

Falmouth, Dec. 27. Yesterday came in here the *St. Jacob of Copenhagen*, bound home with Wine from *Boardeaux*, which Place she left the 9th Instant, and the Master says, they did not feel the late Tempest there: He met with a *French Privateer* of 16 Guns about a League off this Place.

Plymouth, Dec. 28. Her Majesty's Ship the *Montague* came into this Port yesterday from *Spithead*, and under her Convoy the *Mary, Gerard Gerardson* Master, and the *Abigail, Peter Prince* Master, both of *Rotterdam*, and bound to *Dublin*; the *Friendship* of *Ramsgate, Robert Tickner* Master, from *Archangel*, laden with Hemp for the Dock; the *Richard and John* of *Southampton, John Sceprens* Master, and the *Rebecca* of this Place, *Thomas Dewfloe* Master, both from *London*, with Pitch, &c for the Dock; the *Orange-Flower* of *Chester, Stephen Branscomb* Master, homeward-bound from *Rotterdam*; the *Sarah and Lidia* of *London, William Smith* Master, bound to *Dublin*; and 5 Vessels from the Isle of *Wight*, bound to *Falmouth*. Her Majesty's Ship the *Leopard* sailed hence this evening to the Eastward.

Chichester, Dec. 29. On Tuesday the 28th Instant his Majesty the King of *Spain*, attended by their Graces the *Dukes of Somerset and Marlborough*, with other Persons of Quality, passed through this Place, where he was received by the Mayor and Corporation in their Formalities, accompanied by Captain *Miller* and Mr. *Elson*, our Representatives, with many other Gentlemen of this City: Upon his Arrival, Captain *Miller* made a Speech to his Majesty on behalf of the City, congratulating him on his safe Arrival, and happy Accession to the Crown of *Spain*, and expressing their Joy at the Honour done them by his Presence here, and their hearty Wishes for his happy Success in his present Expedition. The Streets of this City were lined on both sides with a very fine Company of Gentlemen Volunteers in *Scarlet*, commanded by Captain *Vavasor*; and great Rejoycings were made by the whole City, with repeated Huzzas and Acclamations of Joy as he passed through, Ringing of Bells, Bonfires, &c. After this Ceremony was ended, Captain *Vavasor* took the Gentlemen Volunteers, and entertained them at his House with Wine to drink the *Queen's Health*, and Captain *Miller* gave a noble Treat at his House to the Mayor and Corporation, and concluded the night in drinking Her Majesty's Health, and good Success to his Majesty the King of *Spain*.

St. James's, Dec. 31. Her Majesty and his Royal Highness returned hither this day from *Windsor*.

Whitehall, Jan. 2. The States General having, by their Envoy Extraordinary at this Court, represented to the Queen, That the coming of the Duke of *Marlborough* to the *Hague* might now be of great Advantage to the Common Cause, by Concerting there with them the Measures proper to be taken in this Juncture; and having therefore prayed Her Majesty to give his Grace Leave to pass the Sea for a few days; Her Majesty has been pleased to direct his Grace to go accordingly to the *Hague* for that Purpose; and after a short stay to return. In pursuance whereof his Grace will be going hence with the first fair Wind.

The Dutch Mails of Tuesday and Friday last are not yet come in.
