The Imperial Forces under the Com-mand of General Staremberg having all joined the Duke of Sources Army the 14th Instant at Gova, they marched the 17th to St. Imien, where a general Council of War was

held, at which the Count d'Aversberg, the Emperor's Minister, was present: It was there resolved, that the army should go in o Quarters of Refreshment, till the Season should be more proper to take the Field, the Weather being now severe, and the Snow very deep; In the mean time the Imperialists will receive their heavy Bagage, which could not follow them in their hasty March, without dispopointing their Design. The 2.1st they marched to Concerate, not far from Verue, near which Place it had been resolved the Forces should be cancered. toned, as they were accordingly, the Horse on one lide of the Po, and the Foot on the other. They took Post at Pious and Morosings, two great Villages in that part of the Montserrat, Morosingo, two great Villages in that part of the Montferrat, which belong to the Duke of Montea, and by this means a considerable Body of them was quartered within that Duke's Territories. The Forces being gone into Quarters, the Duke of Savey returned hither yesterday, and Mr. Hill, Her Majesty of Great Britain's Envoy Extraordinary, and Monseur Van der Meer, Envoy from the States Gene al, are to have Audicance of his Royal Highness this afternoon. The Duke of Vendofine, who, with the French and Spanish Troops under his Command, has for some time kept within a small distance of the Confederate Army to observe their Motions. the Confederate Army to observe their Motions, marched lately in Person at the head, of all his Granadiers, to endeathe Confederate Army to observe their Motions, marched lately in Person at the head of all his Granadiers, to endeavour to drive our Forces out of some of their Quarters in the Montserrat; but this Design was disappointed, by the great Care which our Duke had taken to provide for the Security of our Posts, and to preserve a good Discipline among his Troops, not permitting any Officer to be absent from his Command under any pretence whatsoever. In the mean time the Militia of Piearhout, commanded by the Manquis de Prela, does very much incommode the French Army, and kill abundance of their Mens. The Enemy, in Revenge, lately sent a strong Parry into an open Village of Piedmont, where they put all the Inhabitants to the Sword. There being Advice, that the French Forces in Savvy, under the Command of the Duke de la Feuillade, are marching towards the Valley of Susa, a considerable Detachment is sent that way to oppose them. The Governor of Nice, with about 100 Men of his Garison, has superprised the Castle of Sr. Laurent in Provence, killed or taken Prisones about 50 Men who were in Garison their, and plundered the Village.
