The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice, in pursuance of Clause 13 of the General Regulations made under the Order in Council of 22nd July, 1920, that, with the approval of the Lords

Commissioners of the Treasury, they have prescribed as follows:—

(A) Candidates for examinations for the situations under the Admiralty of Inspector of Trades, Assistant Foreman of Factory, and Torpedo Assistant Foreman shall be required to pay a fee of 10s. on application and a further fee of 30s. on admission to the examination.

(B) Candidates for examinations for the situation under the Admiralty of Draughtsman (Constructive, Electrical, Engineering, or Aircraft) shall be required to pay a fee of 7s. 6d. on application and a further fee of 12s. 6d. on admission to the examination.

Treasury, the following amendments have been made in the Regulations for the recruitment to basic grades of Professional Engineers, General Service Class and linked Departmental Variants dated 16th January, 1953, and published in the London Gazette of the same date, viz.:—

Regulation 4—*Amend* the date given in the opening notice to read "30th September, 1953."

*Add* "Department of Scientific and Industrial Research.

Candidates must:—

- (a) have been trained in mechanical engineering;
- (b) have had a minimum apprenticeship or period of works training of 3 years, together with drawing office experience of one year. Design or development experience with an industrial organisation would be an advantage."

**LONDON TRAFFIC ACT, 1924.**

**LONDON PASSENGER TRANSPORT ACT, 1933.**

The Minister of Transport has made "The London Traffic (Prescribed Routes) (No. 9) Regulations, 1953" (S.I. 1953 No. 254), coming into operation on the 10th March, 1953, which provide for one-way traffic working in:—

- (a) Market Place, Dartford, from south-west to north-east; and
- (b) Market Street, Dartford, between its junction with High Street and its junction with the roadway surrounding the easternmost of the two large island sites in Market Street, from north-east to south-west;
- (c) around the two large island sites in Market Street, Dartford, in a clock-wise direction.

**DISEASES OF ANIMALS ACT, 1950.**

Notice is hereby given in pursuance of Section 85 (3) of the Diseases of Animals Act, 1950, that the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries has made the following Orders:—

Statutory Instruments 1953 No. 247.

*Prohibition of Landing of Animals and Hay and Straw from the Channel Islands (Revocation) Order, 1953.*

*(Made 18th February, 1953.)*

This Order, which comes into operation on 23rd February, 1953, revokes the Prohibition of Landing of Animals and Hay and Straw from the Channel Islands Order (No. 2), 1952, which prohibited the landing in Great Britain of animals and hay and straw from the Channel Islands.
