Falmouth, Sept. 1. Esterday came in here the Jacobs Ladder of Ulushing from Sally informing that the came thence about three weeks fince, and that during her abode there 6 English ships were there brought in, most of them by Algiers men of war, relling ur, that those of Sally having a tree Commerce with Hol-land, their men of war make use of the same Arts with those of Algier, seising several Dutch ships and carrying them into Algier.

Lyme, Septemb. 4. On Thursday last arrived here a velfel of this place laden with Sugars from the Barbados; and yellerday a vessel from Morlaix with Linnen; this last rells us that the French continue their Naval Provisions at Breft, where they are building their Dock-houses, and have

swo great ships there on the stocks.
Yesterday failed hence the Vinetree of this place for Virginia; leveral ships lye here bound for Holland, Spain, and France which may put to lea with the first opportuni-

Warfam, August 23. Tis here much discoursed that a Marriage is neer concluded between His Majesty and the Arch Dutchels Eleonore the Emperours Sifter, and that Father Silvano is within 3 days returned hither with a servant of the Emprels Dowager upon that account, but the illug of this affair will depend upon the Diet at the Coronation where it is to be proposed, His Majesty being obliged not to Marry without the consent of the Republick.

Several of the Preparatory Diets in Order to that Great and General Assembly are already began in several Provinces, but that of Warfaw ended assioon as it began upon a difagreement about the Election of their Members ! That of Mazovia is also broken up without any resolution, the like milunderstanding is feared in many other places, but the Arci bishop of Gnesne has given them new Commissions for another meeting, without which they were rendred uncapable of sending their Deputies to the Geng-Tal Diet.

The King has retited himfelf for the space of 5 or 6 days to th. Vice-Chancellours house within half & League of this City, he is preparing for his journey to Cracovia, intenting to leave this place the 10th of the next Moneth, and to cantinue for some days at the House of the Pr. Palatine Lubomirshi within 3 Leagues of Cracovia till the 26th of that Moneth, the day appointed for his publick Entry.

The Cham of Tartary united with a Body of Coffacks, has Belieged the other Goffacks under the Command of arosensto, in the Field near the Town of Corsum, on this side the Boristhenes in Ukrania, and has so encompassed him with his Army, that he cannot easily escape without fighting his way through.

Cologne, Sept. 3. The Electors of Mayence, Cologne, and Treves are fuddenly expected at Confrance, but the

subject of their Conference is not yet known.

Erom Swifferland we are told that there has been a great mortality amongst their Cattle, octasioned by the lately immoderate and excessive drought, insomuch as the Magistrates were forced to let guards upon their Springs, and to see an equal distribution of the wa_ ters according to the necessities of the people, but that the Earth has been lately refreshed with Rain, and the morta. lity much ceased,

From Ratistonne they write, that the Bishop and Prince of Aichstadt, the Emperours Commissioner is lately preived there, and the 29th past made his publick Entry with a Train and Magnificency witeble to his Character, the Townsmen in Arms with the Garrison, were drawn up to at end him at the Gates of the City, where they saluted him with feveral Volleys of thot, willft the Canon loudly proclaimed the solemnity of his Entry; being arrived at his Lodging, he was visited by the Nembers of the Diet in which he is to prefide in the room of the Cardinal de Thun.

Hagne, Septemb. 12, We are in daily expectation what will be the result of the affirs between the Bishop of Munfler and the Province of East Priesland, the laid Bishop still continues to put a stop to the Posts from Hambourg and other places, as Montieur Louvoy dues on the other fide between spain and the Netherlands.

The French preis hard upon the Netherlands to have Satisfaction within two moneths time concerning their pretensions; and the Bishop of Munster has lately had a review of his forces which are faid to amount to 1 2000 men; these troubles which are like to fall upon the neighbourhood invite us not to be altogether negligent of our own affairs, and therefore Mareshal Wurts is to make an inspection into our forces; but as yet no resolution is t. ken for the adding of 15 men to each Company as has been so long projected and defigned; the Provinces of Holland and Zealand being not yet very ferilible of the necessity of this relies

The Moneys which have sometime fince safely arrived at Amsterdam, are not yet paid to the Swedes Minister, an O.der being first expected from the Constable of Castille for that purpole, for which the States intend to preis him

by their Letters.

Upon the Adresses of the Province of Holland, the States have thought fit that a Letter be Written to the Province of Zealand [to pay in their Proportion towards the Building of the Fortrel's at Roucen towards Westphalin, those of Holland having resolveds for the quickning of the Works not to pay in sheir Contributions, unless the rest of the Provinces concerned shall at the same time furnish their Quata's for the carrying on of that Work.
