at the offices of the Malvern Urban District Council, at The Council House, Malvern, and will be open for inspection, free of charge, between the hours of 9 a.m. and 1 p.m. and 2.30 p.m. and 5.30 p.m., from Mondays to Fridays, and between the hours of 9 a.m. and 12 noon on Saturdays.

The Order becomes operative as from the 16th day of February, 1953, but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof, or of any provision contained therein, on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act, 1949, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act, or any Regulation made thereunder, has not been complied with in relation to the approval of the Order, he may, within six weeks from the date of publication of this Notice, make application to the High Court.
