- "5. Parsonage House. The parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Saint Mary of Bethany, Tong Road, New Wortley, shall be the house of residence of the incumbent of the united
  - "6. Taking down of church.
  - "(a) As soon as conveniently may be after the union has taken effect the church of Holy Trinity, Armley Hall, shall be taken down and the materials and site thereof, together with any ground annexed thereto and necessary for the use and enjoyment thereof, shall be sold and disposed of by us, the said Church Commissioners, at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient subject to the conditions and restrictions improved by the said Mountains restrictions imposed by the said Measures.

"(b) The net proceeds to arise from such sale or sales after payment of the expenses attendant thereon and upon the taking down of the church and all other expenses incidental to these matters shall be appropriated to the Expenses Fund of the said diocese established pursuant to the 32nd Section of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

- "(c) The font, communion table and plate used for the purpose of the Holy Communion in the said church of Holy Trinity, Armley Hall, shall not be sold but shall in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures and as the bishop of the diocese may direct, be transferred to some other church or churches within the said diocese and the bells, organ and other furniture and fittings of the said church of Holy Trinity, Armley Hall, or such of them as the said bishop shall select, shall be removed to any other church or chapel shall be removed to any other church or chapel or churches or chapels within the said diocese which the bishop may direct or shall be sold and in such case the proceeds shall be added to the fund arising from the sale of the site and materials of the said church of Holy Trinity, Armley Hall, as aforesaid.
- "7. Patronage. After the union has taken effect the right of presentation to the united benefice shall be exercised by the patrons of the two benefices alternately, the patron of the benefice of Saint Mary of Bethany, Tong Road, New Wortley, having the first presentation to the united benefice to be made after the union.
- "8. Diversion of Endowments. Upon the union taking effect part of the endowments of the united benefice, namely, an annual sum of £232, being part benefice, namely, an annual sum of £232, being part of a larger annual sum at present payable by us, the said Church Commissioners to the benefice of Saint Mary of Bethany, Tong Road, New Wortley, shall be severed or diverted from that benefice and from the united benefice of Saint Mary, New Wortley, with Holy Trinity, Armley Hall, and shall be transferred to and be held by us, the said Church Commissioners, as part of and for the benefit of our general fund, and in consideration of the said transfer we shall make out of the said general fund such periodical payments to the diocesan stipends fund of the diocese of Ripon as we from time to time determine to be equitable having regard to the value of the said endowments.
- "9. Alteration of boundaries. With the consent (testified by his signature hereto) of the Reverend Kenneth Hargrave Stapleton, being the incumbent of the benefice of New Wortley, all that part of the parish of New Wortley, shown by the pink colour on the map annexed to this Scheme, which lies to the northwest of the middle of the Main Line of the British Railways (North Eastern Region) shall, upon the union taking effect, be severed from that parish and be annexed to the united parish of Saint Mary, New Wortley, with Holy Trinity, Armley Hall."

And whereas the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, the Union of Benefices Rules, 1926 and 1930, and the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that it shall be and become effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette.

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 1st day of May, 1953, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

- "We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for altering the boundaries of the parishes of Saint Clement, Worcester, and Cotheridge with Crown East both in the diocese of Worcester.
- Whereas we are satisfied that it is desirable that the boundaries of the said parishes should be altered in the manner hereinafter mentioned:
- "And whereas the Right Reverend William, Bishop of Worcester, consents to the proposed arrangements (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme):
- "Now, therefore, we, the said Church Commis-Now, therefore, we, the said Church Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme the boundaries of the said parishes of Saint Clement, Worcester, and Cotheridge with Crown East shall be altered in the manner described in the Schedule and delineated on the map annexed to this Scheme.

## "THE SCHEDULE

"The territory, shown by the pink colour on the map hereto, to be annexed to the parish of Saint Clement, Worcester:

Clement, Worcester:—

"All that part of the parish of Cotheridge with Crown East which is bounded on the east by the parish of Saint Clement, Worcester, on part of the north by the parish of Christ Church, Broadheath, and on the remaining sides by an imaginary line commencing at the point in the middle of Oldbury Road opposite to the middle of the southeastern end of the track or footpath leading to Temple Laughorn where the boundary which divides the parish of Christ Church, Broadheath, from the parish of Cotheridge with Crown East leaves the said road in a northwesterly direction and extending thence westwards along the middle of the said road for a distance of 7 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the middle of the northern end of the track or footpath leading to Earl's Court and continuing or footpath leading to Earl's Court and continuing thence southwards first to and then along the middle thence southwards first to and then along the middle of the said track or footpath to its junction with the wall or fence which forms the southwestern boundary of close numbered 318 on the said map and continuing thence southeastwards along the said wall or fence and along the wall or fence which forms the southwestern boundary of close numbered 393 to its junction with the wall or fence which forms the northwestern boundary of close numbered 399 and continuing thence northeastwards along the last mentioned wall or fence to a point in the middle mentioned wall or fence to a point in the middle of the track or footpath which leads generally southeastwards to Bromyard Road and continuing thence southeastwards along the middle of the last men-tioned track or footpath to the wall or fence which forms the northwestern boundary of close numbered 452 and continuing thence southwestwards along the last mentioned wall or fence to its junction with the wall or fence which forms the southwestern boundary of the same close and continuing thence southwest-wards in a straight line to the middle of Bromyard Road and continuing thence southeastwards along the middle of Bromyard Road for a distance of I chain to a point opposite to the southwestern end of the wall or fence which forms the northwestern boundary of close numbered 455 and continuing thence northeastwards first to and then along that wall or fence to its junction with the wall or fence which forms the northeastern boundary of the same close and continuing thence southeastwards along the last mentioned wall or fence to its end and continuing thence southeastwards first in a straight line to and then along the walls or fences at the rear of the houses and premises known as numbers 1 to 14 Grove Crescent to a point opposite to the north-eastern end of the wall or fence which divides the house and premises known as number 14 Grove house and premises known as number 14 Grove Crescent from the house and premises known as number 15 Grove Crescent and continuing thence
