PAPER BOX WAGES COUNCIL (GREAT BRITAIN).

The Paper Box Wages Council (Great Britain) hereby gives notice of its intention to submit to the Minister of Labour and National Service proposals (1) for the revocation of the Paper Box Wages Council (Great Britain) Wages Regulation Order, 1952 (Order B. (50) and (3) for the amendment of the Paper Box Wages Council (Great Britain) Wages Regulation (Holidays) Order, 1948 (Order B. (42)) as amended by Order B. (50).

PETROLEUM (PRODUCTION) ACT, 1934.

PETROLEUM (PRODUCTION) ACT, 1934.

In pursuance of section 2 (3) of the Petroleum (Production) Act, 1934, the Minister of Fuel and Power hereby gives notice that in accordance with the provisions of that Act and of the Petroleum (Production) Regulations, 1935, he has granted to D'Arcy Exploration Co., Ltd., of Britannic House, Finsbury Circus, London, E.C.2, a prospecting licence in respect of the area referred to in the schedule hereto, the boundaries of which are described by reference to the 1 in. Ordnance Map, supplemented where necessary by reference to the 6 in. Ordnance Survey Map.

SCHEDULE.

An area of approximately 114 square miles in the County of Lincoln.

Northern Boundary.

From the crossroads at Ashby-de-la-Launde the boundary follows the southern side of the road through Digby and thence via Digby Dam to the junction with Causeway Road.

Eastern Boundary.

The boundary runs along the west side of Causeway Road through North Kyme and South Kyme to the junction with Claybank Road. Thence it follows the south bank of Kyme Eau to Damford Tunnel where it turns in a south-easterly direction along the west bank of Maryland Drain and Clay Dike to the junction with South Forty Foot Drain at Waterman's Call. It continues along South Forty Drain to Skirbeck Quarter.

Southern Boundary.

The boundary runs along the west bank of the railway through Skirbeck Quarter to the junction with London Road which it follows through Kirton and Sutterton to Gosberton.

Western Boundary.

From Gosberton the boundary follows the eastern side of A.152 through Quadring and Donington to the junction with the railway to the north-west of Donington Road station. Thence it runs along the western side of the former L.N.E. Railway through Helpringham and Burton Pedwardine to the junction with South Gate, Sleaford. It continues along North Gate, Sleaford, and passes by way of A.15 through Holdingham, Leasingham and Brauncwell to the junction with B.1191 which it follows to Ashby-de-la-Launde.
