WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 13th day of March, 1953, (N2/N.1232/53) in the words following, viz:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being, or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas by Order in Council dated the 30th day of January, 1952, payment of a Bounty of £100 was approved, on the first day of the thirteenth year of reckonable service, to male ratings and other ranks, Royal Marines, serving on regular engagements who signed for re-engagement between the 1st day of September, 1950, and the 31st day of December, 1952, to complete time for pension:

"And whereas it has been found desirable to continue the scheme for another year and to provide for earlier payment:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council, to sanction the extension of the scheme to the 31st day of December, 1953, and the payment of the Bounty by an advance of £75 on signing for re-engagement and the balance of £25 on the first day of the thirteenth year of reckonable service, the amended conditions of payment having full retrospective effect.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

Her Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 11th day of March, 1953 in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We, the Church Commissioners acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to

1952, and the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme which we have prepared with the consent of the Right Reverend Edward, Bishop of Ely (in witness whereof he has signed the Scheme), for effecting the disunion of the united benefice of Meldreth with Whaddon in the diocese of Ely:

"Whereas by an Order of his late Majesty King George the Fifth in Council dated the 10th day of August, 1921, and published in the London Gazette on the 9th day of September 1921, it was directed that the benefice of Meldreth and the benefice of Whaddon should be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls but that the parishes of the said benefices should continue distinct in all respects:

"And whereas in pursuance of the said Order and in the events which have happened the union of the said benefices took effect upon the 31st day of December, 1931:

"And whereas the Bishop of the said diocese of Ely, has forwarded to us, the said Church Commissioners, provisional proposals pursuant to the said Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, recommending that the union of the said benefices should be dissolved:

"And whereas effect can be given to the said proposals by Scheme prepared by us, and affirmed by an Order of Your Majesty in Council pursuant to the said Union of Benefices Measures:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Church Commissioners, do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"SCHEME.

"1. The union of the benefice of Meldreth and the benefice of Whaddon in the said united benefice of Meldreth with Whaddon (hereinafter called 'the said united benefice') shall be dissolved and the said benefices of Meldreth and Whaddon shall thereupon each become a separate benefice with cure of souls within the limits of its separate parish.

"2. The disunion of the said united benefice shall take effect upon the date when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette.

"3. The parsonage house of, the said united benefice shall belong to the benefice of Whaddon.

"4. The endowments and property of the said united benefice shall be divided and distributed as follows, that is to say, the endowments and property specified in Part I of the Schedule hereto shall be assigned and annexed to the benefice of Meldreth, and the endowments and property specified in Part II of the said Schedule shall be assigned and annexed to the benefice of Whaddon.

"5. The alternate patron of the said united benefice who was formerly sole patron of the benefice of Meldreth shall be the patron of the said benefice of Meldreth, and the alternate patron of the said united benefice who was formerly sole patron of the benefice of Whaddon shall be the patron of the said benefice of Whaddon.

"THE SCHEDULE.

"Part I

"(Endowments and property of the united benefice of Meldreth with Whaddon to be assigned and annexed to the benefice of Meldreth upon the disunion taking effect.)

"(1) A capital sum of £5,261 18s. 11d. held by the Church Commissioners in respect of the united benefice producing £169 5s. 6d. per annum.

"(2) A permanent charge of £75 per annum on the Church Commissioners' General Fund in respect of the united benefice.

"(3) All the glebe lands now belonging to the united benefice and situate in the parish of Meldreth.

"Part II.

"(Endowments and property of the united benefice of Meldreth with Whaddon to be assigned and annexed to the benefice of Whaddon upon the disunion taking effect.)

"(1) A capital sum of £3,798 2s. 7d. held by the Church Commissioners in respect of the united benefice producing £120 7s. 11d. per annum.

"(2) A permanent charge of £103 3s. 6d. per annum on the Church Commissioners' General Fund in respect of the united benefice.

"(3) All the glebe lands now belonging to the united benefice and situate in the parish of Whaddon.

"(4) All other the endowments and property of the united benefice not mentioned in Part I of this Schedule."

And whereas the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, the Union of Benefices Rules, 1926 and 1930, and the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that it shall be and become effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette.

WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 12th day of February, 1953, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, and the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme which we have prepared with the consent of the Right Reverend John, Bishop of Derby (in witness whereof he has signed the Scheme), for effecting the union of the benefice of Sudbury, the benefice of Somersal Herbert, the benefice of Boylestone and the benefice of Scropton all situate in the diocese of Derby.

"SCHEME.

"1. *Union of Benefices.* The benefice of Sudbury, the benefice of Somersal Herbert, the benefice of Boylestone and the benefice of Scropton shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Sudbury, Somersal, Boylestone and Scropton', but the parishes of the said benefices shall continue in all respects distinct.

"2. *Taking effect of union.* Upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the Reverend Edward Benjamin Bull if he is then incumbent of the said benefices of Sudbury and Somersal Herbert shall with his consent (testified by his signature hereto), be the first incumbent of the united benefice.

"3. *Parsonage House.* (a) Upon the union taking effect the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Sudbury shall be the house of residence of the incumbent of the united benefice, and as soon as conveniently may be the parsonage house

at present belonging to the benefices of Boylestone and Somersal Herbert and the sites and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us, the said Church Commissioners, at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient, (b) the net proceeds of such sale or sales shall constitute and form part of the Expenses Fund of the diocese of Derby established pursuant to the said Measures.

"4. *Provision for a curate or clerical or lay assistance.* Upon the union taking effect (a) the incumbent shall employ a curate or such other clerical or lay assistance to assist him in performing the duties of the united benefice as the Bishop of Derby may from time to time direct and (b) the endowments (producing together an annual income of £450) specified in Parts I and II of the schedule annexed hereto shall be severed and diverted from the benefices of Scropton and Boylestone respectively and from the united benefice and shall be appropriated by us as a fund towards the cost of providing such assistance as aforesaid and the said annual income of £450 shall be paid by us to the diocesan board of finance of the said diocese as trustees to apply the same accordingly.

"5. *Patronage.* After the union has taken effect in every four successive turns of presentation or nomination to be made to the united benefice, the patron of the benefice of Boylestone shall have the first turn, the patron of the benefice of Scropton shall have the second turn, the patron of the benefice of Somersal Herbert shall have the third turn, and the patron of the benefice of Sudbury shall have the fourth turn.

"Endowments at present belonging to the benefice of Scropton and held by the Church Commissioners to be appropriated towards the cost of providing a curate or clerical or lay assistance for the united benefice of Sudbury, Somersal, Boylestone and Scropton.

RECRUITMENT OF GEOLOGISTS IN THE GEOLOGICAL SURVEY OF GREAT BRITAIN UNDER THE DEPARTMENT OF SCIENTIFIC AND INDUSTRIAL RESEARCH.

1. Age.

Candidates must be at least 21 and under 30 years of age on 1st May, 1953. *But*

(1) The maximum age limit of 30 is extended to 31 for candidates who hold a permanent appointment in the Experimental Officer Class.

(2) A candidate who has served or is serving on a regular (including a regular short-service) engagement in H.M. Forces may for this purpose deduct his period of such service from his actual age.

2. Sex and Marriage.

(i) Both men and women may compete under these Regulations.

(ii) Married women who have formerly been established civil servants and have drawn marriage gratuity (other than those who resigned compulsorily on marriage and whose resignation took effect before 15th October, 1946, or who are widows or divorced, or who are separated from their husbands, or whose husbands suffer without hope of recovery from total physical or mental incapacity) will not be eligible unless they undertake to refund on appointment the marriage gratuity paid. Provided that this undertaking will not be required if the break between the first period of service (including any period of unestablished service immediately following the period in respect of which the gratuity was paid) and the date of re-establishment is more than seven years.

3. Nationality.

Candidates must be British subjects. They must also satisfy one of the following conditions:—

(a) If natural-born British subjects, they must either

(i) have at least one parent who is, or was at death, a British subject; or

(ii) have resided in Her Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

(b) If naturalised British subjects, they must have resided in Her Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

(c) If not qualified under (a) or (b) of this paragraph, they must satisfy the Commissioners that they are so closely connected with Her Majesty's dominions either by ancestry, upbringing or residence, or by reason of national service, that an exception may properly be made in their favour.

4. Qualifications.

(i) Every candidate must have obtained a university degree with first or second class honours in Geology or an equivalent qualification.

Provided that the Commissioners may at their discretion admit a candidate with high professional attainments notwithstanding that he or she may not possess the above qualifications.

(ii) A candidate holding a permanent appointment in the Experimental Officer Class who is at least 28 and has not passed his or her 31st birthday on 1st May, 1953, and who does not fulfil the above requirements may be admitted on the recommendation of the Government Department in which he or she is serving.

(iii) *But candidates sitting for their final degree examinations in the summer of 1953 will be admitted to the competition; a candidate will not, however, be declared successful unless on the result of the examination he or she satisfies Regulation 4 (i) above.*

5. Health and Character.

Successful candidates must satisfy the Commissioners as to their health and character.

6. Competition.

(i) The Commissioners may at their discretion summon candidates to a preliminary informal interview.

(ii) A certain number of the candidates will be chosen, on the basis of the information available, to appear before a Selection Board appointed by the Commissioners. The Selection Board in making their recommendations to the Commissioners, and the Commissioners in making their final decision, will give weight to the candidates' capacity or potentiality for original research or development work; and they will as a rule expect this quality to be demonstrated in a candidate's record.

The decision of the Commissioners will be final.

7. Candidates trained as Teachers.

Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate central education authority (e.g., the Ministry of Education, the Scottish Education Department, the Ministry of Education for Northern Ireland) has been notified to the Commissioners.

8. Canvassing.

Any attempt on the part of candidates to enlist support for their applications through Members of Parliament or other influential persons, except as referees to be named by them in their application forms, will disqualify them for appointment.

9. Fee.

A successful candidate will be required to pay a fee of £4 before the issue of a certificate of qualification for appointment.
