

the said parish of Edlington and of the said parish of Conisbrough shall be altered in the manner described in Part II of the said Schedule and as delineated on the map hereto annexed.

"THE SCHEDULE.

"Part I.

"The area comprising:—

"All those contiguous parts (coloured pink, green and brown respectively on the map annexed hereto) of the parishes of Edlington, Warmsworth and Conisbrough, which taken together are bounded upon part of the west by the parish of Conisbrough and upon the remaining sides by an imaginary line commencing on the boundary which divides the parish of Conisbrough from the parish of Edlington at a point in the middle of the Dearne Valley Branch Line of British Railways (Eastern Region) and proceeding thence northeastwards along the middle of the said Branch Line to the middle of the former Hull and Barnsley and Great Central Railway's Joint Committee Branch Line of British Railways (Eastern Region) and continuing thence northeastwards along the middle of the last mentioned Branch Line to the middle of Lords Head Lane and continuing thence southeastwards along the middle of the last mentioned Lane to the middle of Broomhouse Lane and continuing thence southwestwards along the middle of the last mentioned Lane to a point opposite the middle of the unnamed road forming Close numbered 122 on the map and continuing thence southeastwards first to and then along the middle of the last mentioned road to a point opposite the northeastern end of the wall or fence forming the northwestern boundary of Close numbered 91 and continuing thence southwestwards and southwards first to and then along the last mentioned wall or fence to the wall or fence forming the northern boundary of Close numbered 85 and continuing thence westwards along the last mentioned wall or fence to the northern end of the eastern boundary of Close numbered 86 and continuing thence southwards along the last mentioned wall or fence to its southern end and continuing thence westwards along the walls or fences forming the southern boundaries of Closes numbered 86 and 87 to their end and continuing thence westwards in the same straight line to a point in the middle of Edlington Lane thereby crossing Close numbered 80 and continuing thence southwestwards along the middle of the last mentioned Lane to a point opposite to the middle of Howbecks Dyke and continuing thence westwards to and northwestwards along the middle of the last mentioned dyke to a point opposite to the wall or fence forming the eastern end of the northern boundary of Close numbered 98 and continuing thence westwards first to and then along the last mentioned wall or fence to the boundary which divides the parish of Edlington from the parish of Conisbrough.

"Part II.

"The territory to be annexed to the parish of Conisbrough:—

"All that part of the parish of Edlington (coloured blue on the map annexed hereto) lying to the north of the Dearne Valley Branch Line of British Railways (Eastern Region)."

And whereas the provisions of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme, have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Sheffield.

WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a

Scheme bearing date the 23rd day of October, 1953, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for altering the boundaries of the parishes of Bracknell, Binfield, Easthampstead, Warfield and Winkfield, all in the diocese of Oxford.

"Whereas we are satisfied that it is desirable that the boundaries of the said parishes should be altered in the manner hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the Right Reverend Kenneth, Bishop of Oxford, consents to the proposed arrangements (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme):

"Now, therefore, we, the said Church Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme the boundaries of the said parishes of Bracknell, Binfield, Easthampstead, Warfield and Winkfield shall be altered in the manner described in the Schedule and delineated on the map annexed to this Scheme.

"THE SCHEDULE.

"A. The territory to be annexed to the parish of Bracknell:—

"(a) All that part of the parish of Easthampstead (coloured pink on the map annexed hereto) which lies to the north of the middle of the railway line of the Staines and Wokingham Branch of British Railways (Southern Region) and to the north-east of an imaginary line commencing at a point in the middle of the last mentioned railway line at Amen Corner Crossing and continuing thence northwestwards along the middle of the unnamed lane leading from Peacock Lane to Amen Corner (thereby crossing the railway line at Amen Corner Crossing) for a distance of 2½ chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the parish of Easthampstead from the parish of Binfield.

"(b) All that part of the parish of Binfield (coloured green on the map) which is bounded on the east by the parish of Warfield, on the southeast by the parish of Easthampstead and on the remaining sides by an imaginary line commencing at a point on the boundary which divides the parish of Easthampstead from the parish of Binfield opposite the southeastern end of the walls or fences forming the southwestern boundaries of closes numbered 410 and 405 (on the map) and continuing thence northwestwards to and along the last mentioned boundaries (thereby following the wall or fence which divides close number 405 from close number 406) to their end and continuing thence northeastwards along the wall or fence which divides close number 405 from close number 392 to its end and continuing thence northwestwards along the wall or fence which divides close number 392 from closes numbered 394a, 395 and 393 to its end and continuing thence northeastwards along the walls or fences which form the northwestern boundaries of closes numbered 393, 395, 395a, 390 and 389 to a point opposite the northeastern end of the said boundary of the last mentioned close in the middle of the Wokingham to Staines Road and continuing thence northwestwards along the middle of the Wokingham to Staines Road to a point in the middle of Jock's Lane and continuing thence northeastwards along the middle of Jock's Lane to its end and in a straight line to the point where the wall or fence which divides close number 327 from close number 347 meets the wall or fence which divides close number 347 from close number 326 and continuing thence first northeastwards then northwestwards along the wall or fence which divides close number 327 from close number 326 to a point opposite its northwestern end in the middle of the stream which forms close number 318 and continuing thence generally northeastwards along the middle of the last mentioned stream to a point on the boundary which divides the parish of Warfield from the parish of Binfield.

"(c) All that part of the parish of Warfield (coloured yellow on the map) which lies to the south of an imaginary line commencing at a point on the boundary which divides the parish of Binfield from the parish of Warfield in the middle of the stream which forms close number 558 and continuing thence northeastwards along the middle of the last mentioned stream to a point opposite the northwestern end of the wall or fence which divides close number 571 from close number 577 and continuing
