Ere are lately put in about 15 or 16 fail of thips; infomuch; that there are now above 30 fail; many of them laden with Pilchards for the Streights, some for Malaga, and others for Earbados.

Cadis, August 20. Sir Thomas Allen with the Fleet unthe his command on the 30th past, had a view of 3 Turks men of War near the North Cape, whom he pursued for some time, but they being lighter vessels got away. The 8th instant he arrived with his Fleet in this Bay, where he has been Complimented from the Duke d' Alcala, Captain General of the Coasts of Andali fia, with an offer of all Conveniencies for the supply of his ships: from thence he fent out Seven Fregars to cruife upon the month of the Streights, and to meet him afterwards at he Rendezvous before Alecant, from whence we are told that the Sally men increae in Inipping, having now abroad about Seven or Eight men of War from Six to T n Guns apiece, son e of which lighting upon a small French Fregat of Ten Guns from St Maloes laden with Linnen, feifed her and fem her into Sally, but the men escaped in their Boat.

Venice, Septemb. 7. On Sunday last came in here 2 Merchant fhip from Soria, the Mafter informing, that palfing by Standia he was there rold that the Turks finding an extraordinary resistance made against them at the Baltion St. Andresiad somewhat remitted their attempts on that fide, far siying themselves only by keeping at a distance within their own Works: that on the Sabsoners they had not of late mede any considerable attempts' upon the Bieach in which they found too warm entertainment, but had endead youred tomake some advance towards the Arsenal, hoping to find an easier entry that way into the City, but work onshis fide sile discouraged by the flowing of the water upon sheep and other difficulties; and that in the late firing of she Fleet upon the Turks Camp, the Enemy are faid to have loft everal hunareds of their mens and among it there an Aga a principal Commander in the Camp, and a great fayourite of the Viller.

He farther tells us, that in all the Ports of Soria, Aleffandria, and Alepso, the Turks had made a ft p of all thips of what Nation foever, in ending to make ule of them for the transportation of Soldiers and Provision to Canea, but that feveral of those ships had taken their opportunities to make their escapes, throwing over-board such of the Turks as were let upon them as a Guard.

A Caich from Dalmatia is lately arrived here; and is to be dispatche back again with Moneys to General Privite for the payment of the soldiers in that Province; by this vessel we find that little Action has lately passed in those parts; only a party of Haydukes from Cattaro made lately an incursion into the Estemys Quarters; and brought thence above 100 head of Cattle, which they took from a party of Turks; whom they had first deseated and cut in pieces as they were conveying them to a Narker.

Here are fafely arrived several soldiers newly railed, with the German soldiers who have lately been Mustefed , they are found to be about 2000 mers, and may be speedily embarked upon the Convoy which is neer fitted up for the

Levant.

Prom Zante we are told, that our Convoy of so si ips with great quantities of Provision and Ammunition and many Men, on which embarked the Duke di Mirandolas having put in there to refresh the soldiers, was put to sea from thence, and tis supposed are long before this safely arrived at Candia.
