HE 14th Instant was observed here as a day of publick Thanksgiving, for our Deliverance from the Earthquake which happened that day was Twelve-month; and the Pope vilited the Churches of Santia Maria Maggiore, and San Girvanni di Laterano, and performed fome extraordimry Acts of Devotion. He has strictly forbid here the Divertions of the Carnaval, in confideration of the present War between the Princes of Christendom. They keep the Town of Kuff-fleyn, which is still in the hands of the Bavarians, closely blocked up, and the Garison there is reduced to great Streights. Hague, Febr. 22. N. S. The States of Holland and West-friseland are assembled, and have under Consideration a Proposal made by the Elector of Mentz, the Elector Palatine, and Prince Lewis of Baden, who delire to borrow of them 250000 Crowns, upon certain Securities, to be employed in the carrying on at the War in Germany. The Nomination of General Officers to command the Forces of this State the next Campaign is not yet agreed upon: The Deputies of the Provinces of Friseland and Groningen, in the Assembly of the States General, have declared, that those Provinces will insist upon the young Prince of Eastfriseland's being made a General of Foot. The Duke of Marlborough is gone hence this evening to Rotterdam, in order to embark for England.

Yesterday, being Monday, her Grace the Dutchels of Ormond invited all the Ladies to 2 Play in the evening, of whom there was a very great Appearance; and from thence his Grace carried them to St. Stephen's Green, to see the Fire-works made on this Occasion; which being ended, the Company returned to the Castle; and after a very noble Supper, where none but the Duke and Durchels and the Ladies fate, the remainder of the night was concluded with a Ball, and in the City with Bonsiers, Illuminations, Finging of Bells, and other Demonstrations of publick Joy and Satisfaction suitable to the day.
