

POST OFFICE OVERSEAS TELEGRAMS

Her Majesty's Postmaster General hereby gives notice that the telegraph service to North Korea has been re-opened.

The rates of charge, authorised routes and special conditions for telegrams from the United Kingdom, the Isle of Man and the Channel Islands to North Korea and South Korea will from 23rd November, 1953, be as follows:—
