CANTERBURY CONSTITUENCY.

WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 30th day of January, 1953, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

Leslie Montagu Thomas Esquire, in the place of John Baker White Esquire, who since his election for the said Constituency hath accepted the Office of Steward or Bailiff of Her Majesty's Manor of Northstead in Her Majesty's County of York.

“We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for altering the name of the parish of Saint Mary, Wolverton, in the diocese of Oxford.

“**SCHEME**

“Whereas by an Order of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria in Council dated the 29th November, 1870, and published in the London Gazette on the same day, a consolidated chapelry was assigned to the consecrated church of Saint Mary, Wolverton, within the parish of Wolverton in the said diocese of Oxford under the name of ‘The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Mary, Wolverton’:

The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that They have made an Order under Section 9 of the Finance Act, 1932, and Section 1 of the Import Duties (Emergency Provisions) Act, 1939, viz.:—

The Import Duties (Drawback) (No. 2) Order, 1953, which extends the scheme for the allowance of drawback of Customs duty paid on certain kinds of imported paper used in the manufacture of open-topped paper bags without flaps, to include paper bags which are closed except for a single opening of the valve type.

“And whereas the said consolidated chapelry has since become a parish under the same name:

“And whereas it has been represented to us, the said Church Commissioners and it appears to us that the name of the said parish should be altered as hereinafter recommended and proposed:

The Order comes into operation on the 20th February, 1953, and has been published as Statutory Instruments 1953, No. 213. “Now, therefore, we, the said Church Commissioners, with the consent of the Right Reverend Kenneth, Bishop of Oxford (in testimony whereof he has hereunto set his hand) and with the consent of the parochial church council of the said parish (in testimony whereof this Scheme is signed by the Chairman of and two other members present at a meeting of the same council duly convened for the purpose of giving such consent) humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty in Council that as from the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme the name of the said parish shall be altered to ‘The Parish of Saint Mary the Virgin, Stony Stratford’.”

And whereas the provisions of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme, have been duly complied with:

The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that They have made an Order under Section 10 of the Finance Act, 1926, entitled the Safeguarding of Industries (Exemption) (No. 1) Order, 1953, which continues until 18th August, 1953, with certain additions and deletions, the exemption from Key Industry Duty of articles exempted from that duty by previous Orders which expire on the 18th February, 1953.

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

The Order comes into operation on the 19th February, 1953, and has been published as Statutory Instruments, 1953, No. 188.

And Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Oxford.
