DISEASES OF ANIMALS ACT, 1950.

Notice is hereby given in pursuance of section 85 (3) of the Diseases of Animals Act, 1950, that the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries has made the following Orders:—

Statutory Instruments 1953 No. 1595.

The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Special Order No. 32, 1953.

(Made 29th October, 1953.)

Declares an area comprising the districts situate within approximately 15 miles of Worcester to be an Infected Area for the purpose of preventing the spreading of foot-and-mouth disease, to which Area the provisions of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restrictions) Order of 1938 are applied. The area subject to restrictions lies in the counties of Gloucester, Hereford, Warwick and Worcester.

Statutory Instruments 1953 No. 1602.

The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Special Order No. 33, 1953.

(Made 31st October, 1953.)

Permits pigs to be sent to a slaughterhouse or bacon-factory in the Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area declared by Special Order No. 32, 1953, with a licence issued by an Inspector of the Local Authority for the district from which the pigs are moved. Licences issued under this Order do not require countersignature and may be granted only on production of a Ministry of Food delivery advice note.
