“We, the Church Commissioners, in pursuance of the Church Patronage Act, 1870, and the Acts mentioned therein have prepared the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the churches and cure (hereinafter called ‘the said benefice’) of Bramber with Botolphs in the County of Sussex and in the diocese of Chichester.

“Whereas we are satisfied that the President and Scholars of the College of Saint Mary Magdalen in the University of Oxford (hereinafter called ‘the said President and Scholars’) are the patrons or persons entitled to present or nominate to the said benefice:

“And whereas the said President and Scholars desire to transfer the advowson of the said benefice to the Bishop of Chichester for the time being and are consenting to this Scheme (in testimony whereof they have affixed their Common or Corporate Seal hereto):

“And whereas we are satisfied that the transfer will tend to make better provision for the cure of souls:

“Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend George, Bishop of Chichester, (in testimony whereof he has executed this Scheme), we, the said Church Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice shall be transferred to the said George, Bishop of Chichester, and his successors in the same Bishopric and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the Bishop of Chichester for the time being.”

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Chichester.

“We, the Church Commissioners, in pursuance of the Church Patronage Act, 1870, and the Acts mentioned therein, have prepared the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the interest hereinafter mentioned in the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the churches and cure (hereinafter called ‘the said benefice’) of Alphamstone with Lamarsh in the diocese of Chelmsford.

“Whereas we are satisfied that the patronage of the said benefice is exercised in a series of six successive turns of presentation of which the President and Scholars of Saint John Baptist College in the University of Oxford (hereinafter called ‘the said College’) are entitled to two turns:

“And whereas the said College desire to transfer their interest to Your Majesty and are consenting to this Scheme (in testimony whereof they have executed the same):

“And whereas we are satisfied that the transfer will tend to make better provision for the cure of souls:

“Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Falkner, Bishop of Chelmsford, and the Right Honourable Gavin Turnbull, Baron Simonds, Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, acting on behalf of Your Majesty (in testimony whereof they have executed this Scheme), we, the said Church Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the said interest of the said College in the ownership of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice shall be transferred to and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in Your Majesty, Your Heirs and Successors, and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the Lord High Chancellor on behalf of Your Majesty forever.”

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 5th day of June, 1953, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners (Powers) Measure, 1938, and the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme which we have prepared with the consent of the Right Reverend Spencer, Bishop of Peterborough (in witness whereof he has signed the Scheme), for effecting the union of the benefice of Saint Mary, Gayton, and the benefice of Tiffeld, both situate in the diocese of Peterborough:

"Whereas the said two benefices of Saint Mary, Gayton, and Tiffeld are now held in plurality by the Reverend William Henry Oliver:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Church Commissioners, do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. *Union of Benefices*.—The benefice of Saint Mary, Gayton, and the benefice of Tiffeld shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Gayton with Tiffeld' but the parishes of the said benefices shall continue in all respects distinct.

"2. *Taking effect of union*.—Upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the said Reverend William Henry Oliver, if he is then incumbent of both of the said benefices of Saint Mary, Gayton, and Tiffeld, shall, with his consent (testified by his signature hereto), be the first incumbent of the united benefice, and his admission thereto shall be without any form or fee of or for presentation or nomination and he shall not be required to pay any fees in respect of his collation, institution, licence, or induction to the united benefice beyond such fees as he would have been liable to pay if his admission to the united benefice had been an admission solely to the benefice of Saint Mary, Gayton.

"3. *Parsonage House*.

"(a) Upon the union taking effect and pending the provision at Gayton of a house approved by us as suitable to be the house of residence for the incumbent of the united benefice, the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Tiffeld shall be the house of residence of the incumbent of the united benefice.

"(b) Upon the provision at Gayton of a house as aforesaid the parsonage house at present belonging to the said benefice of Tiffeld, and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith, shall be sold and disposed of by us, the said Church Commissioners, at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient.

"(c) So much of the net proceeds of such sale or sales as we after consulting with the Bishop for the time being of the diocese shall deem necessary shall be applied by us towards the cost of providing or acquiring at Gayton a house as aforesaid, and any balance of the said net proceeds shall constitute and form part of the Expenses Fund of the diocese of Peterborough.

"4. *Patronage*.—After the union has taken effect the right of presentation to the united benefice shall be exercised by the patrons of the two benefices alternately, the patron of the benefice of Saint Mary, Gayton, having the first presentation to the united benefice to be made after the union.

"5. *Diversion of Endowments*.—Upon the union taking effect, a capital sum sufficient to produce a permanent annual income of £292 and now forming part of a larger sum held by us, the said Church Commissioners, for the endowment of the benefice of Saint Mary, Gayton, shall be severed or diverted from the said benefice and from the united benefice of Gayton with Tiffeld, and shall be transferred to and be held by us, the said Church Commissioners, as part of and for the benefit of our General Fund, and in consideration of the said transfer we shall make out of the said General Fund such periodical

payments to the Diocesan Stipends Fund of the diocese of Peterborough as we from time to time determine to be equitable having regard to the value of the said endowments."

And whereas the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, the Union of Benefices Rules, 1926 and 1930, and the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that it shall be and become effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette.

"And whereas the said Elsie Harvey Smith desires to transfer the advowson of the said benefice to the Bishop of Chichester for the time being and is consenting to this Scheme (in testimony whereof she has executed the same):

"And whereas we are satisfied that the transfer will tend to make better provision for the cure of souls:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend George, Bishop of Chichester (in testimony whereof he has executed this Scheme), we, the said Church Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice shall be transferred to the said George, Bishop of Chichester, and his successors in the same Bishopric and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the Bishop of Chichester for the time being."

WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 28th day of May, 1952, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure,

1949, of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, and of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners (Powers) Measure, 1938, and with the consent of the Right Honourable and Right Reverend William, Bishop of London (in witness whereof he has signed this Scheme), have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for effecting the union of the benefice of Kentish Town, Saint Martin, and the benefice of Haverstock Hill, Saint Andrew, both situate in the diocese of London.

" SCHEME.

" 1. *Union of Benefices and Parishes.* The said benefice of Kentish Town, Saint Martin, and the said benefice of Haverstock Hill, Saint Andrew, shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Kentish Town, Saint Martin with Saint Andrew' and, subject as hereinafter provided, the parishes of the said benefices shall also be united into one parish for ecclesiastical purposes.

" 2. *Taking effect of union.* Upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the Reverend Albert Leslie St. Aubrey, if he is then incumbent of the said benefice of Kentish Town, Saint Martin, shall, with his consent (testified by his signature hereto) be the first incumbent of the united benefice.

" 3. *Parish Church.* The parish church of the parish of Saint Martin, Kentish Town, shall be the parish church of the united parish.

" 4. *Registers.* The marriage registers current at the Church of Saint Andrew, Haverstock Hill, shall be dealt with in accordance with section 62 of the Marriage Act, 1949, and the register books (if any) of baptisms and burials and other the records and muniments deposited in the said church shall be transferred to the parish church of Saint Martin, Kentish Town.

" 5. *Parsonage House.* The parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Kentish Town, Saint Martin, shall be the house of residence of the incumbent of the united benefice.

" 6. *Patronage.* With the consent (testified as aforesaid) of the Right Honourable and Right Reverend William, Bishop of London, being the patron of the said benefice of Haverstock Hill, Saint Andrew, and with the consents (testified by their signature hereto) of Dame Jewell Magnus-Alcroft, of Stokesay Court, Onibury, in the County of Salop, and of Alan William Turnbull of No. 4, College Hill, Shrewsbury, in the County of Salop, Esquire, as the Personal Representatives of John Russell Alcroft, deceased, being the patrons of the benefice of Kentish Town, Saint Martin, the patronage of the said benefice of Haverstock Hill, Saint Andrew, shall, without any conveyance or assurance other than this Scheme, be surrendered in favour of the said Dame Jewell Magnus-Alcroft and Alan William Turnbull, as such Personal Representatives as aforesaid to the intent that the patronage of the said united benefice shall vest wholly in them to be held by them upon the same trusts (if any) and in the same manner in all respects as the patronage of the said benefice of Kentish Town, Saint Martin, was formerly vested in them.

" 7. *Church of Saint Andrew, Haverstock Hill.*

(a) So soon as conveniently may be after the union has taken effect the church of Saint Andrew, Haverstock Hill, shall be taken down and the materials and site thereof, together with any ground annexed thereto and necessary for the use and enjoyment thereof shall be sold and disposed of by us, the said Church Commissioners, at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient subject to the conditions and restrictions imposed by the said Union of Benefices Measures and the net proceeds of such sale shall be appropriated to the Expenses Fund of the diocese of London established pursuant to the 32nd Section of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

(b) The font, communion table and plate used for the purpose of the Holy Communion in the said church of Saint Andrew, Haverstock Hill, shall not be sold, but shall in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measures and as the Bishop of the diocese may direct be transferred to the church of Saint Martin, Kentish Town, being the parish church of the united benefice, or to some other church or churches within the said diocese and the bells, organ and other furniture and fittings of the

said church of Saint Andrew, Haverstock Hill, or such of them as the Bishop shall select, shall be removed to the parish church of the united benefice or to any other church or chapel or churches or chapels within the said diocese as the Bishop may direct or shall be sold and in such case the proceeds shall be added to the fund arising from the sale of the site and materials of the said church of Saint Andrew, Haverstock Hill, as aforesaid.

" 8. *Alteration of boundaries.* With the consent (testified by his signature hereto) of the Reverend Frank Lacy Hillier, being the incumbent of the benefice of Kentish Town, Saint Silas, all that part of the parish of Saint Andrew, Haverstock Hill, which is described in the schedule hereto shall, upon the union taking effect, be severed from that parish and from the parish of the united benefice and be annexed to the parish of Saint Silas, Kentish Town, in the said diocese of London.

" 9. *Diversion of endowments.* With the consents (testified as aforesaid) of the said William, Bishop of London, and of the said Dame Jewell Magnus-Alcroft and Alan William Turnbull,

" (a) Upon the union taking effect:—

" (i) a part of the endowments of the united benefice, namely, an annual sum of £101 2s. 2d. being part of a larger annual sum at present payable by us, the said Church Commissioners, to the benefice of Haverstock Hill, Saint Andrew, shall be severed or diverted from the said benefice and from the united benefice and shall be appropriated for the augmentation of the benefice of Kentish Town, Saint Silas, and

" (ii) a further part of the endowments of the united benefice, namely, an annual sum of £168 13s. 7d. being part of the aforesaid larger annual sum at present payable by us to the benefice of Haverstock Hill, Saint Andrew, shall be severed or diverted from the said benefice and from the united benefice and shall be transferred to and held by us, the said Church Commissioners, as part of and for the benefit of our General Fund and in consideration of the said transfer we shall make out of the said General Fund such periodical payments to the diocese stipends fund of the diocese of London as we from time to time determine to be equitable having regard to the value of the said endowments.

" (b) Upon the union taking effect or upon the cesser of an annual charge of £109 in favour of the Church of England Pensions Board in trust for the Reverend Roland Genet Stafford to which the revenues of the benefice of Haverstock Hill, Saint Andrew, are at present subject, whichever of the said events shall later occur, a further part of the endowments of the united benefice, namely an annual sum of £109 being a further part of the aforesaid larger annual sum at present payable by us, the said Church Commissioners, to the benefice of Haverstock Hill, Saint Andrew, shall be severed or diverted from the benefice of Haverstock Hill, Saint Andrew, and from the united benefice and shall be transferred to and held by us, the said Church Commissioners, as part of and for the benefit of our General Fund and in consideration of the said transfer we shall make out of the said General Fund such periodical payments to the said diocesan stipends fund of the diocese of London as we from time to time determine to be equitable having regard to the value of the said endowments.

" SCHEDULE.

" The territory to be severed from the parish of Saint Andrew, Haverstock Hill, and from the parish of the united benefice, and annexed to the parish of Saint Silas, Kentish Town:—

" All that part (coloured pink on the map annexed hereto) of the parish of Saint Andrew, Haverstock Hill, which lies to the south of an imaginary line commencing on the boundary which divides the parish of Saint Andrew, Haverstock Hill, from the parish of Saint Saviour, South Hampstead, at the western end of the wall or fence forming the southern boundary of the grounds and buildings of St. Pancras Almshouses and continuing thence eastwards along the said wall or fence to its end and in the same straight line to a point in the middle of the road known as Maitland Park Villas and continuing thence northwards along the middle of Maitland Park Villas to a point opposite to the middle of the western end of Grafton Terrace and continuing thence

eastwards along the middle of Grafton Terrace to a point opposite its eastern end in the middle of Malden Road and continuing thence southwards along the middle of Malden Road to a point in the middle of Queen's Crescent and continuing thence northeastwards along the middle of Queen's Crescent to the boundary which divides the parish of Saint Andrew, Haverstock Hill, from the parish of Saint Silas, Kentish Town."

And whereas the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, the Union of Benefices Rules, 1926 and 1930, and the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme have been duly complied with:

And whereas an Appeal against the said Scheme has been made to Her Majesty in Council by the Parochial Church Councils of the Parishes of St. Silas, Kentish Town, and St. Andrew, Haverstock Hill, and such Appeal was referred to the Judicial Committee of the Privy Council on the 4th day of September, 1952:

And whereas the Lords of the said Committee, having taken the said Appeal into consideration, reported to Her Majesty in Council that the Appeal ought to be dismissed and the said Scheme affirmed:

And whereas Her Majesty was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, by Order of the 28th day of May, 1953, to approve the said Report:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 12th day of June, 1953, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for altering the boundaries of the parishes of All Saints, Woodham; Saint John, West Byfleet; Christ Church, Woking; and Pyrford; all in the diocese of Guildford.

"Whereas we are satisfied that it is desirable that the boundaries of the said parishes should be altered in the manner hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the Right Reverend Henry, Bishop of Guildford, consents to the proposed arrangements (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme):

"Now, therefore, we, the said Church Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme the boundaries of the said parishes of All Saints, Woodham; Saint John, West Byfleet; Christ Church, Woking; and Pyrford; shall be altered in the manner described in the Schedule and delineated on the map annexed to this Scheme.

"THE SCHEDULE.

"1. *The territory to be annexed to the parish of All Saints, Woodham.*

"(a) All that part (coloured pink on the map annexed hereto) of the parish of Pyrford which lies to the north west of the middle of the main line of the British Railways (Southern Region) and

"(b) All that part (coloured brown on the map annexed hereto) of the parish of Saint John, West Byfleet, which is bounded on the west by the parish of Pyrford on the north west by the parish of All Saints, Woodham, and on the remaining sides by an imaginary line commencing at a point on the boundary which divides the parish of All Saints, Woodham, from the parish of Saint John, West Byfleet, in the middle of Sheerwater Road and continuing thence south eastwards along the middle of the last mentioned road for a distance of 4 chains to a point opposite the north eastern end of the wall or fence forming the north western boundary of the house and premises known as Norfolk Farm Cottage

and continuing thence south westwards to and along the last mentioned wall or fence to its end and continuing thence south eastwards along the wall or fence forming the south western boundary of the last mentioned house and premises to its end and in the same straight line in continuation thereof to a point on the wall or fence forming the south eastern boundary of close number 47 on the said map and continuing thence south westwards along the last mentioned wall or fence and along the wall or fence forming the southern boundary of close number 135 to a point on the boundary which divides the parish of Saint John, West Byfleet, from the parish of Pyrford.

"2. *The territory to be annexed to the parish of Christ Church, Woking.*

"All that part (coloured green on the map annexed hereto) of the parish of Pyrford which is bounded on the west and south west by the parish of Christ Church, Woking, and on the remaining sides by an imaginary line commencing at a point where the boundaries of the parishes of Woking; Christ Church, Woking; and Pyrford, meet in the middle of Old Woking Road and continuing thence north eastwards along the middle of the last mentioned road for a distance of 11½ chains and continuing thence north westwards in a straight line to the south eastern end of the wall or fence which divides close number 19 from closes numbered 19b and 19c thereby crossing close number 19 and continuing thence north westwards along the last mentioned wall or fence to its end and continuing thence north north westwards in a straight line to the wall or fence which divides close number 19 from close number 16 at a distance of 3 chains north eastwards from the point where the walls or fences of closes numbered 19, 17a, and 16 meet and continuing thence north eastwards along the last mentioned wall or fence to the ditch which divides close number 12b from closes numbered 19 and 16 and continuing thence north westwards along the last mentioned ditch and along the ditch which divides close number 12b' from close number 16 to the south western corner of close numbered 12b' and continuing thence along the last mentioned ditch and in the same straight line for a distance of 11 chains or thereabouts to the south eastern end of the wall or fence forming the south western boundary of close number 6 at its junction with an unnamed stream and continuing thence first north eastwards then north westwards along the middle of the last mentioned stream to the south eastern side of the embankment of the main line of the British Railways (Southern Region) and continuing thence first north westwards to and then south westwards along the middle of the said main line of the British Railways to a point on the boundary which divides the parish of Pyrford from the parish of Christ Church, Woking."

And whereas the provisions of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme, have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.
