From Muscony we are told that the Czar is very much indined to main ain and re-establish a right understanding with the Kingdom & Paland, and hatbient one Par Valfigueli formerly Governour of Kiepie with his Complidients to the King of Poland upon his Election, and to represent to him his readiness to enter with him into a more It ict League Union against their Common Enemies, and being informed that the Tarrars had put themselves inso the Eicld with a great Army, he had thought fit to Command Gregory Komadanski, an excellent Officer, to march towards the Frontiers with a frong Army to have an ene upon their motion, and to oppose them in their detignes.

. Letters from warfaw speak somewhat uncertainly of the flate of Affairs in that Kingdom ; several of the Preparatory-Diets havi g mer with Disputes and Contests, and some of them breaking off with Diffatisfaction; and, that as yet no Medio i has been thought of frehe Raifing of Moneys for the Payment of the Army, and the Discharge of the other great Expences of the Publick, which notwithstanding tio hoped the entuing Ceneral Diet will take care for ; As show for the taking off all Animofities, and fetting the Kingdom upon fure and taking Foundations of Peace; which 'his the ra her hoped x fince 'tis confidently faid, That General sobiesky has given assurance that he will fubmit himfelf to His Majesty; and, in token thereof; make his appearance at the General Assembly of the States at Gracovis, as has also Prince Samoisky, who formerly appear'd diffacisty'd with the Election : And, for the prevention of any Disturbances in the Nation, during the Session of the Diet, the Nobles are Commanded to appear in Armes within their respective Counsies and Palatinates, either to March upon the first Order against the Tartars and Coffacts, on to any pare of the Kingdom upon any Dilorder which may arile upon the Discontents of Private Persons.

The foldiers of Mecklin having been forcewhar roublesome to the people of that place in plundering the Gardens about that City, the Bourgers came to A Composition with the Governour for 3000 Ghilders for their founce security, but he being afterwards ablent, the soldiers by their conniverce or negligence of their Officers began to take their old libetty; whereupon the Bourgers staited by some Country men, fell apon them in the Gardens the tigth instant, where the dispute was so hors that about an foldiers were killed upon the place and 4 or 5 of the Countrey ment and the execution had been much agreater had not the Bishop of \$1.0mer with the Clergy and Religious inte poledy fince this, complaints have been made to the Constable of Caffille both 2" gainst the Solgiers and their Officers, the Country men in the Villages adjacent are fince upon their Otlard and permit he foldiers to do ne neat them.

Paris, Sept. be. The Duke de Navailles has Wiften ? Letter to his Majesty from Candia bearing date the LL of of Augustoby which he acquaints him, that according to his instructions, that in rale he had no hopes to free the Town from the Enemy, he should return home with his forces; he was accordingly embarquing the remainder of his men which were arrely a third part of what he carried out with him, the rest of them being either killed in fight or fince dead of their hurs and the dileties of the place, and that he thought fit to recure home with the rest, fince he was unable to go through the work of succouring the place : That the Turks daily gained upon the Town, and had made themselves Master of the first Retrenchment and mere paffing on to the 2d, bik that about 2500 men were confirmiy employd about a 3d. that all this notwith Randing the belieged might be able to defend the place during this Winter, if the departure of thele forces had no unhappy influenc upon the rest of the Garrison, and produced no diforders amongst them : in confidence whereof the Masethal de Bellefonds continues his Leavies, having the 17th instant received the Popes Brief, by which he creates him his. General of all el e Forces which are to be fent under his name to Candia, to whom he intends to fend 1200 mens and the Republick of Ventce to Joyn 1 500 more to be added to those which are now raising in France for this expedition.
