WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 30th day of January, 1953, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for altering the name of the parish of Saint Mary, Wolverton, in the diocese of Oxford.

" SCHEME

"Whereas by an Order of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria in Council dated the 29th November, 1870, and published in the London Gazette on the same day, a consolidated chapelry was assigned to the consecrated church of Saint Mary, Wolverton, within the parish of Wolverton in the said diocese of Oxford under the name of 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Mary, Wolverton':

"And whereas the said consolidated chapelry has since become a parish under the same name:

"And whereas it has been represented to us, the said Church Commissioners and it appears to us that the name of the said parish should be altered as hereinafter recommended and proposed:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Church Commissioners, with the consent of the Right Reverend Kenneth, Bishop of Oxford (in testimony whereof he has hereunto set his hand) and with the consent of the parochial church council of the said parish (in testimony whereof this Scheme is signed by the Chairman of and two other members present at a meeting of the same council duly convened for the purpose of giving such consent) humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty in Council that as from the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme the name of the said parish shall be altered to 'The Parish of Saint Mary the Virgin, Stony Stratford'."

And whereas the provisions of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme, have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved

by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Oxford.

during the month of March a certificate of origin is required and during the period 1st April to 15th October a Form A Certificate is required.

The General Licence relaxes for the month of March, 1953, the requirements of the above Order relating to the importation of lettuce from France south of Latitude 46° N by permitting a certificate of origin to be given instead of the Form A Certificate specified in the Importation of Plants Order of 1947.
