Efferday came in here the Facobs Ladder of Wla/hing from Sally informing that the came thence about three weeks fince, and that during her abode there 6 English thips were there brought in, most of them by Algiers men of war, selling ur, that thole of Sally having a free Commerce with Holland, their men of war make use of the fame Arts with thole of Algier, feiling leveral Dutch thips and carrying them into Algier.

· Lyme, septemb. 4. On Thutsday last arrived here a veffel of this place laden with Sugars from the Barbados; and yetterday a vessel from Morlaix with Linnen; this last rells us that the French continue their Naval Provisions at Breft, where they are building their Dock-houles, and have swo great hips there on the stocks. Yesterday failed hence the Vinetree of this place for Vir-

Yefterday failed hence the Vinetree of this place for Virginia; leveral thips lye here bound for Holland, Spain, and France which may put to lea with the first opportunity.

Warfaw, August 23. Tis here much discourted that a Marriage is neer concluded between His Majefty and the Arch Dutchels Eleonore the Emperours Sifter, and that Father Silvano is within 3 days returned hither with a fervant of the Empreis Dowager upon that account, but the illue of this affair will depend upon the Diet at the Coronation where it is to be propoled. His Majefty being obliged not to Marry without the confent of the Republick.

'Several of the Preparatory Diets in Order to that Great and General Allembly are already began in feveral Provinces, but that of Warfaw ended asiloon as it began upon a difagreement about the Election of their Members : That of Mazovia is also broken up without any resolution, the like milunderstanding is feared in many other places, but the Arci bishop of Gresse has given them new Commillions for another meeting, without which they were rendred uncapable of sending their Deputies to the General Diet.

The King has retired himfelf for the space of 5 or 6 days to the Vice-Chancellours house within half a League of this City, he is preparing for his journey to Cracovia, intenting to leave this place the 10th of the next Moneth, and to cantinue for some days at the House of the Pr. Palatine Lubomirshi within 3 Leagues of Cracovia till the 26th of that Moneth, the day appointed for his publick Entry.

The Cham of Tartary united with a Body of Coffacks, has Belieged the other Goffacks under the Commani of a rofenflo, in the Field near the Town of Corfum, on this fide the Borifthenes in Ukrania, and has to encompafied him with his Army, that he cannot eafily eleape without fighting his way through.

Cologne, Sept. 3. The Electors of Mayence, Cologne, and Treves are fuddenly expected at Confiance, but the fubject of their Conference is not yet known.

Erom Swifferland we are told that there has been a great mortality amongst their Cattle, occasioned by the lately immoderate and exceflive drought, informuch as the Magistrates were forced to fer guards upon their Springs, and to fee an equal distribution of the waters according to the neceffities of the people, but that the Earth has been lately refreshed with Rain, and the mortality much ceased.

From Ratifbonne they write, that the Bifhop and Prince of Aichfladt, the Emperours Commissioner is lately arrived there, and the 29th pail made his publick Entry with a Train and Magnificency with ble to his Character, the Townimen in Arms with the Gatrilon, were drawn up to at end him at the Gates of the City, where they fraluted him with feveral Volleys of thot, wi lift the Canon loudly preclaimed the folemnity of his Entry; being arrived at his Lodging, he was visited by the Members of the Diet in which he is to prelide in the room of the Cardinal de Thun.

Hagnes, Septemb. 12, Weare in daily expediation what will be the refuit of the affiirs between the Bilhop of Munfler and the Province of East Friessand, the faid Bid shop still continues to put a stop to the Posts from Hambourg and other places, as Monlieur Louvoy dues on the other fide between spain and the Netherlands.

The French prefs hard upon the Netherlands to have fatisfaction within two moneths rime concerning their pretensions; and the Bishop of Munster has lately had a review of his forces which are faid to amount to 12000 mens these troubles which are like to fall upon the neighbourhood invite us not to be altogether negligent of our own sffaits, and therefore Mareshal Warts is to make an inspetion into our forces; but as yet no resolution is t. ken for the adding of 15 men to each Company as has been to long projected and defigned; the Provinces of Holland and Z caland being not yet very fersible of the necessity of this reinforcement.

The Moneys which have fometime fince fafely arrived at Amflerdam, are not yet paid to the Swedes Minister, on O der being first expected from the Constable of Caffille for that purpole, for which the States intend to preis him by their Letters.

Upon the Adreffes of the Province of Holland, the States have thought fit that a Letter be Written to the Province of Zealand, to psy in their Proportion towards the Building of the Fortreis at Rousen towards Helphalin, those of Holland having refolved, for the quickning of the Works not to pay in sheir Contributions, unlefs the reft of the Provinces concerned field at the fame time furnith their Quicta's for the carrying on of that Work. Bruffels, Septemb. 13. On Friday last arrived here the Duke d' derfebotirom Mons, informing the Constable of Califille that the French Forces have lately appeared upon the Spanish Territories between Valenciennes and Atonsand consists of above 20 iquadrons of Cavalry and 25 Bataillons of Infantry.

On Saturday we had also intelligence that the Gaz ison of Courtray, Aeth, Oudenard, Lille and Tournay had I nt out a part of their forces under their respective (fficers and Commanders, and that they had taken their way towards. wards Fuernes, which gave us fome occasion to doubt they raight have had π defign upon the Fort of Lingue, but upon farther inquiry we find their intentions were only to Convoy fome Wagons laden with Coals and fo fecure their pailage.

The fame day in the Evening by the Conftables Order the Sienr Ognate a Commissioner of the Finances was feifed and committed priloner to the Steenpoors by the Provolt and his people, being accused of difobedience to the Conftables Commands, in not taking off the new impofed Cuft me upon Coals according to his Order, which had occasiond the late diffatisfaction of the French, sgainft which Charge he is endeavouring with the reft of the Commission rs to make his defence, and in the mean time by their addresses to the Conftable to defire a removal of his perfon to a prilon less (candalous then that which is the usual place for the tecuring of Thieves and the like notoripus. The milunderstandings between the French and Spanish Post-Master fill continue to the great detriment and interruption of Trade.

Since this City conferned to the payment of their Moneys which are employed for the Quartering of the foldiers, greater care then formerly is taken to prevent the Thefts and Murders which were fo frequently committed in the night, about 200 men being appointed with their own Officers, and fome others of the City to go the Rounds in feveral parties.

On Monday last the Sieur de Galatette His Majesties Secretary of State and War, having quitted that Employment which had been held by him near 15 years, departed hence for *spain*; His Excellency having conferred that Charge upon His own Secretary.

On Tuelday laft arrived here leveral Deputes from Lieges to Treat concerning the Eftablishment of a mutual Trade and Commerce between the Subjects of both Countryes.

We have here much Difcourse of a Treaty now on Foot, for an Exchange to be made of the Countreys lately Conquered by the French 3 and, it adds not a little confidence to this Report, That the French have lately difinitifed all the Workmen lately employed by them in the Fortifications of Charleroy and other places. \circ

Faris, Sept. 14. Since the unhappy accident of the fising of the Therefs before Candia, feveral reports have heer, with much confidence spread abread of a general falhy made with much fuccels upon the Energy, but this being not at all confirmed by our late Letters from Rome and other patts of Staly, we have reason to fulpect the rtuth of those advantagious actions; we rather find that the Turks ply their Siege with more then ordinary diligence, faving on the fide of the Sabioners made fome confiderable advance spowards the Arlenal, and by a Mine thrown down's part of the Bulwark towards the Port, which obliged Monfour Gelbers to make feveral fallies with much courage and various faccels; but that the Generalifium had defigned to attempt the Enemy with 3000 of the choicelt foldiers in the Garrifon, of which we expect with impatiancy fome account.

The Dauphin is again relapfed into his Feavour, but not to dan ercufly as to divert His Majefty from his refo. lution of going for Chemboarg.

The 10th inftant about 4 in the morning dyed the Queen Mother of England at her House at Golombe 4 Leagues

from this City in the 60th year of her age; upon the news whereof, Monlieur went immediately from St. Germains to pay her his laft Devotions, and af erward to St. Clou to impart the afflicting news to Madam, who received it with infinite forrow, and was afterwards vified and condoled with by their Majeflier,

The same day the Body of the deceased Queen was exposed upon a Bed of flate in her Chamber, and the next day Embalmed, and afterwards, conveyed to the Monaflery at *Chaliot*, arended by the Lady *Marefobele du Pleffyes*, and several other Ladies of Quality.

To morrow His Majefty intends to jut on Mourning for the deceased Queen Mother, and to give a Visit to Madama and the next day to let f rwards on his way for Chambourg.

This Morning His Highnels the Prince of Tufcany departs on his return home, much fatisfied with his Reception in this Court, and with the Prefent of Tapilteryes given him by His Majefty.

The Duke de Beauforts Secretary being lately arrived from Candia, affirms, That for 3 weeks after the unhappy Sally made upon the Turks he had made all poffible inquiry after the Duke his Mafter, and had dilpatched a Barke with a White Flag towards the Turkish Camp; the Perfore employed by him coming near the moar, was told by the Turks, That they had the pofferfion of his dead Body, and if he would land would show it him : but, he refuting their firft offer, could not afterwards entreate that favour of being permitted to land 5 for much the Turks feemed diffatisfied with his diffruit of their Faith.
