Mr. Edwards was supervising the repair of a petrol delivery line in H.M.S. INDOMITABLE when a severe flood of petrol occurred. He at once issued the necessary orders for shutting down all petrol delivery lines and for danger warnings to be broadcast. He continued his efforts to stop the leak until an explosion occurred. Although badly shaken, Mr. Edwards proceeded to help to organise and direct the firefighting and continued his efforts without respite for many hours until he was satisfied that no further danger existed. he was satisfied that no further danger existed.

etty Officer Stoker Mechanic Victor Harold STANTON, P/SKX, 801626.

Petty Officer Stoker Mechanic Stanton was with the petrol party in H.M.S. INDOMITABLE when the severe flood of petrol occurred. Fully realising the danger, he remained to assist an Engine Room Artificer in his efforts to stop the leak. When the explosion took place Petty Officer Stoker Mechanic Stanton was blown a considerable distance but was not injured. He helped the badly injured Engine Room Artificer to a place of safety and then checked that all deliveries of petrol had been stopped and all storage tanks properly shut down. stopped, and all storage tanks properly shut down. He then did invaluable work in fighting the fires, continuing without sparing himself until all danger
