The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that They have made an Order under section 9 of the Finance Act, 1932, and section 1 of the Import Duties (Emergency Provisions) Act, (1939, viz.:—

The Import Duties (Drawback) (No. 7) Order, 1953, which reduces from 31s. 6d. to 28s. 0d. a cwt. the rate of drawback of Customs duty allowable in respect of imported unblanched shelled almonds used in the manufacture of certain blanched almonds.

The Order comes into operation on the 19th June, 1953, and has been published as Statutory Instruments 1953, No. 938.
