N the 27th of the last Month Her Majesty's Ship the Blackwall, Captain Samuel Martin Commander, brought in here a French Privateer of 12 Guns and 120 Men, which he took in this Latitude; as also an Irish Ship bound hither, which had been taken the day before by the faid Privateer:

Cipinhagen, Jan. 15. Messieurs Rantzau and Harbos, two Majors-General, who command the Danish Forces in the Netherlands, are lately arrived here from thence. Major General Gersdorf is appointed to go to Hungary, to command the Forces of this Crown in the Empesors Service, in the room of the young Count of Raundin, who is recalled from that Employment. It is Mil that the King intends to make a Journey to Norby in the Spring. We hear that the Samon Prisoners litely brought to Sweden are to be sent to Holstein, at the Requelt of the Administrator of that Durchy, to beformed into two Regiments of Foot.

From the Imperial head Quarter at Ostiglia, my passed over the Secchia: above Bondanella; but General Transfmansdorf, to whom the Count di Staremberg has left the Command of the Impetial Forces in these Parts, being thereabouts with a Detachment of Horse, soon obliged the Eveny to retire. Soon after the same Party, having been joined by a strong Detachment both of Hosse and Foot, passed over the River a second time below Bondanella, and fell upon a Battalion of the Regiment of Bagni, commanded by Lieutenant-Colonel Hoffman, who at first was obliged to give Ground, but upon a second Attack repulsed the Enemy with fuch Bravery, that they were forced to felire with precipitation, leaving 100 of their Men find upon the place, and a Lieutenant and 7 Men more taken Prifoners: On our fide a Major and 14 Mivate Men were killed, and two were wounded. We hear the Enemy are intrenching themselves near Quiftello.

Letters from Savoy say, the Matquis de Sales, with the Body of the Duke of Savoy's Forces under his Command, is marched towards the Valley of Aousta; and that the French Forces under the Marshal de la Feuillade are drawing towards Montmeillan.

Nancy, January 24. Letters from Paris give an Account, That the Marshals of Villeroy, Boufflers, Vauban, Tallard, Villars and Harcourt, were expected at Court, to be present at a great Council of War which was to be held there, for concerting the Measures for carrying on the War the next Campaign: That the Ministry there was employed in framing new Projects to raise Money for that Service, and (among others) had agreed to erect new Offices in each Diocele, to regulate the Proportions which the Clergy are to pay towards the Free Gift. usually granted by rhem every year, by the Sale of which Employments they hoped to raise about 700000 Crowns. The Camifars continue to make Excursions; and it is said the French King has refolved to augment the Forces employed to suppress them, and for that purpole has countermanded pare of those which are designed to be sent as Auxiliaries to Spain. The Marshal de Montrevel, who commanded the King's Forces in the Sevenies, is recalled, and the Grand Prior is to command there in his room.

Francfort, January 27. The Diet of the Circle of the Upper Rhine is affembled here, to agree upon the neceffary Measures to be taken for bringing their Forces into the Field early the next Campaign. The Elector Palatine arrived the 14th Instant at Erstiert, and the Palatine arrived the 14th Iditant at Erfart, and the next day continued his Journey to Vienna, intending to take his way by Leipfick, where he was to arrive the 28th Initant. We have now a very hard Frost; and the Landgrave of Hesse being apprehensive less the French should take this opportunity of making an Attempt upon Rhinfela, he has augmented that Garison to 1500 Men, and cantoned 3 Regiments thereabouts, who wood of casion, may be drawn together under the Can upon occasion, may be drawn together under the Can-non of that Place in less than two hours time. A French Party-man, with about 20 Soldiers and some Boors, endeavoured lately to pass over the Rhine be-tween Drienhausen and Hambach, but by that time they were got half way over the Ice broke, and most of them perished. We hear the like has happened to another French Party between Spire and Worms. Letters from Swabia give an Account, That the Marshal de Marsin returned the 17th Instant from his Expedition on the other side the Danube, having possession of the country of th fed himself of Wendingen, Pappenheim and Monbeim. It was faid, he had a Design upon Mardlingen; but that was prevented by the Duke of Wirtemberg, who had got together a Body of 6 or 7000 Men to oppose him. The Marquis de Blainville, who was marched out of Um with another Detachment, is also

returned thither. The Bavariaus are carrying away to Munich all the Cannon, Stores and Ammunition, belonging to the Arfenal of Augsbeurg, to the great Grief of the Inhabitants of that Place. The Elector of Bavaria was shortly expected at Manich, having, as it was faid, resolved to leave to his Generals the Care of attacking Lintz, and getting in the Contributions which he has demanded of the neighbouring Country. Letters from Vienns of the 19th fay, Prince Eugene returned thither the day before from Presburg, having left the Command of the Imperial Forces to General Palfi, whom the Emperor had lately made Ban of Crostia, in the room of Count Batthiani, deceased; which Choice has given so great. Satisfaction to all the Inhabitants of that Province, that it will be no small inducement to them to contribute chearfully all they are able towards the suppressing of the Rebellion in Hungary, if the Negociation, which is said to be on foor for bringing Matters to an amicable Composition, does nor prove fuccelsful.

Portsmouth, Jan. 27. Yesterday about noon the King of Spain came on shore at this Place: His Majesty was met at the Water-side by the Mayor and Corporation in their Formalities, and the Cannon round the Town was discharged at his Landing.
