HE Weywode of Mariembourg, the Crown-Treasurer, the Deputy-Chancellor of Lithuania, and feveral other Senators and Persons of Note, continue in this Place, expecting the the King of Poland's Return from Drefden, where it is believed he will make but a short flay. The Crown Standard bearer, whom the King before his departure had fent on some fecret Negociation to Moscow, returned from thence this week, and is gone to Drefden, to give him an Account of his Proceedings. We are affored that his Majesty has resolved to augment confiderably the number of his Saxon Forces in this Kingdom against the next Campaign, and has large Promises of Assistance

from the Czar of Mulcowy.

Venice, Jan. 11. On the 5th Instant the Camaval was begun here, with the customary Entertainments of Comedies, Opera's, and Malquerades, which have invited to this Place a very great number of Strangers, among whom are many Persons of Note; and it has heen no small Addition to the Pleasure and Sa tisfaction which this Season usually brings with it, to see the best part of both the Impe. rial and the French and Spanish Forces drawn from our Neighbourhood, by reason of General Staremberg's Expedition to join the Duke of Savoy, and to have the Seat of War, as we hope, in a great measure removed from our Frontiers. The Forces which the Duke of Vendosme has lest behind to observe the Im perialists, who remain at Offiglia, Revere, and the Posts along the Secchia, are about 10000 strong, and have made some Attempts to beat the Girmans from some of their Posts, but have always been repulsed with Loss. The Impetialists have lately received from Germany a good number of Recruits, and fome Convoys of Arms, Ammunition, and other Necessaries, and are in daily Expectation of further Supplies.

Buda, fan. 12. A Body of the Rebels is encamped near Zolnoch; and one Matria Szabo, late Post-master of Hatuan, being come with a Detachment of them to Varcan on the 2d Inftant, writ from thence a Letter to the Magistrates of Pest, demanding of them 3000 Loaves, a great quantity of Oats, 100 Fats of Wine, 100 Oxen, 200 Wagon-loads of Hay,

and 200 of Wood, deficing their Answer in 3 days time, and acquainting them, That if they did not comply, and put themselves un-der the Protection of Prince Ragotai, he had Orders to plunder their Town. Thereupon the Inhabitants resolved to defend themselves to the last Extremity, and accordingly made the necessary Preparations for that purpole. In the mean time Szabo, with his Derachment, came the 4th to the Banks of the Danube, near the Island Raskeve, a little above this City, and that River being frozen over, he sent 400 Men into the faid Illand, who plundered the Inhabitants, and seized their Horses and Gattel. while himself with the rest of his Men didthe like in the neighbourhood of Peft: But upon notice thereof a Detachment was fent from a Body of Rascians, which have been drawing together for some days near Baya, upon whose Approach the Rebels are retired towards Kerkemet, and the Garison of Pest has been reinforced; so that we look upon that Place at present to be out of all Danger; however all possible Care is taken both there and in this Town to prevent any Surprise, by breaking the Ice, and keeping the Forti-fications in good Repair, and using all other necessary Precautions for our Security. A Party of 200 of the Rascians abovementioned met lately with a Body of the Rebels near Nemetky, above thrice their Number, with whom they had a very sharp dispute, and at length obliged the Rebels to retire with Loss; and two small Parties of these Rascians are since come hither, with each a Standard. which they took from the Enemy in this Action. A Body of Rebels had lately blocked up Erlau, but the Garison made so vigorous a Sally upon them, that they were obliged to The retire with loss of many of their Men. Inhabitants of the Island of St. Andrew in the Danube; to secure themselves from the same Misfortune as has befallen those of Raskeve, keep continually breaking the Ice, and are building a small Fort. We have an Account from Temeswaer, that the Janiz wies in Garifon there have mutined, and killed 5 of their Chief Officers.

Plimouth, Febr. t. Yesterday sailed to the Eastward 4 Dutch Men of War, and under their Convoy about 60 Merchant Ships, which came from Lisbon and St. Hubes, being homeward bound. The same day failed also the
